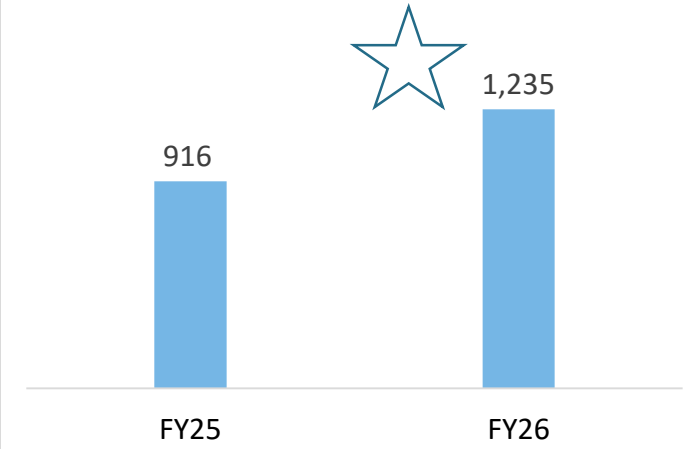
TOTAL INCOME (IN ₹ CR)



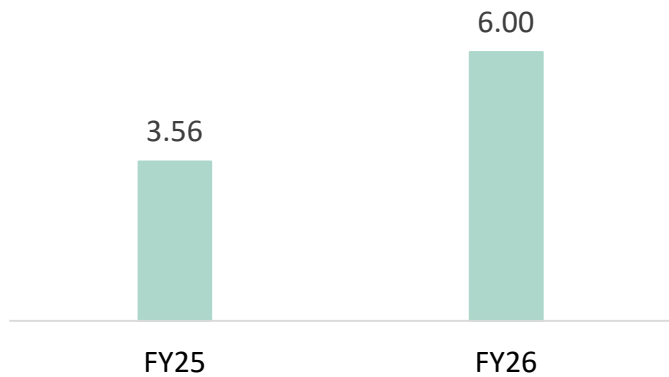

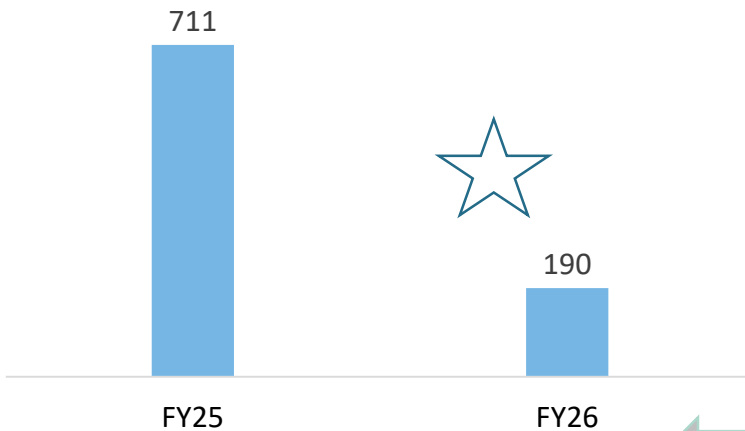
DISBURSEMENTS (IN ₹ CR)



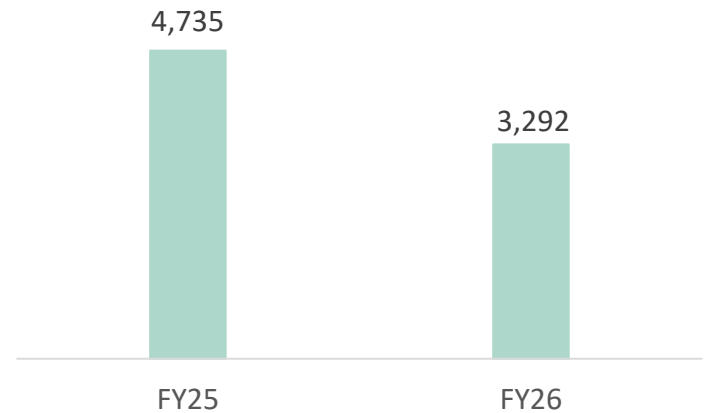
RETURN ON ASSETS (%)



GROSS STAGE III (IN ₹ Cr)

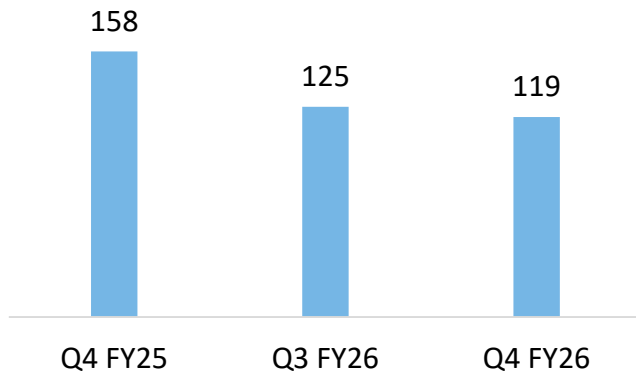

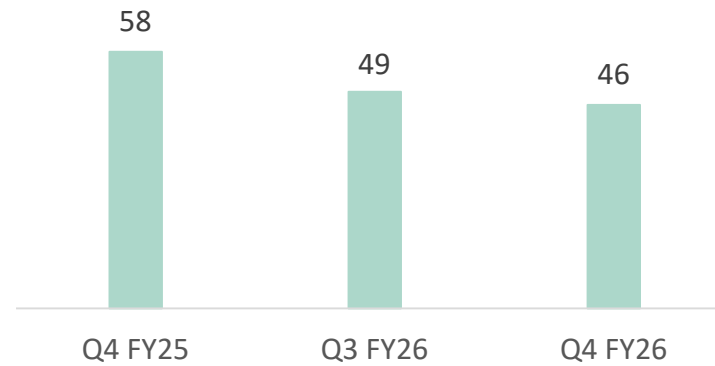

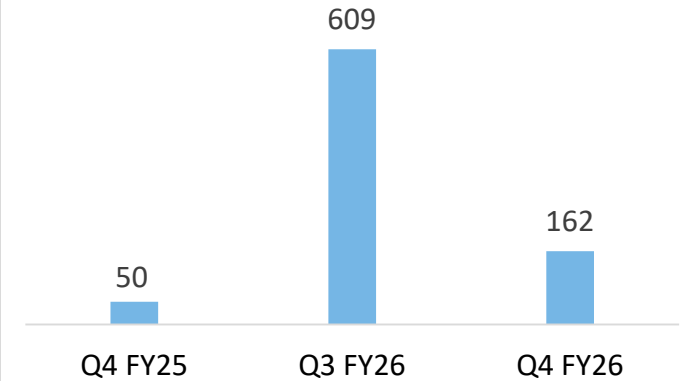

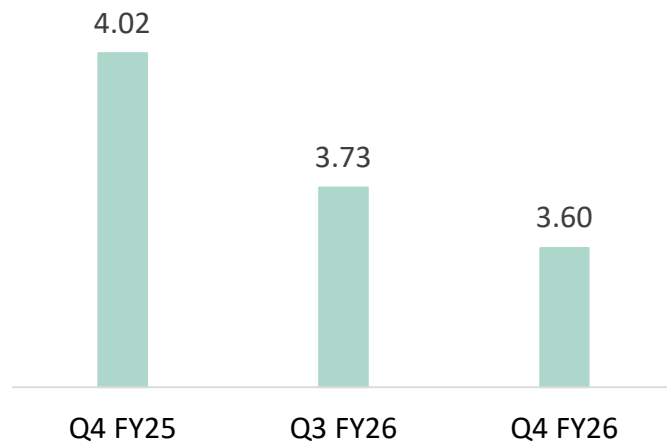

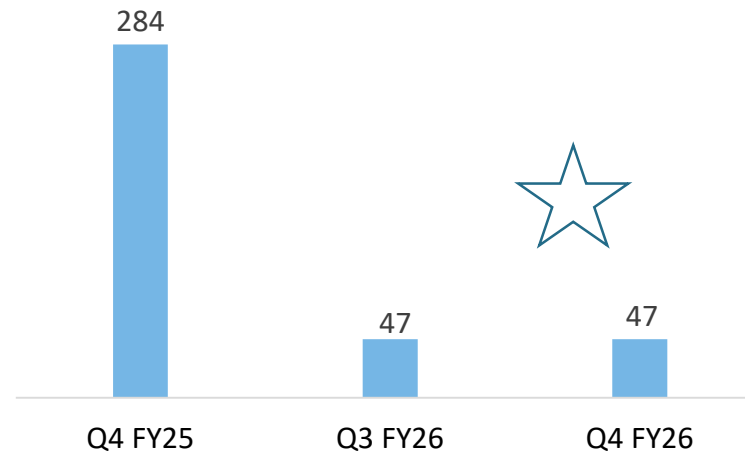

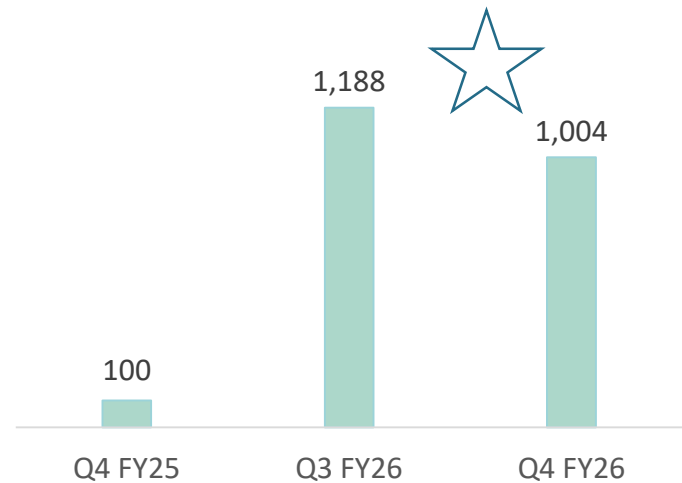
RETURN ON ASSETS (%)

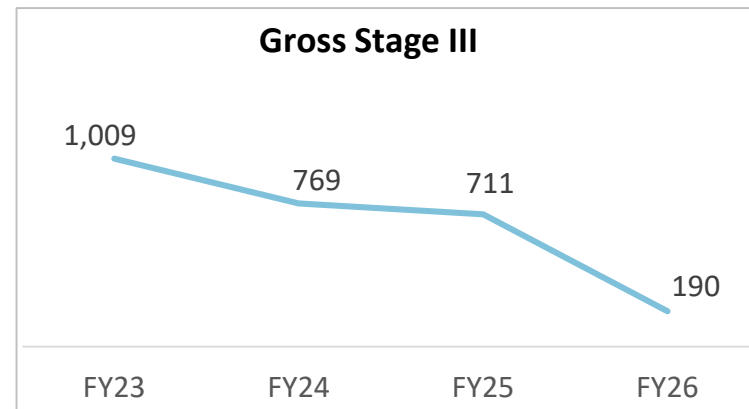

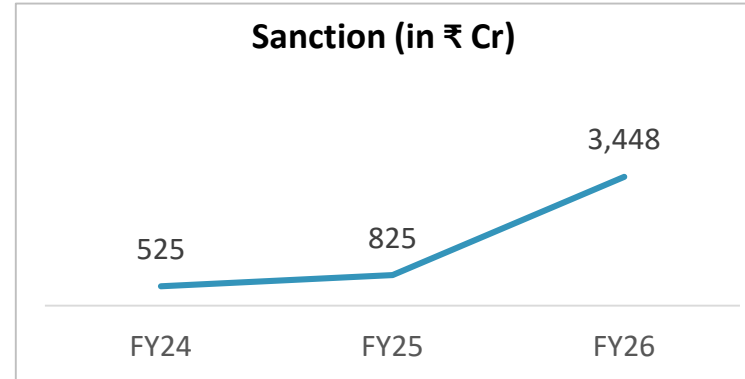
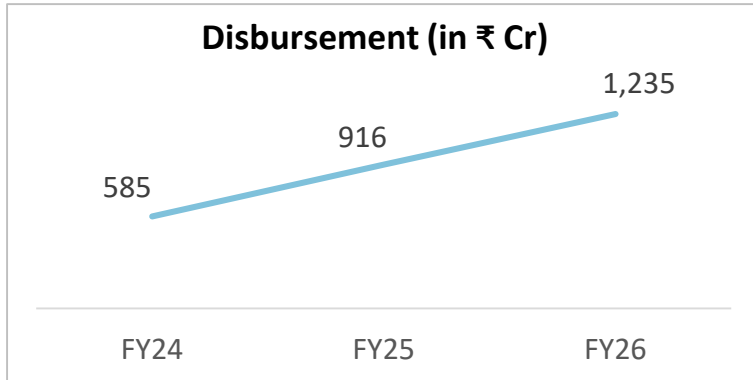
FY26 - clear inflection point for the organization

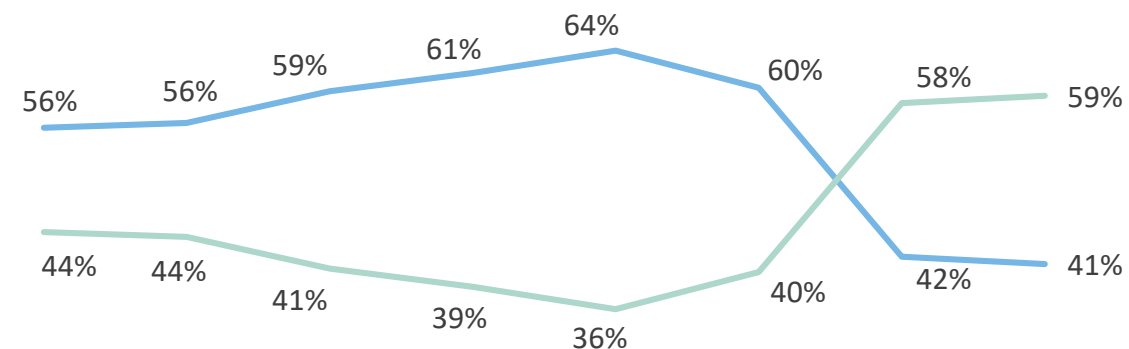

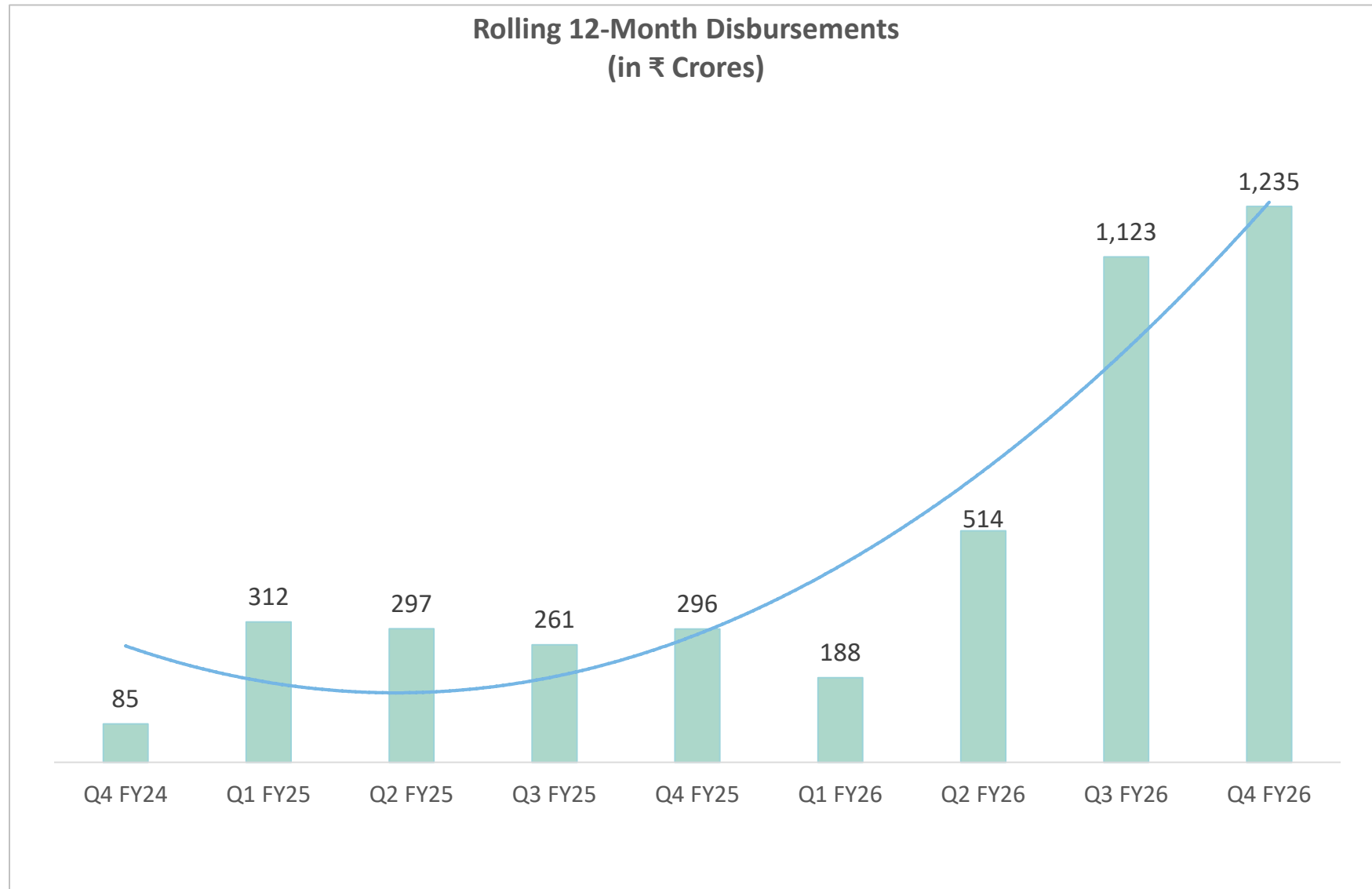
AUM Break-Up (in %)

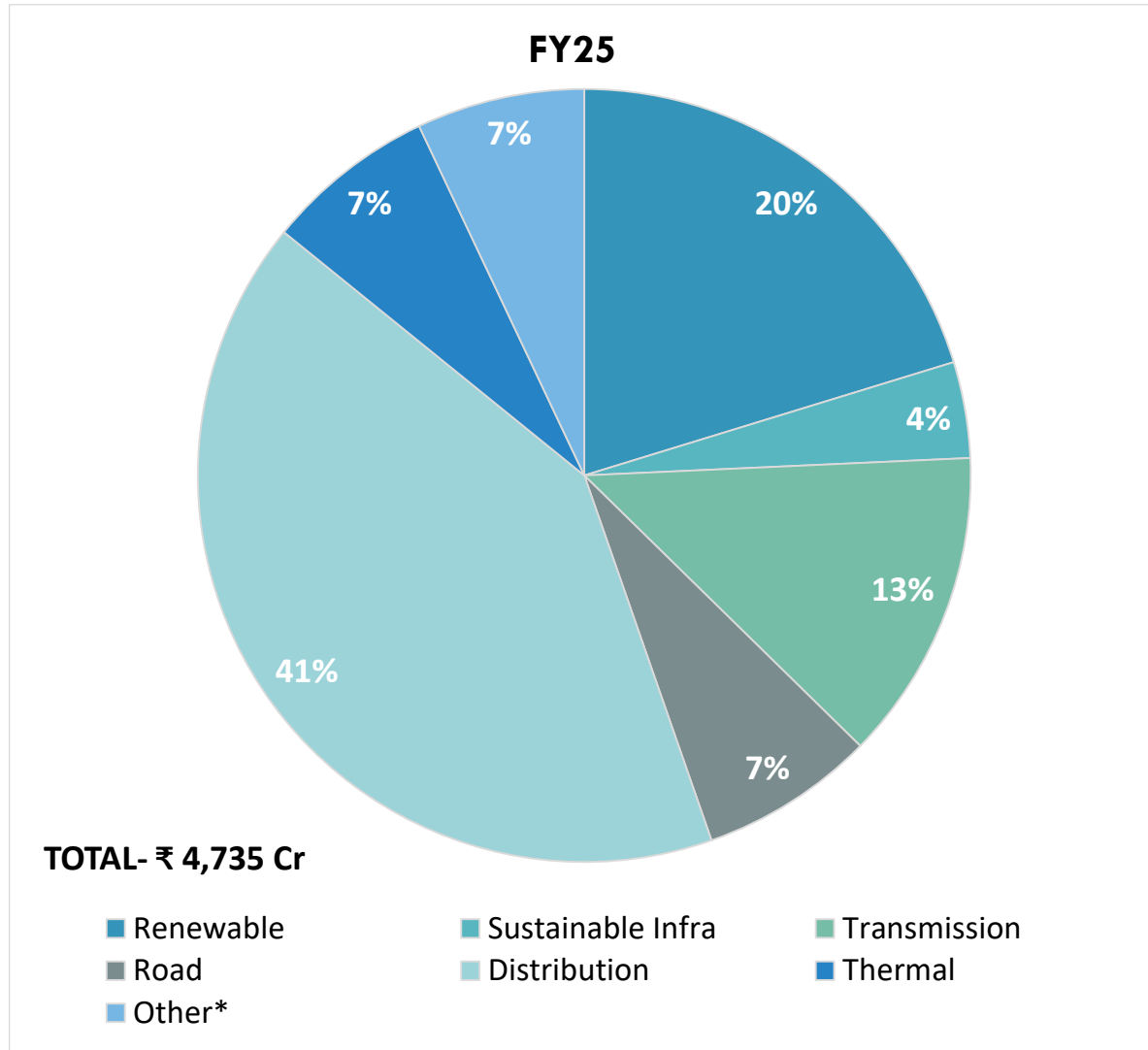

PRIVATE SECTOR DISBURSEMENT TREND

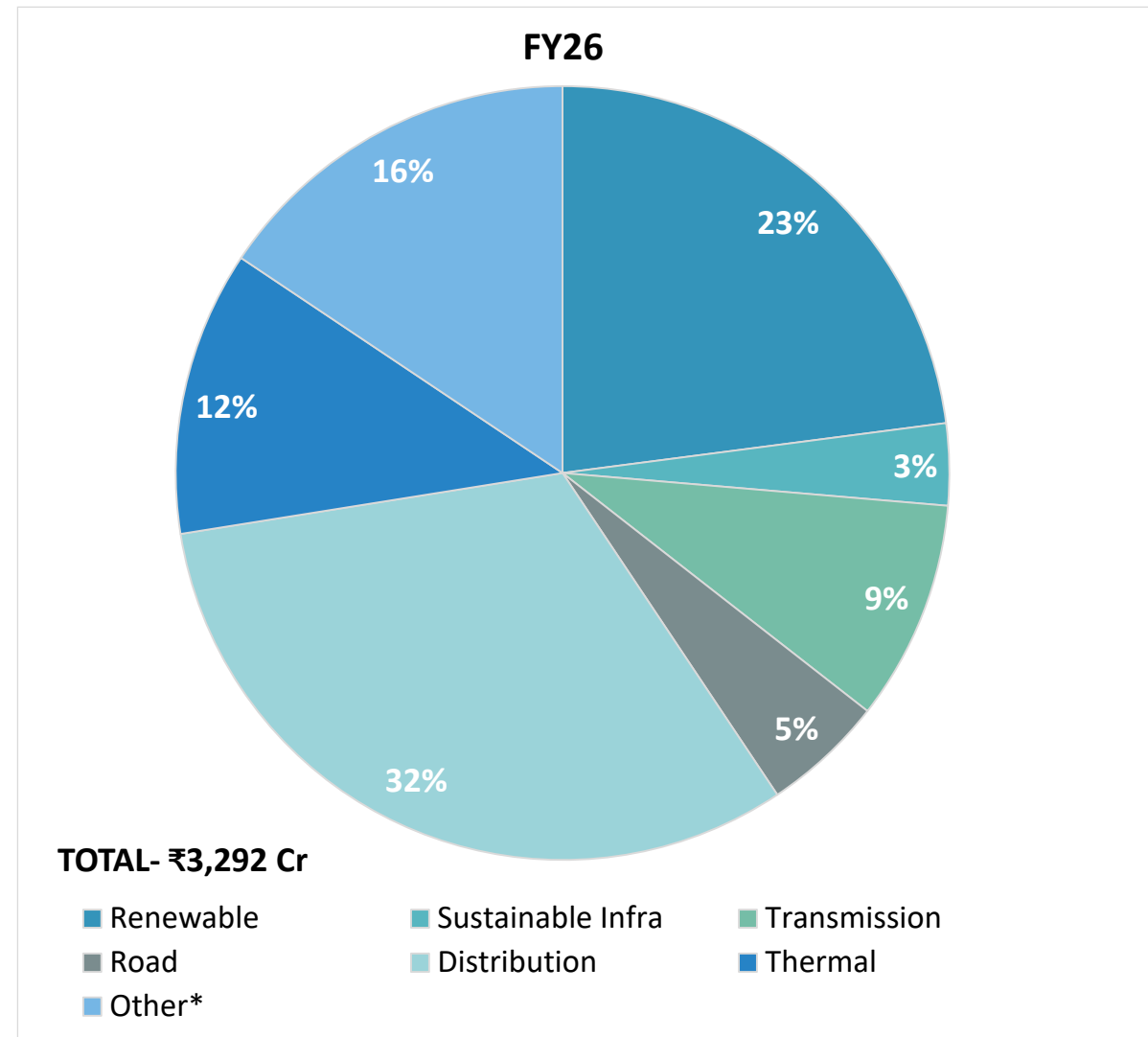

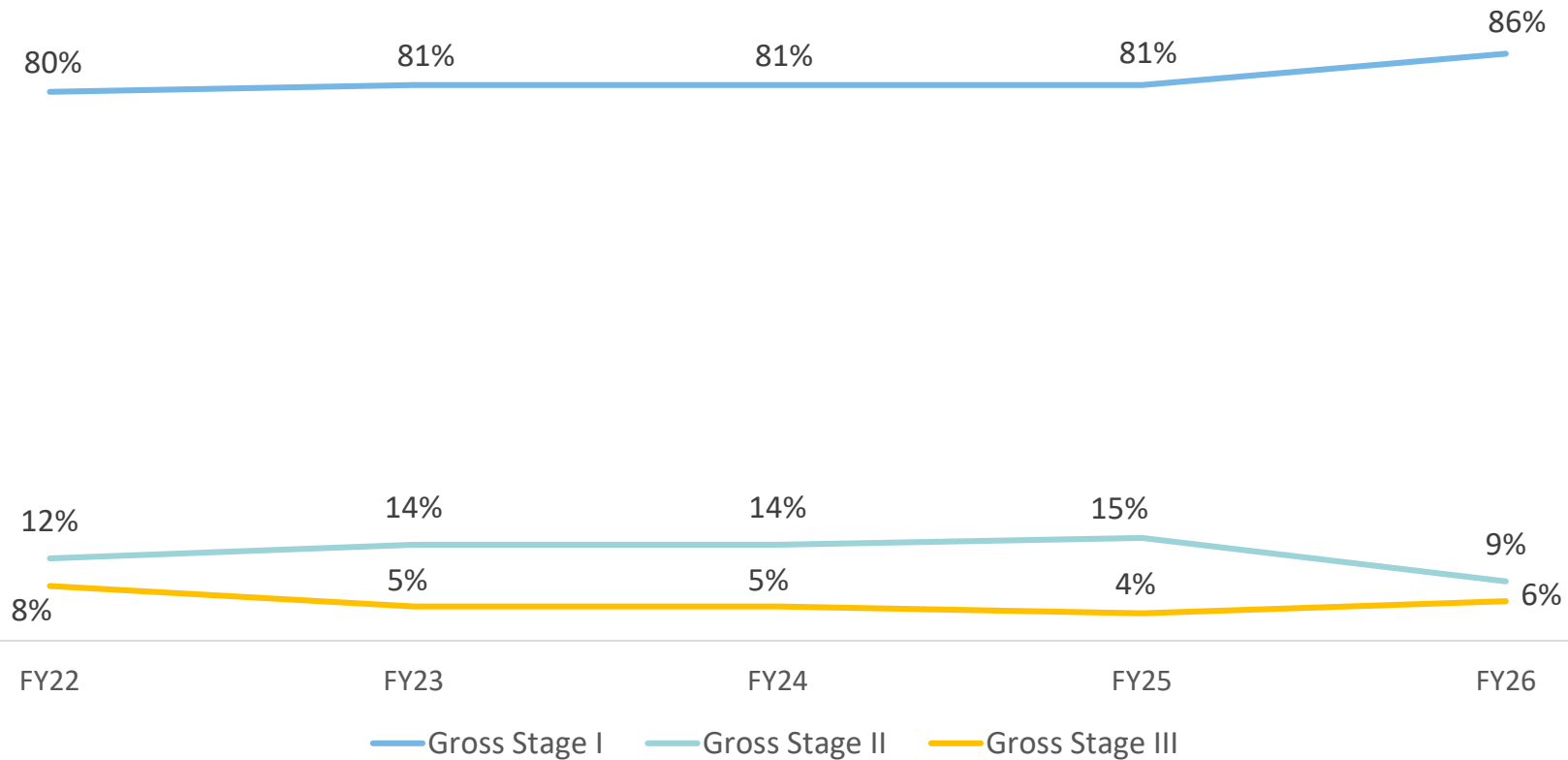

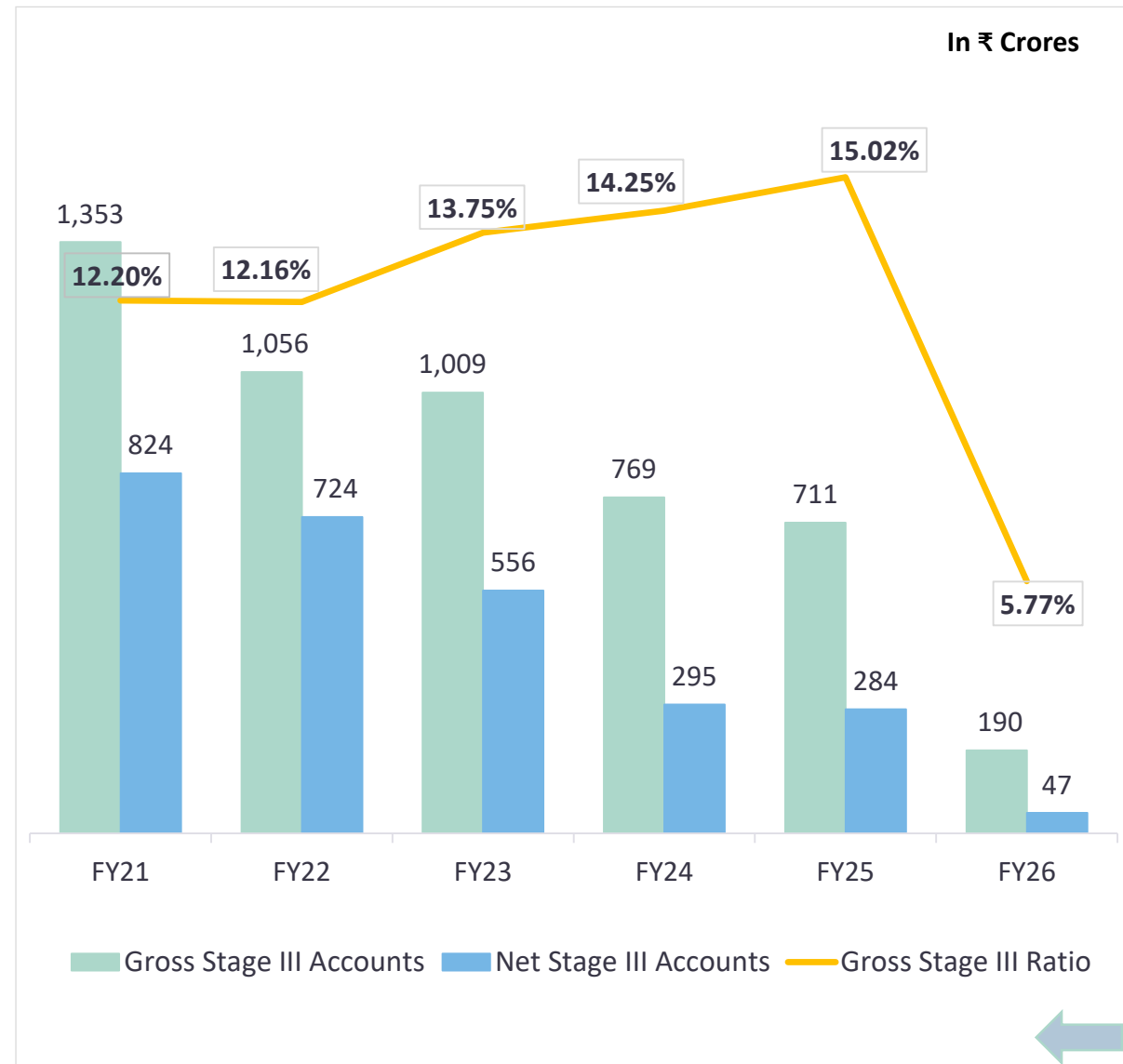

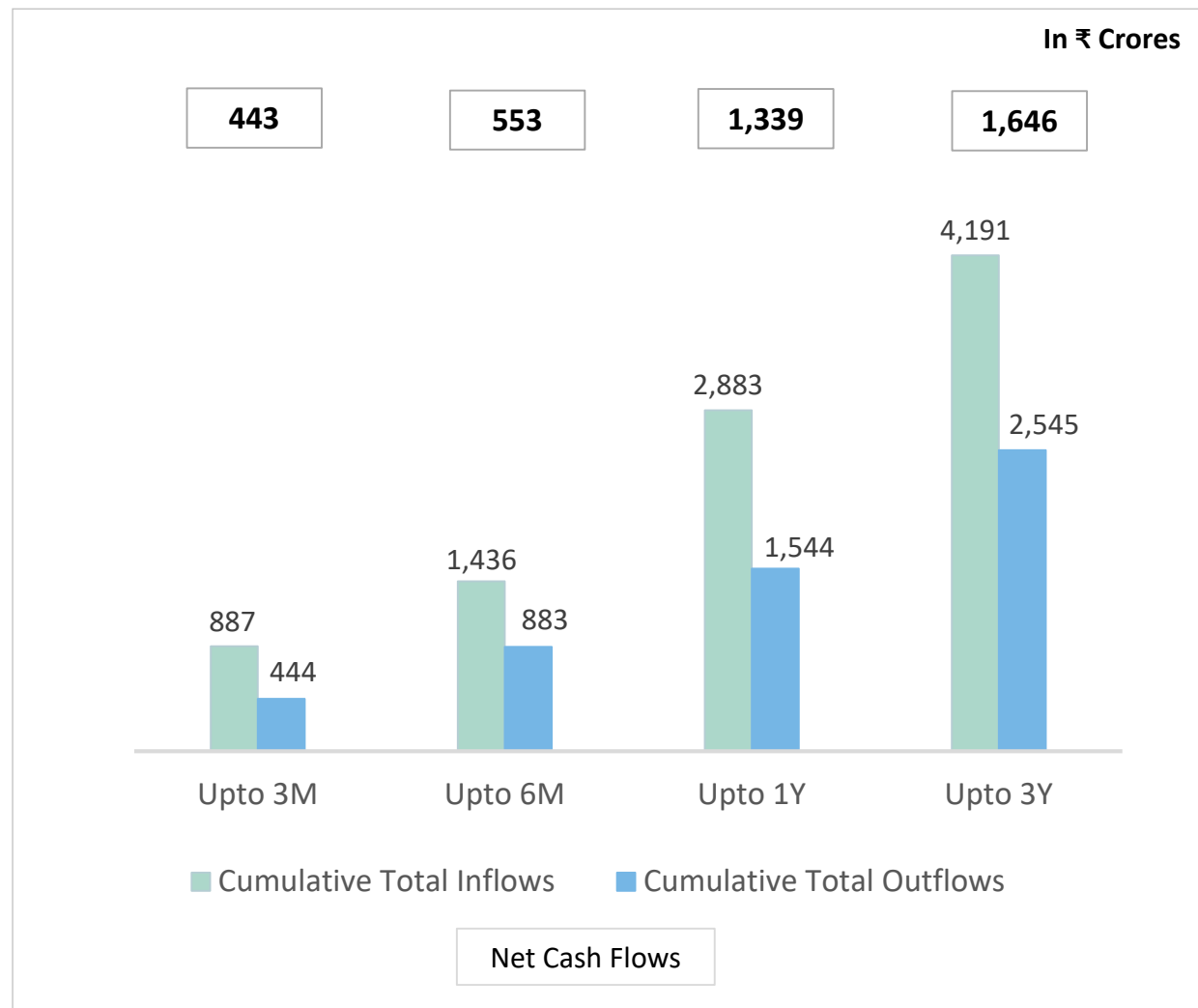

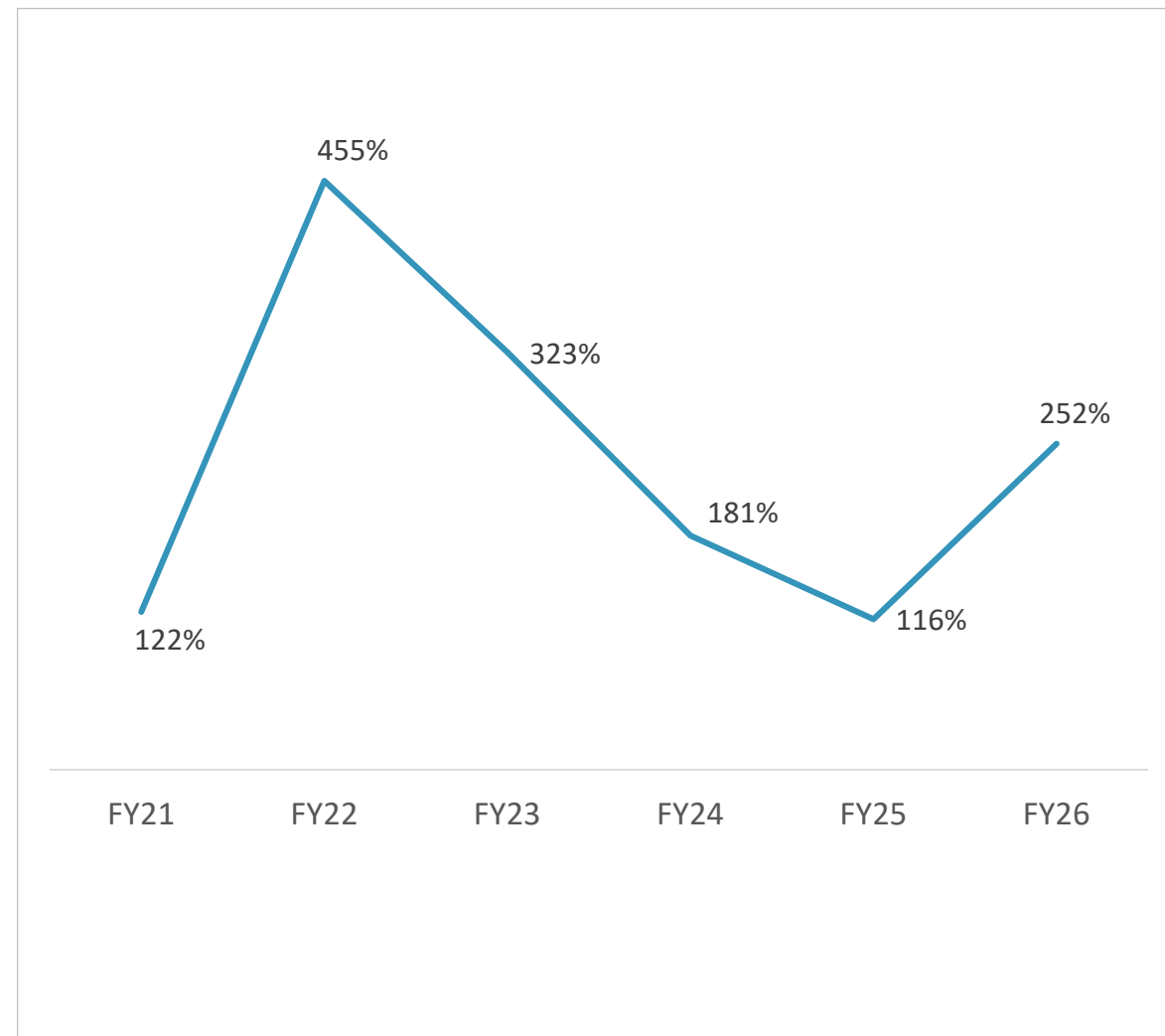

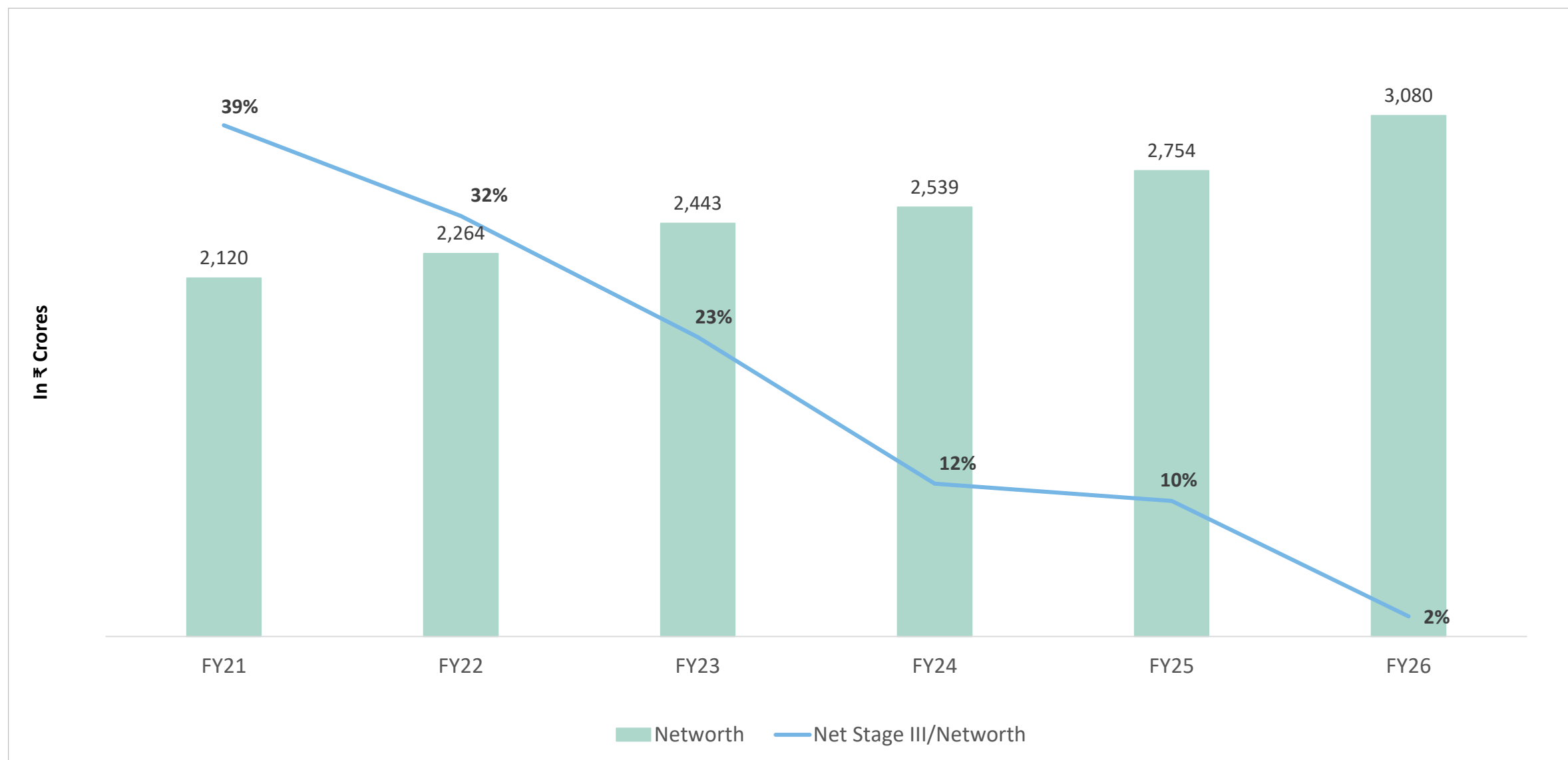
Structured Liquidity Statement as on March 31, 2026

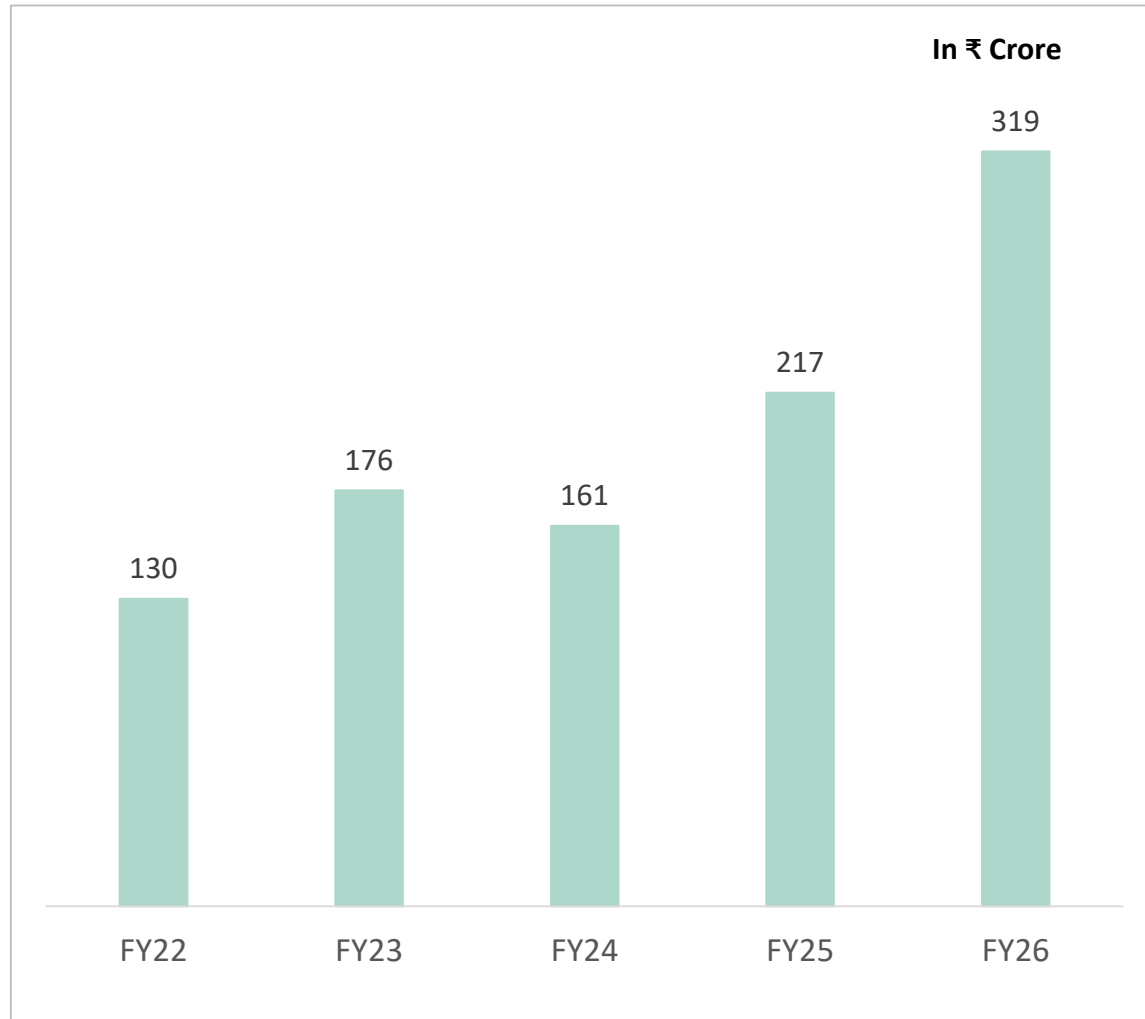

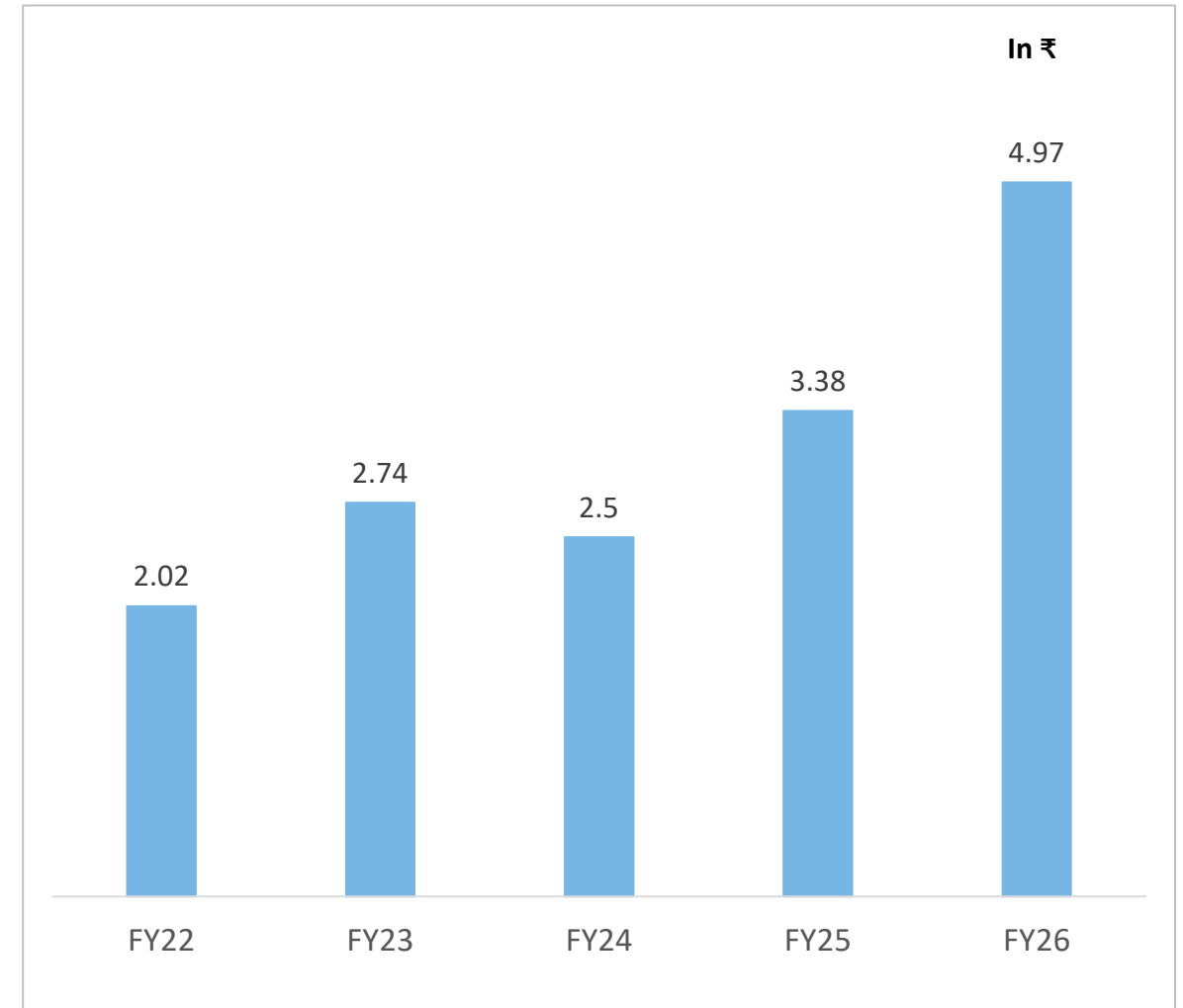

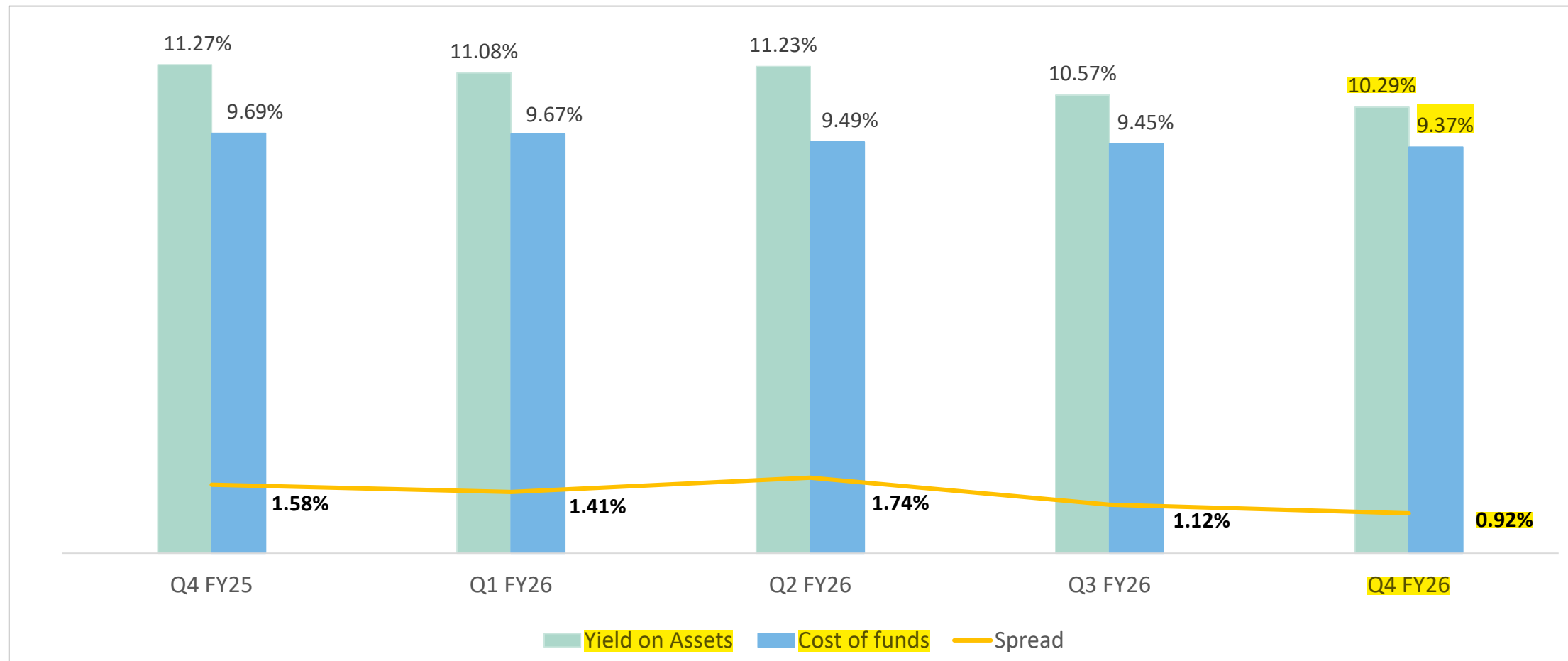
Profit After Tax (PAT)
