Pursuant to General Circular number 14/2020 dt.8.4.2020, 17/2020 dt. 13.4.2020, 20/2020 dt. 5.5.2020, 28/2020 dt. 17.8.2020, 02/2021 dt. 13.1.2021, 19/2021 dt. 8.12.2021, 21/2021 dt. 14.12.2021, 02/2022 dt.5.5.2022, 10/2022 dated 28.12.2022, 09/2023 dated 25.09.2023, 09/2024 dated 19.09.2024 and 03/2025 dated 22.09.2025 issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (MCA) and SEBI Circular no(s). SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD2/CIR/P/2022/62 dt. 13.05.2022, SEBI/HO/CFD/PoD-2/P/CIR/2023/4 dt. 5.1.2023, SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-PoD-2/P/CIR/2023/167 dt. 07.10.2023 and SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-PoD-2/P/CIR/2024/133 dt. 03.10.2024 the companies are allowed to hold the Annual General Meeting through Video Conferencing or Other Audio Visual Means ("VC/OAVM"), without the physical presence of the Members at a common venue.
3. In compliance with applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ("Act") read with aforesaid MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars, the 36th Annual General Meeting of the Company is being conducted through Video Conferencing or Other Audio Visual Means ("VC/OAVM") (hereinafter referred to as "AGM"). In accordance with the Secretarial Standard - 2 on General Meeting issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India (ICSI) read with Guidance/Clarification dated 15th April, 2020 issued by ICSI, the proceedings of the AGM shall be deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company which shall be the deemed venue of the AGM.
4. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Act read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended), Secretarial Standard on General Meetings (SS-2) issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India ("ICSI") and Regulation 44 of Listing Regulations read with MCA Circulars and SEBI Circular, the Company is providing remote e-Voting facility to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the 34th AGM and facility for those Members participating in the AGM to cast vote through e-Voting system during the AGM. For this purpose, the Company has entered into an agreement with Central Depository Services (India) Limited (CDSL) for facilitating voting through electronic means, as the authorized e-Voting's agency. The facility of casting votes by a member using remote e-voting as well as the e-voting system on the date of the AGM will be provided by CDSL.
5. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 30 minutes before and not after 15 minutes of the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available to atleast 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.
6. The attendance of the Members attending the AGM through VC/OAVM will be counted for the purpose of ascertaining the quorum under Section 103 of the Companies Act, 2013.
7. Pursuant to MCA Circulars, the facility to appoint proxy to attend and cast vote for the members is not available for this AGM. However, in pursuance of Section 112 and Section 113 of the Companies Act, 2013, representatives of the members such as the President of India or the Governor of a State or body corporate can attend the AGM through VC OAVM and cast their votes through e-voting.
8. In line with the MCA Circulars, the Notice calling the AGM has been uploaded on the website of the Company at <http://capricornsys-global.com/> The Notice can also be accessed from the websites of the Stock Exchanges i.e. BSE Limited at www.bseindia.com. The AGM Notice is also disseminated on the website of CDSL (agency for providing the Remote e-Voting facility and e-voting system during the AGM) i.e. www.evotingindia.com.
9. A member entitled to attend and vote at the AGM is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on his / her behalf and the proxy need not be a member of the Company. Since the AGM is being held in accordance with the Circulars through VC, the facility for the appointment of proxies by the members will not be available and hence the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip including Route Map are not annexed to this Notice.
10. Participation of members through VC will be reckoned for the purpose of quorum for the AGM as per Section 103 of the Act.
11. Members of the Company under the category of Institutional Investors are encouraged to attend and vote at the AGM through VC. Corporate members intending to authorize their representatives to participate and vote at the meeting are requested to send a certified copy of the Board resolution / authorization letter to the Scrutinizer by email to operationslpg@gmail.com with a copy marked to helpdesk.evoting@cdsindia.com
12. The Register of directors and key managerial personnel and their shareholding, maintained under Section 170 of the Act, and the Register of Contracts or Arrangements in which the directors are interested, maintained under Section 189 of the Act, will be available electronically for inspection by the members during the AGM. All documents referred to in the Notice will also be available for electronic inspection without any fee by the members from the date of circulation of this Notice up to the date of AGM. Members seeking to inspect such documents can send an email to operationslpg@gmail.com.
13. The relevant details required to be given under Regulation 36(3) of the Listing Regulations and Secretarial Standard on General Meetings issued by the Institute of Company Secretaries of India, in respect of directors seeking appointment/ re-appointment at this AGM is annexed hereto.
14. In accordance with, the General Circular No. 20/2020 dated 5th May, 2020 issued by MCA and Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/ CMD1/CIR/P/2020/79 dated 12th May, 2020 issued by SEBI, owing to the difficulties involved in dispatching of physical copies of the financial statements (including Report of Board of Directors, Auditor's report or other documents required to be attached therewith), such statements including the Notice of AGM are being sent in electronic mode to Members whose e-mail address is registered with the Company or the Depository Participant(s).
15. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before and after the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available to atleast 1000 members on first come first served basis. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.
16. Members holding shares either in physical or dematerialized form, as on cut-off date, i.e. as on 21.09.2026, may cast their votes electronically. The e-voting period commences on Friday, 25th September, 2026 (9:00 a.m. IST) and ends on Sunday, 27th September, 2026 (5:00 p.m. IST). The e-voting module will be disabled by CDSL thereafter. A member will not be allowed to vote again on any resolution on which vote has already been cast. The voting rights of members shall be proportionate to their share of the paid-up equity share capital of the Company as on the cut-off date, i.e. as on 21.09.2026. A person who is not a member as on the cut-off date is requested to treat this Notice for information purposes only.

17. The facility for voting during the AGM will also be made available. Members present in the AGM through VC and who have not cast their vote on the resolutions through remote e-voting and are otherwise not barred from doing so, shall be eligible to vote through the e-voting system during the AGM. Kindly refer below for instruction for e-voting during the AGM.
18. The Register of Members and Transfer Book of the Company will be closed from Tuesday, 22nd September, 2026 to Monday, 28th September, 2026 (both days inclusive).
19. In compliance with the Circulars, the Annual Report 2025-2026, the Notice of the 34th AGM and instructions for e-voting are being sent through electronic mode to those members whose email addresses are registered with the Company / depository participant(s). The Notice calling the AGM and the Annual Report has been uploaded on the website of the Company at www.kabsons.co.in. The Notice can also be accessed from the websites of the Stock Exchanges i.e. BSE Limited at www.bseindia.com. The AGM Notice is also disseminated on the website of CDSL (agency for providing the Remote e-Voting facility and e-voting system during the AGM) i.e. www.evotingindia.com.
20. The Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI) has mandated the submission of Permanent Account Number (PAN) by every participant in securities market. Members holding shares in electronic form are, therefore, requested to submit the PAN to their Depository Participants with whom they are maintaining their demat accounts. Members holding shares in physical form are requested to submit their PAN details to the Registrar. SEBI has also mandated, that for registration of transfer of securities, the transferee(s) as well as transferor(s) shall furnish a copy of their PAN card to the Company.
21. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 72 of the Companies Act, 2013, the member(s) holding shares in physical form may nominate, in the prescribed manner, a person to whom all the rights in the shares shall vest in the event of death of the sole holder or all the joint holders. Member(s) holding shares in demat form may contact their respective Depository Participant for availing this facility.
22. Members holding shares in demat form are requested to intimate any change in their address and / or bank mandate immediately to their Depository Participants and Members holding shares in physical form are requested to intimate any change of address and/ or bank mandate to M/s. XL Softech Systems Limited / Investor Service Department of the Company immediately.
23. As per Regulation 40 of Listing Regulations, as amended, securities of listed companies can be transferred only in dematerialized form with effect from April 1, 2019, except in case of request received for transmission or transposition and redelivered transfers of securities. Further, SEBI vide its Circular No. SEBI/HO/MIRSD/RTAMB/CIR/P/2020/236 dated December 02, 2020 had fixed March 31, 2021 as the cut-off date for re-lodgment of transfer deeds and the shares that are re-lodged for transfer shall be issued only in demat mode.
A Special Window has been opened for a period of 6 months from July 07, 2025 to January 06, 2026 by SEBI vide its circular dated SEBI/HO/MIRSD/MIRSD-PoD/P/CIR/2025/97 dated July 02, 2025 to facilitate re-lodgement of transfer requests of physical shares which was subsequently extended by SEBI allowing shareholders to transfer or dematerialize shares for a period of one more year from February 05, 2026 to February 04, 2027 vide its circular dated HO/38/13/11(2)2026-MIRSD-POD/I/3750/2026 dated January 30, 2026. The facility is available for relodgement of transfer deeds, which were lodged prior to the deadline of April 01, 2019 and rejected/returned/not attended due to deficiency in the documents/process/ or otherwise.
Investors who have missed the March 31, 2021 & January 06, 2026 deadlines for lodgement of transfer documents are encouraged to avail advantage of this opportunity by furnishing the necessary documents to the Company's Registrar & Transfer Agent M/s. XL Softech Systems Limited for assistance in this regard.
24. Members holding shares in physical form, in identical order of names, in more than one folio are requested to send to the Company or RTA, the details of such folios together with the share certificates for consolidating their holdings in one folio. A consolidated share certificate will be issued to such Members after making requisite changes.
25. Members may kindly note that in accordance with SEBI Circular reference SEBI/HO/OIAE/OIAE_IAD-1/P/CIR/2023/131 dated July 31, 2023, the Company has registered on the newly launched SMART ODR Portal (Securities Market Approach for Resolution through Online Disputes Resolution Portal). This platform aims to enhance investor grievance resolution by providing access to Online Dispute Resolution Institutions for addressing complaints. Members may feel free to utilize this online conciliation and/or arbitration facility, as outlined in the circular, to resolve any outstanding disputes between Members and the Company (including RTA).
26. In case of joint holders, the Member whose name appears as the first holder in the order of names as per the Register of Members of the Company will be entitled to vote at the e- AGM.
27. The Board of Directors has appointed M/s B S S & Associates, Company Secretaries, as the Scrutinizer to scrutinize the remote e-voting and e-voting during the AGM in a fair and transparent manner. The Scrutinizer's decision on the validity of the vote shall be final.
28. The Scrutinizer will make a consolidated Scrutinizer's Report of the total votes cast in favour or against and invalid votes, if any, to the Chairman / Managing Director of the Company or in his absence to any other Director authorized by the Board of Directors, who shall countersign the same. Based on the Scrutinizer's Report, the result will be declared by the Chairman / Managing Director or in his absence by the Company Secretary within two working days from the conclusion of the AGM at the Registered Office of the Company. Subject to receipt of requisite number of votes, the resolutions shall be deemed to be passed on the date of the AGM i.e., 28.09.2026.
29. The Results declared along with the consolidated Scrutinizer's Report shall be hosted on the website of the Company i.e. www.kabsons.co.in. The results shall simultaneously be communicated to BSE Limited.
30. THE INTRUCTIONS OF SHAREHOLDERS FOR E-VOTING AND JOINING VIRTUAL MEETINGS ARE AS UNDER:

- (i) The voting period begins on Friday, 25th day of September, 2026 at 9.00 a.m. IST and ends on Sunday, 27th day of September, 2026 at 5.00 p.m. IST. During this period, shareholders of the Company, holding shares either in physical form or in dematerialized form, as on the cut-off date Monday, the 21st day of September, 2026 may cast their vote electronically. The e-voting module shall be disabled by CDSL for voting thereafter.
- (ii) Shareholders who have already voted prior to the meeting date would not be entitled to vote at the meeting venue.
- (iii) Pursuant to SEBI Circular No. **SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated 09.12.2020**, under Regulation 44 of Securities and Exchange Board of India (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, listed entities are required to provide remote e-voting facility to its shareholders, in respect of all shareholders' resolutions. However, it has been observed that the participation by the public non-institutional shareholders/retail shareholders is at a negligible level.

Currently, there are multiple e-voting service providers (ESPs) providing e-voting facility to listed entities in India. This necessitates registration on various ESPs and maintenance of multiple user IDs and passwords by the shareholders.

In order to increase the efficiency of the voting process, pursuant to a public consultation, it has been decided to enable e-voting to **all the demat account holders, by way of a single login credential, through their demat accounts/ websites of Depositories/ Depository Participants**. Demat account holders would be able to cast their vote without having to register again with the ESPs, thereby, not only facilitating seamless authentication but also enhancing ease and convenience of participating in e-voting process.

- (iv) In terms of **SEBI circular no. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated December 9, 2020** on e-Voting facility provided by Listed Companies, Individual shareholders holding securities in demat mode are allowed to vote through their demat account maintained with Depositories and Depository Participants. Shareholders are advised to update their mobile number and email Id in their demat accounts in order to access e-Voting facility.

Pursuant to abovesaid SEBI Circular, Login method for e-Voting and joining virtual meetings **for Individual shareholders holding securities in Demat mode CDSL/NSDL** is given below:

2. The state of the company's affairs and Business Performance:

During the financial year 2025-26, the Company recorded a profit of **Rs. 27,219.08** thousand before finance costs, depreciation, and exceptional items, as against a profit of **Rs. 23,986.43** thousand during the previous financial year.

The Company's performance continued to be supported by lease income, which remains a significant source of revenue. The management is actively exploring various opportunities to enhance operational efficiency, improve profitability, and diversify revenue streams in the coming years.

During the year under review, the Company focused on expanding its business activities in the LPG segment, including sales of its own brand LPG, special grade Aerosol LPG and third-party bottling operations. Lease income from the Company's assets continued to contribute steadily to the overall revenue. The Company continued third-party bottling operations at its Palej bottling plant and is actively pursuing opportunities to increase capacity utilization and operational volumes across its facilities.

The Company has applied to the Petroleum and Explosives Safety Organisation (PESO) for approval to undertake bottling operations in 450 Kg capacity cylinders at two locations. The necessary approvals are awaited and upon receipt, are expected to provide additional business opportunities.

With respect to the Dharwad plant, the process for obtaining the required approvals and transfer of licences remains under progress with the relevant authorities. The Company continues to pursue the matter to facilitate commencement of operations at the earliest.

In respect of the Jaipur plant, although all necessary licences and approvals are in place. The Company is now proposing to start a new business segment dealing with DME gas (Dimethyl Ether) which is clean burning, colorless gas that turns into a liquid under low pressure and is used as an alternative fuel, an aerosol propellant, and a blend with LPG and has potential role in reducing LPG import. The present LPG plant facilities can be used mostly with little modifications and additional equipment after receiving necessary Government approvals which are under process.

Your directors remain committed to strengthening the Company's operational performance and creating long-term value for all stakeholders through sustained business development initiatives and prudent financial management.

3. Dividend

Your directors have not recommended any dividend on Equity Shares for the year under review.

4. Transfers to Reserves

Your Board of Directors does not appropriate any amount to be transferred to General Reserves during the year under review.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS**Industry structure and developments**

The Liquefied Petroleum Gas (LPG) industry in India continues to play a vital role in the country's energy mix, supported by increasing demand from domestic, commercial, industrial and automobile sectors. Government initiatives promoting clean cooking fuel, expansion of distribution infrastructure and growing awareness regarding environmentally friendly fuels have contributed to sustained growth in LPG consumption.

India remains one of the largest consumers of LPG globally, with widespread penetration across urban and rural households. The LPG bottling and distribution network continues to expand to meet increasing demand and improve accessibility. The industry's long-term outlook remains positive owing to rising energy requirements and continued policy support for cleaner fuels.

Opportunities and Threats**Opportunities**

The LPG sector offers significant opportunities through increasing consumption in domestic, commercial and industrial segments. Growing demand for cleaner energy alternatives, expansion of industrial activities and rising commercial usage provide avenues for business growth.

The Company continues to explore opportunities to enhance revenue through value-added LPG products, leasing of infrastructure facilities, third-party bottling arrangements and strategic utilization of its existing assets. The expansion of specialized LPG applications, including Aerosol-grade LPG and industrial LPG products, presents additional growth potential.

Threats

The sector faces competition from alternative energy sources such as Piped Natural Gas (PNG), renewable energy solutions and increasing electrification in various sectors. Expansion of PNG infrastructure in urban areas and growing adoption of electric vehicles may impact demand in certain LPG segments over the long term.

Volatility in international LPG prices, regulatory changes and intense competition within the energy sector may also influence business operations and profitability.

Risk Management

The Company has a well-defined risk management framework aimed at identifying, evaluating and mitigating various business risks. The framework covers operational, financial, regulatory and market-related risks. Periodic reviews are conducted to ensure the effectiveness of risk mitigation measures and to strengthen business resilience.

The Company continues to focus on operational efficiency, cost optimization, regulatory compliance and customer satisfaction to effectively manage risks and sustain long-term growth.

Outlook

The Company remains focused on maximizing utilization of its existing assets and expanding its revenue streams through operational improvements and business development initiatives. The leasing of facilities, third-party bottling operations and supply of specialized LPG products continue to contribute to business performance.

The Company expects steady demand for LPG across domestic, commercial and industrial sectors. Efforts are being made to strengthen customer relationships, improve operational efficiencies and capitalize on emerging market opportunities. With its established infrastructure and industry experience, the Company is well-positioned to benefit from future growth in the LPG sector.

Internal Financial Controls and Their Adequacy

The Company has established adequate internal financial controls commensurate with the size and nature of its business. These controls are designed to ensure orderly and efficient conduct of operations, safeguarding of assets, prevention and detection of frauds and errors, accuracy and completeness of accounting records and timely preparation of reliable financial information.

The effectiveness of internal financial controls is reviewed periodically by the management and the Audit Committee of the Board.

Financial Performance Discussion

During the financial year 2025-26, the Company recorded total income of Rs. 4,33,517.89 thousand as compared to Rs. 405,595.00 thousand during the previous financial year.

CORPORATE INFORMATION

Kabsons Industries Limited (the 'company') is a public limited company domiciled and incorporated in India under the Companies Act, 1956. The registered office of the company is located at Madhuw Vihar, 2nd Floor, Plot No.17, H.No.8-2-293/82/C/17, Road No.7, Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad, Telangana - 500033.

The company is engaged in the business of bottling and selling LP Gas under the brand name "KABSONS". The Company's shares are listed on BSE Ltd

1. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Statement of compliance

These financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended from time to time and other accounting principles generally accepted in India.

1.1. Basis of Preparation and Measurement:

The financial statements have been prepared on a historical cost basis, except for financial instruments which have been measured at fair value at the end of each reporting period, as explained in the accounting policies mentioned below.

Use of estimates and judgements

The preparation of the financial statements requires that the Management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities, disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenue and expenses during the reporting period. The recognition, measurement, classification or disclosure of an item or information in the financial statements is made relying on these estimates. The estimates and judgements used in the preparation of the financial statements are continuously evaluated by the Company and are based on historical experience and various other assumptions and factors (including expectations of future events) that the Company believes to be reasonable under the existing circumstances. Actual results could differ from those estimates. Any revision to accounting estimates is recognised prospectively in current and future periods.

1.2. Current Vs Non-current classifications:

Any asset or liability is classified as current if it satisfied any of the following conditions:

- i) The asset/liability is expected to be realized/settled in the Company's normal operating cycle.
- ii) The asset is intended for sale or consumption.
- iii) The asset/liability is held primarily for the purpose of trading.
- iv) The asset/liability is expected to be realized/settled within twelve months after the reporting period.
- v) The asset in cash or cash equivalent unless it is restricted from being exchanged or used to settle a liability for at least twelve months after the reporting date.
- vi) In the case of liability, the Company does not have an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least twelve months after the reporting date.

All other assets and liabilities are classified as non-current. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are classified as non-current assets and liabilities respectively. Based on the nature of its products and the time between the acquisition of assets for processing and their realisation in cash and cash equivalents, the Company has ascertained its operating cycle as 12 months for the purpose of current or non-current classification of assets and liabilities.

1.3.1 Property, Plant and Equipment:

Measurement at recognition

An item of property, plant and equipment that qualifies as an asset is measured on initial recognition at cost. Following initial recognition, items of property, plant and equipment other than land are carried at their cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses. Freehold land is carried at cost of acquisition. The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment comprises the purchase price and any cost attributable to bring the asset to its location and working condition for its intended use. Borrowing costs relating to acquisition of property, plant and equipment which take substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use are also included to the extent they relate to the period till such assets are ready to put to use. Items such as spare parts, stand-by equipment and servicing equipment that meet the definition of property, plant and equipment are capitalized at cost and depreciated over their useful life.

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognized as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. Costs in nature of repairs and maintenance are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss as and when incurred.

Capital Work in Progress

Cost of assets not ready for intended use, as on the Balance Sheet date, is shown as capital work in progress. Advances given towards acquisition of fixed assets outstanding at each Balance Sheet date are disclosed as Other Non-Current Assets.

Depreciation and amortization methods

a) Depreciation is provided on Straight Line Method on the assets over the useful lives specified in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

b) Depreciation on additions is being provided on pro rata basis from the date of such additions. Depreciation on assets sold, discarded or demolished during the year is being provided up to the date on which such assets are sold, discarded or demolished.

Impairment

a) Assets are tested for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less cost of disposal and value in use for the purposes of assessing impairment, assets are grouped at the lowest levels for which there are separately identifiable cash inflows which are largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets (cash-generating units).

b) Reversal of impairment losses recognized in prior years is recorded when there is an indication that the impairment losses recognized for the asset are no longer existing or have decreased.

Derecognition

The carrying amount of an item of property, plant and equipment is derecognized on disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The gain or loss arising from the Derecognition of an item of property, plant and equipment is measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the item and is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss when the item is derecognized.

1.3.2 Investment properties:

Property held to earn rentals or for capital appreciation, or both, rather than for use in the supply of goods or services or for administrative purposes, is classified as investment property. Investment property is measured initially at cost, including transaction costs. Subsequent to initial recognition, investment property is stated at cost less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, consistent with the accounting policy for property, plant and equipment. The Company discloses the fair value of investment property in the notes to the financial statements as required by Ind AS 40, notwithstanding that the cost model is used for measurement in the Balance Sheet. Investment property is derecognised on disposal or when permanently withdrawn from use and no future economic benefits are expected; gains or losses on derecognition are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

1.3.3 Intangible Assets:

Computer Software

Computer software is measured on initial recognition at cost. Following initial recognition, software is carried at its cost less accumulated amortization and accumulated impairment losses.

Amortization Methods

The carrying amount of computer software is amortized over the useful life.

Impairment

a) Assets are tested for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognized for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less cost of disposal and value in use.

b) Reversal of impairment losses recognized in prior years is recorded when there is an indication that the impairment losses recognized for the asset are no longer existing or have decreased.

Derecognition

The carrying amount of an intangible asset is derecognized on disposal or when no future economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The gain or loss arising from the Derecognition of an intangible asset is measured as the difference between the net disposal proceeds and the carrying amount of the intangible asset and is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss when the asset is derecognized.

1.3.4 Leases

The Company assesses whether a contract contains a lease, at the inception of the contract. A contract is, or contains, a lease if the contract conveys the right to control the use of an identified asset for a period of time in exchange for consideration.

Company as a lessee, The Company recognizes a right-of-use asset and a lease liability at the lease commencement date. The right-of-use asset is initially measured at cost, which comprises the initial amount of the lease liability adjusted for any lease payments made at or before the commencement date, plus any initial direct costs incurred and an estimate of costs to dismantle and remove the underlying asset or to restore the site on which it is located, less any lease incentives received. Certain lease arrangements include the option to extend or terminate the lease before the end of the lease term. The right-of-use assets and lease liabilities include these options when it is reasonably certain that the option will be exercised.

The right-of-use asset is subsequently depreciated using the straight-line method from the commencement date to the earlier of the end of the useful life of the right-of-use asset or the end of the lease term. In addition, the right-of-use asset is periodically reduced by impairment losses, if any, and adjusted for certain re-measurements of the lease liability. The lease liability is initially measured at the present value of the lease payments that are not paid at the commencement date, discounted using the interest rate implicit in the lease or, if that rate cannot be readily determined, the Company's incremental borrowing rate. Generally, the Company uses its incremental borrowing rate as the discount rate.

The lease liability is subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method. It is remeasured when there is a change in future lease payments arising from a change in an index or rate, if there is a change in the Company's estimate of the amount expected to be payable under a residual value guarantee, or if there is a change in the lease payments or a change in the assessment of an option to purchase the underlying asset. For a lease modification that is not a separate lease, at the effective date of the modification, the lessee accounts for the lease modification by remeasuring the lease liability using a discount rate determined at that date and the lessee makes a corresponding adjustment to the right-of-use asset. When the lease liability is remeasured in this way, a corresponding adjustment is made to the carrying amount of the right-of-use asset or is recorded in profit or loss if the carrying amount of the right-of use asset has been reduced to zero. Lease payments for the principal portion of the lease liability are classified as financing activities in the Statement of Cash Flows; interest paid on the lease liability is classified as financing activities, consistent with the Company's policy for interest paid generally, in accordance with Ind AS 7. The Company has elected not to recognise right-of use assets and lease liabilities for short term leases that have a lease term of less than or equal to 12 months with no purchase option and assets with low value leases. The Company recognises the lease payments associated with these leases as an expense in statement of profit and loss over the lease term. The related cash flows are classified as operating activities.

Company as a lessor, Leases in which the Company does not transfer substantially all the risks and rewards of ownership of an asset are classified as operating leases. Rental income from operating lease is recognized on a straight-line basis over the term of the relevant lease. Contingent rents are recognized as revenue in the period in which they are earned. Leases are classified as finance leases when substantially all of the risks and rewards of ownership transfer from the Company to the lessee. Company didn't enter into any finance lease agreements.

1.3.5 Cash and cash equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents include cash on hand and at bank, deposits held at call with banks, with original maturities of three months or less other short term highly liquid investments that are readily convertible to a known amount of cash which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value and are held for meeting short-term cash commitments. For the purpose of the Statement of Cash Flows, cash and cash equivalents consist of the above, net of outstanding bank overdrafts (if any), as they are considered an integral part of the Company's cash management.

1.3.6 Inventories

Inventories are valued at the lower of cost and net realizable value.

Scrap is valued at Net realizable value.

The cost is computed on First in First Out.

Cost of Stock-in-trade, stores and packing material comprises cost of purchases and includes all other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition.

Net realizable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

Spare parts, stand-by equipment and servicing equipment are recognized in accordance with this Ind AS-16 when they meet the definition of Property, Plant and Equipment. Otherwise, such items are classified as inventory.

1.3.7 Financial Instruments

A financial instrument is any contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity instrument of another entity.

Financial Assets

· Initial recognition and measurement:

All financial assets are recognized initially at fair value plus, in the case of financial assets not recorded at fair value through profit or loss, transaction costs that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset. Transaction costs of financial assets carried at fair value through profit or loss are expensed in statement of profit or loss.

· Subsequent measurement:

For subsequent measurement, the Company classifies its financial assets into the following categories:

- (i) Amortized cost
- (ii) Fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL)
- (iii) Fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI).

a) Financial Asset measured at amortized cost

Financial Assets held within a business model whose objective is to hold financial assets in order to collect contractual cash flows and the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding are measured at amortized cost using effective interest rate (EIR) method. The EIR amortization is recognized as finance income in the statement of Profit & Loss.

The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts (including all fees and transaction costs and other premiums or discounts) through the expected life of the financial assets, or where appropriate, a shorter period, to the gross carrying amount on initial recognition.

The company while applying above criteria has classified all the financial assets (except investments in mutual funds) at amortized cost.

b) Financial Asset measured at fair value through other comprehensive income

Financial assets that are held within a business model whose objective is achieved by both, selling financial assets and collecting contractual cash flows that are solely payments of principal and interest, are subsequently measured at fair value through other comprehensive income. Fair value movements are recognized in the other comprehensive income (OCI). Interest income measured using the EIR method and impairment losses, if any are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss. On derecognition, cumulative gain or loss previously recognized in OCI is reclassified from the equity to 'other income' in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

The company while applying above criteria has identified that there are no financial assets that can be classified at fair value through other comprehensive income

c) Financial Asset measured at fair value through profit and loss (FVTPL)

Financial Assets are measured at fair value through Profit & Loss if it does not meet the criteria for classification as measured at amortized cost or at FVTOCI. All fair value changes are recognized in the statement of Profit & Loss.

Investments in Mutual funds are classified as financial assets measured at FVTPL.

· Impairment

In accordance with Ind AS 109, the Company applies expected credit loss (ECL) model for measurement and recognition of impairment loss on the debt instruments, that are measured at amortized cost e.g., loans, debt securities, deposits, trade receivables and bank balance.

Expected credit loss is the difference between all contractual cash flows that are due to the Company in accordance with the contract and all the cash flows that the entity expects to receive.

The management uses a provision matrix to determine the impairment loss on the portfolio of trade and other receivables. Provision matrices based on its historically observed expected credit loss rates over the expected life of the trade receivables and is adjusted for forward looking estimates.

Expected credit loss allowance or reversal recognized during the period is recognized as income or expense, as the case may be, in the statement of profit and loss. In case of balance sheet, it is shown as reduction from the specific financial asset.

· **Derecognition**

The Company derecognizes a financial asset when the contractual rights to the cash flows from the financial asset expire, or it transfers the contractual rights to receive the cash flows from the asset.

· **Financial Liabilities**

· **Initial Recognition and Measurement**

Financial liabilities are recognized initially at fair value plus any transaction cost that are attributable to the acquisition of the financial liability except financial liabilities at FVTPL that are measured at fair value.

· **Subsequent Measurement**

a. Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss

Financial liabilities at fair value through profit or loss include financial liabilities held for trading and financial liabilities designated upon initial recognition as at fair value through profit or loss. Gain or losses on liabilities held for trading are recognized in the profit or loss. The Company doesn't designate any financial liability at fair value through profit or loss.

b. Financial liabilities at amortized cost

All financial liabilities of the Company are subsequently measured at amortized cost using the effective interest method.

· **Derecognition**

A financial liability is derecognized when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expires.

1.3.8 Revenue

Revenue from contract with customer is recognized upon, transfer of control of promised products or services to customers on complete satisfaction of performance obligations for an amount that reflects the consideration which the Company expects to receive in exchange for those products or services. Revenue is measured based on the transaction price, which is the consideration, adjusted for discounts and other incentives, if any, as per contracts with the customers. Revenue also excludes taxes or amounts collected from customers in its capacity as agent.

· **Sale of goods:**

Revenue from the sale of goods is recognised at the point in time when control of the goods is transferred to the customer, generally on delivery, being when the customer obtains the ability to direct the use of, and obtain substantially all the remaining benefits from, the goods. Amounts disclosed as revenue are net of returns, trade allowances, rebates and GST.

· **Rendering of Services:**

Revenue from services is recognised at the point in time when the service has been delivered to the customer, as this is when the Company transfers control of the service and satisfies its performance obligation under Ind AS 115.

· **Interest / Dividend**

Interest Income is recognized using the Effective interest rate (EIR) method. Dividend income is recognized when right to receive is established.

1.3.9 Prior period items

The Company applies changes in accounting policies and corrections of prior period errors retrospectively in accordance with Ind AS 8, by restating comparative amounts for the prior period(s) presented in which the change or error occurred, or, if the change or error occurred before the earliest prior period presented, by restating the opening balances of assets, liabilities and equity for the earliest prior period presented. The impact of such restatement is disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

Changes in accounting estimates are accounted for prospectively and are recognised in the period in which the change in estimate is made and, if applicable, in future periods.

Immaterial prior period items are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the period in which they are identified.

1.3.10 Income taxes

Income tax expense for the year comprises current tax and deferred tax. It is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss except to the extent it relates to a business combination or to an item which is recognized directly in equity or in other comprehensive income.

Current tax is the expected tax payable/receivable on the taxable income/loss for the year using applicable tax rates at the Balance Sheet date, and any adjustment to taxes in respect of previous years. Interest expense if any, related to income tax are included in current tax expense.

Deferred tax: Deferred tax assets and liabilities are recognised for deductible and taxable temporary differences arising between the tax base of assets and liabilities and their carrying amount, except when the deferred tax arises from the initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction that is not a business combination and affects neither accounting nor taxable profit or loss at the time of the transaction.

Deferred tax assets are recognised to the extent that it is probable that taxable profit will be available against which the deductible temporary differences, and the carry forward of unused tax credits and unused tax losses can be utilised. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the year when the asset is realised or the liability is settled, based on tax rates (and tax laws) that have been enacted or substantively enacted at the reporting date.

1.3.11 Provisions and contingent liabilities

Provisions are recognized when there is a present legal or constructive obligation that can be estimated reliably, as a result of a past event, when it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Provisions are reviewed at each reporting date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimate. If it is no longer probable that an outflow of economic resources will be required to settle the obligation, the provisions are reversed. Where the effect of the time value of money is material, provisions are discounted using a current pre-tax rate that reflects, where appropriate, the risks specific to the liability. When discounting is used, the increase in the provisions due to the passage of time is recognized as a finance cost.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events, the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made.

1.3.12 Earnings per share

The Company presents basic and diluted earnings per share ("EPS") data for its ordinary shares. Basic EPS is calculated by dividing the profit or loss attributable to ordinary shareholders of the Company by the weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding during the period. Diluted EPS is determined by adjusting the profit or loss attributable to ordinary shareholders and the weighted average number of ordinary shares outstanding for the effects of all dilutive potential ordinary shares, if any.

1.3.13 Functional and Reporting Currency:

The Company's functional and reporting currency is Indian National Rupee.

Initial Recognition:

Foreign currency transactions are recorded in the reporting currency, by applying to the foreign currency amounts the exchange rate between the reporting currency and the foreign currency at the date of the transaction.

Conversion on reporting date:

Foreign currency monetary items are reported using the closing rate with reference to RBI rate Non-monetary items that are measured in terms of historical costing a foreign currency is translated using the exchange rates at the dates of the initial transactions.

Exchange Differences:

Exchange difference arising on the settlement of monetary items or on reporting monetary items of Company at rates different from those at which they were initially recorded during the year or reported in previous financial statements are recognized as income or as expenses in the year in which they arise.

1.3.14 Employee Benefits

Defined Contribution Plan

Employer's contribution to Provident Fund/Employee State Insurance which is in the nature of defined contribution scheme is expensed off when the contributions to the respective funds are due. There are no other obligations other than the contribution payable to the fund.

Defined Benefit Plan

(a) Post-employment defined benefit plan — Gratuity

The Company's liability towards gratuity is a defined benefit plan. The cost of providing the benefit is determined using the projected unit credit method, with actuarial valuations carried out at the end of each reporting period. Service cost (comprising current service cost, past service cost and gains/losses on curtailments and settlements) and net interest expense or income are recognised in the Statement of Profit and Loss. Remeasurements (comprising actuarial gains/losses, the return on plan assets excluding amounts in net interest, and any change in the effect of the asset ceiling) are recognised in Other Comprehensive Income and are not reclassified to profit or loss in a subsequent period.

(b) Other long-term employee benefits — Leave Encashment

1.3.15 Dividends

Annual dividend distribution to the shareholders is recognized as a liability in the period in which the dividend is approved by the shareholders in Statement of changes in Equity.. Any interim dividend paid is recognized on approval by Board of Directors.

(i) Market Risk:

Market risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of a financial instrument will fluctuate because of changes in market prices. Market prices comprise three types of risk currency rate risk, interest rate risk and other price risks such as equity risk. Financial instruments affected by market risk include deposits and mutual funds.

a. Interest Rate Risk

Interest rate risk is the risk that the fair value or future cash flows of the Company and the Company's financial instruments will fluctuate because of changes in market interest rates. Since the Company has no interest-bearing debts, exposure to interest rate risk is minimal.

b. Foreign Currency Risk

Currency risk is the risk that the value of a financial instrument will fluctuate due to changes in foreign exchange rates. Currency risk arises when transactions are denominated in foreign currencies.

- ii. The Company is not covered under the obligation to incur CSR Expenditure as per section 135 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- iii. The Company has not invested or traded in Crypto currency or Virtual Currency.

33.5 Recent accounting pronouncements:

The Ministry of Corporate Affairs notified new standards or amendment to existing standards under Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules as issued from time to time. The Company applied following amendments for the first-time during the current year which are effective from April 1, 2025.

In August 2025, MCA notified the following amendments applicable w.e.f. April 1, 2025 to:

1. Ind AS 1, Presentation of Financial Statements, applicable

The amendment relates to classification of liabilities as current or noncurrent and non-current liabilities with covenants. In the context of classifying a liability as current, it removes the requirement of existence of a right to defer settlement for at least 12 months after the reporting date and instead requires that the said right should exist on the reporting date and have substance. The amendment also introduces guidance on classification of liabilities with covenants. The Company has no impact of these amendments in its classification criteria of current and noncurrent liabilities.

2. Ind AS 7, Statement of Cash Flows and Ind AS 107, Financial Instruments: Disclosures,

The amendment in Ind AS 7 requires to inform users of financial statements of the existence of supplier finance arrangements and explain the nature of the arrangements, the carrying amount of liabilities and the range of payment due dates. Ind AS 107 has been amended to add supplier finance arrangements as a factor that may cause concentration of liquidity risk. The Company has reviewed the amendment and based on its evaluation has determined that it does not have any impact in its financial statements.

3. Ind AS 12, International Tax Reform

Pillar Two Model Rules applicable immediately - The amendments provide a temporary mandatory relief from deferred tax accounting for top-up tax and disclose that they have applied the relief. This relief is immediate and applies retrospectively. Based on its evaluation has determined that it does not have any impact in its financial statements.

4. Ind AS 21 - The Effects of Changes in Foreign Exchange Rates

In May 2025, MCA notified amendments to Ind AS 21 - applicable w.e.f. April 1, 2025. The Company has reviewed the amendment and based on its evaluation has determined that it does not have any significant impact in its financial statements
