4. 5. The statement/information relating to the business to be transacted at the AGM, including the disclosures required under Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 and the applicable Secretarial Standards, is annexed hereto.
6. In compliance with the circulars issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs (“MCA”), vide its General Circular Nos. 14/2020 dated April 08, 2020, 17/2020 dated April 13, 2020, 20/2020 dated May 05, 2020, 02/2022 dated May 05, 2022, 10/2022 dated December 28, 2022, 09/2023 dated September 25, 2023, 09/2024 dated September 19, 2024, 03/2025 dated September 22, 2025 and other relevant circulars (“MCA Circulars”) read with the earlier circulars of Securities and Exchange Board of India and Circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/CFDPoD-2/P/CIR/2024/133 October 03, 2024, which does not require physical presence of the Members at common venue. In view of this, the Annual General Meeting (“AGM”) is being conducted through Video Conference (“VC”)/Other Audio Visual Means (“OAVM”). The proceedings of the AGM shall be deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company, which shall be the deemed venue of the AGM.
7. Pursuant to the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (“Act”), a Member entitled to attend and vote at the AGM is entitled to appoint a proxy to attend and vote on his/her behalf and the proxy need not be a Member of the Company. Since this AGM is being held pursuant to the MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars through VC/OAVM, physical attendance of Members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxies by the Members will not be available for the AGM and hence the Proxy Form, Attendance Slip and route map of the AGM are not annexed to this Notice. However, the Body Corporates are entitled to appoint authorized representatives to attend.
8. Institutional / Corporate Members are requested to send scanned copy of their respective Board or governing body resolution/ authorization to attend the AGM through VC/ OAVM and vote through e-voting, to the Company at jaincocal @ gmail.com or Scrutinizer directly. In case of joint holders attending the Meeting, only such joint holder who is higher in the order of names will be entitled to vote.
9. Participation of Members through VC will be reckoned for the purpose of quorum for the AGM as per section 103 of the Act.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR MEMBERS FOR ATTENDING AGM THROUGH VC/OAVM ARE AS UNDER:

- i. Member will be provided with a facility to attend the AGM through VC/OAVM through the ZOOM system. Members may access the same by downloading the zoom app or opening <https://zoom.us/join> from their web browser. The Meeting ID for ZOOM is 83846379193 and password for joining is jainco
 - ii. The Members can join the AGM in the VC/OAVM mode 15 minutes before the scheduled time of the commencement of the Meeting by following the procedure mentioned in the Notice. The facility of participation at the AGM through VC/OAVM will be made available for members on first come first served basis as there is limit of VC. This will not include large Shareholders (Shareholders holding 2% or more shareholding), Promoters, Institutional Investors, Directors, Key Managerial Personnel, the Chairpersons of the Audit Committee, Nomination and Remuneration Committee and Stakeholders Relationship Committee, Auditors etc. who are allowed to attend the AGM without restriction on account of first come first served basis.
 - iii. Members are encouraged to join the Meeting through PC/Laptops for better experience.
 - iv. 24. Pursuant to the provisions of Section 108 of the Companies Act, 2013 read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 (as amended) and Regulation 44 of SEBI (Listing Obligations & Disclosure Requirements) Regulations 2015 (as amended), and the Circulars



issued by the Ministry of Corporate Affairs dated April 08, 2020, April 13, 2020 and May 05, 2020 and also SEBI circular no. SEBI/ HO/CFD/CMD/CIR/P/2020/242 dated 09 December, 2020, the Company is providing facility of remote e-Voting to its Members in respect of the business to be transacted at the AGM and facility for those Members participating in the AGM to cast vote through e-voting system during the AGM. The Board has noted the observations contained in the Secretarial Audit Report and provides the following comments:

1. Committee Constitution: The observation has been noted and necessary steps are being taken to align the constitution of the Committees with the applicable requirements, wherever required.
2. The Company has already applied for delisting from the Calcutta Stock Exchange. The matter is pending and the Company shall take such further steps as may be required.
3. The Company is of the view that the Annual Return was duly certified in accordance with the applicable provisions of Section 92(2) of the Companies Act, 2013 and the applicable certification requirements.
4. The discrepancy in disclosure of tenure has been noted. The Company has considered the tenure as approved by the Members at the AGM held on 27/09/2025 and, accordingly, no further change is presently considered necessary.
5. The discrepancy in the effective date of change in designation has been noted. The same has no impact on the substantive appointment or tenure of the Independent Directors, which remains as approved by



- the Members at the AGM, namely from May 10, 2025 to September 30, 2029 in the case of Ms. Pushpa Nahata and from July 14, 2025 to September 30, 2029 in the case of Mr. Udit Maloo. Appropriate corrective action in the statutory filing shall be taken, wherever required.
6. The omission referred to in the ROC form has been noted. The same occurred during migration to the MCA V3 system and due to limitations/restrictions in the relevant fields. Appropriate corrective action shall be taken, wherever required, and due care shall be exercised in future filings.
 7. Structured Digital Database (SDD): The Company has taken steps to strengthen its SDD system, records and audit trail and has implemented an appropriate digital system for maintaining the requisite records.
 8. The observations relating to appointment/cessation and related filings have been noted. The appointment and resignation were in the capacity of Compliance Officer and the Company had accordingly not treated the said designation as a separate KMP appointment under the Companies Act, 2013.
 9. NCLT/CIRP Disclosure: The proceedings are being contested by the Company. The observations regarding disclosure requirements have been noted. The Company states that the relevant notice was received on **26/07/2025** and intimation thereof was made to the Stock Exchange on the same date. Certain observations arose on account of the time lag between submission of the requisite documents and issuance of the Secretarial Audit Report. The Board has taken note thereof and shall endeavour to ensure better coordination in future.

VOLUNTARY DELISTING OF EQUITY SHARES

The Company has applied for delisting of shares from Calcutta Stock Exchange Ltd. (CSE), which is under process. The Company had already obtained approval from its shareholders for delisting from all other Stock Exchanges except exchange with nationwide connectivity.

OTHER MATTERS

- Company has long back applied for delisting from The Calcutta Stock Exchange Ltd. (CSE), hence stopped payment of listing fees to CSE LTD as exchange is non functional.
- NSE has wrongfully inserted the name of the company in the Promoter group of Xedd Telecom Limited (Liquidated Company). The management are taking steps to remove the name of the company from the promoter group of Xedd Telecom Limited.

We have conducted the Secretarial Audit of the compliance of applicable statutory provisions and the adherence to good corporate practices by JAINCO PROJECTS (INDIA) LTD. (hereinafter called “the Company”). Secretarial Audit was conducted in a manner that provided us a reasonable basis for evaluating the corporate conducts / statutory compliance(s) and expressing our opinion thereon.

Based on our verification of the Company’s books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records as available and provided by the company, its officers, agents and authorized representatives during the conduct of Secretarial Audit, we hereby report that in our opinion, the company has during the audit period covering the financial year ended on 31st March, 2026 complied with the statutory provisions listed hereunder (subject to the observations and qualifications detailed in this report) and also that the Company’s Board processes and compliance mechanisms require improvement and strengthening in several areas as per the reporting made hereinafter:

We have examined the books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records maintained by Company for the financial year ended on 31st March, 2026 according to the provisions of:

- (i) The Companies Act, 2013 (the Act) and the rules made thereunder;
- (ii) The Securities Contracts (Regulation) Act, 1956 (‘SCRA’) and the rules made thereunder;
- (iii) The Depositories Act, 1996 and the Regulations and Bye-laws framed thereunder;
- (iv) Foreign Exchange Management Act, 1999 and the rules and regulations made thereunder to the extent of Foreign Direct Investment, Overseas Direct Investment and External Commercial Borrowings;
- (v) The following Regulations and Guidelines prescribed under the Securities and Exchange Board of India Act, 1992 (‘SEBI Act’):-
 - (a) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Substantial Acquisition of Shares and Takeovers) Regulations, 2011;
 - (b) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Prohibition of Insider Trading) Regulations, 2015;
 - (c) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue of Capital and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2018;
 - (d) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Share Based Employee Benefits and Sweat Equity) Regulations, 2021;
 - (e) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Issue and Listing of Non-Convertible Securities) Regulations, 2021;
 - (f) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Registrars to an Issue and Share Transfer Agents) Regulations, 1993 regarding the Companies Act and dealing with client;
 - (g) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Delisting of Equity Shares) Regulations, 2021; and
 - (h) The Securities and Exchange Board of India (Buyback of Securities) Regulations, 2018;



We have also examined compliance with the applicable clauses of the following:

- (i) Secretarial Standards issued by The Institute of Company Secretaries of India.
- (ii) The Listing Agreements entered into by the Company with Calcutta Stock Exchange Limited, Bombay Stock Exchange Limited.

During the period under review the Company has complied with the provisions of the Act, Rules, Regulations, Guidelines, Standards, etc. mentioned above *subject to the following observations*:

1. The various committees as per LODR were not duly constituted.
2. The status of the Company remains suspended on Calcutta Stock Exchange and listing fees to CSE is also due since long leading to non-compliance of Regulation 14 of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015.
3. The Annual Return (MGT-7) for the financial year 2024-25 of the Company was not signed by the Company Secretary of the Company resulting to non-compliance of section 92(1) of the Companies Act, 2013. Instead, it was digitally signed by a Practicing Company Secretary (PCS).
4. Ms. Pushpa Nahata (DIN: 11078431) was appointed as an Additional Independent Director on May 10, 2025. Later, in its Board outcome dated July 14, 2025 (when Mr. Udit Maloo, DIN: 10267229, was also appointed), the Company reported a new term for both directors from August 01, 2025, to January 31, 2030 (4.5 years). However, the 34th AGM Notice changed these terms to May 10, 2025, to September 30, 2029 (for Ms. Nahata) and July 14, 2025, to September 30, 2029 (for Mr. Maloo). This created a disclosure mismatch under Regulation 30 of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015. Additionally, while the AGM Notice stated the appointments were for up to 5 consecutive years, the proposed resolution dates actually set shorter periods of about 4.3 years and 4.2 years, causing a contradiction in the Notice text.
5. Ms. Pushpa Nahata (DIN: 11078431) and Mr. Udit Maloo (DIN: 10267229) were initially appointed as Additional Directors under the "Independent Category". Subsequently, their designation was regularized from Additional Director to Director (Independent) upon receiving shareholder approval at the Annual General Meeting (AGM) held on September 27, 2025. However, in Form DIR-12 filed vide SRN AB8555410, the date of change in designation for both directors was incorrectly entered as October 01, 2025, instead of the actual date of shareholder approval (September 27, 2025).
6. The Board resolution passed by the Company on 30-05-2025 explicitly states that the Financial Statements of the Company shall be signed by Mr. Sumit Bhansali (DIN: 00361918), Ms. Pushpa Nahata (DIN: 11078431) and Mr. Ramakant Goenka, Company Secretary of the Company. Mr. Goenka also initialled on the physical Balance Sheet, but his details were omitted from Point 4(c) of Form AOC-4 NBFC filed vide SRN- AC1943350, which listed only the two signing Directors.
7. Although the Company submitted quarterly SDD compliance certificates to BSE Limited for all four quarters during the period under review (with signatory inconsistencies between the Compliance Officer and Managing Director, as well as an un-digitally signed submission for Q3 ended September 2025), the Company continues to be flagged as "SDD Non-Compliant" on the portal of BSE Limited. However, due to limitations in the availability of complete historical data and backup audit trails, the end-to-end immutability and completeness of UPSI entries could not be fully verified. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the continuous operational compliance of the SDD system under Regulations 3(5) and 3(6) of the SEBI (PIT) Regulations, 2015.
8. The Company issued a Board Meeting intimation dated February 02, 2026, for the appointment of a KMP - Company Secretary / Compliance Officer. However, in the Board meeting Outcome dated February 14, 2026, Mr. Apurv Maheshwari was appointed and disclosed solely as "Compliance Officer." Subsequently, Mr. Maheshwari resigned from his position via an email dated April 16, 2026. Under Regulation 6(1) of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015, a listed entity is required to appoint a qualified Company Secretary as its Compliance Officer, who holds the status of Key Managerial Personnel (KMP) under Section 203 of the Companies Act, 2013. The Company failed to file Form DIR-12 (for both appointment and cessation) and Form MGT-14 with the Registrar of Companies, resulting in non-compliance with Sections 170, 179(3), and 203 of the Companies Act, 2013, and Regulation 6(1) of SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015.
9. The Company received a notice of filing of an application for initiation of Corporate Insolvency Resolution Process (CIRP) under Section 7 of the Insolvency and Bankruptcy Code, 2016, before the NCLT Kolkata Bench, claiming a default amount of ₹12,62,81,337.11 as on July 16, 2025. In its



intimation to the Stock Exchange dated July 26, 2025, the Company omitted key required details including the name of the financial creditor and the current application status, in deviation from SEBI Circular guidelines (SEBI/HO/CFD/CFD-PoD-1/P/CIR/2023/123). Subsequently, the Company failed to disclose continuous updates on material developments or outcomes regarding the said NCLT proceedings, resulting in non-compliance with the disclosure timelines and continuous disclosure obligations mandated under Regulation 30 read with Clause 16 of Part A of Schedule III of the SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015.

10. It was observed that there were certain gaps in the process of dispatch/serving of notices for Board and Committee meetings, including the timelines thereof. Further, there were limitations in the availability and verifiability of supporting documents such as proofs of dispatch, attendance records, and meeting minutes, with some inconsistencies noted among these records. As a result, compliance with the relevant provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and SEBI (LODR) Regulations, 2015, in this regard, could not be fully established.
11. The Company maintains a website; however, it was observed that certain disclosures/sections mandated to be hosted therein were either not updated or not fully available. Accordingly, the website was not fully functional in terms of the requirements prescribed under Regulation 46 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015, as well as Section 12(3)(c) of the Companies Act, 2013, which obligates every listed company to maintain a functional website and disseminate prescribed information.

We further report that:

- (i) The Board of Directors of the Company is duly constituted with proper balance of Executive Directors, Non-Executive Directors and Independent Directors. Further there are no changes in the composition of the Board of Directors during the period under review (except retirement of one Independent Director and appointment of two Independent Directors).
- (ii) Board Meetings notices, agenda and notes on agenda were sent (subject to as mentioned in point 10 of this report) and a system for seeking information, clarifications on items before the meeting for participation at the meeting exists.
- (iii) Dissent on resolution/s were not noticed based on minutes as provided and produced.
- (iv) Based on the information and explanations provided to us, and the records examined, we are unable to independently verify the adequacy and effectiveness of the systems and processes of the Company to monitor and ensure compliance with applicable laws, rules, regulations, and guidelines commensurate with its size and operations.

Report on the Audit of Standalone Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying standalone financial statements of Jainco Projects (India) Limited ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2026, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the statement of Cash Flows and the Statement of Changes in Equity for the year then ended, and the notes to the financial statements including a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the standalone financial statements").

Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanations given to us, the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Companies Act 2013 ("the Act"), in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the Indian Accounting Standards prescribed under section 133 of the Act read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as amended, ("**Ind AS**") and other accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March, 2026, its profit, its cash flows and changes in equity for the year ended on that date.

Basis for Opinion

We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing (SAs) specified under section 143(10) of the Companies Act 2013. Our responsibilities under those Standards are further described in the Auditor's Responsibilities for the audit of the Financial Statements section of our report. Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to Note No 2.22 in the financial statements wherein the Company has disclosed the impact of various litigations on its current and future financial performance. Considering the uncertainties involve in the future outcome of such proceeding scenario which a based on various external factors outside

the control of the Company, the management's assumptions and estimates on operational and financial performance of the Company would largely depend on future developments as they emerged as stated in the said note. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.



Information Other than the Financial Statements and Auditor's Report thereon

The Company's board of Directors is responsible for the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report including annexures to Board's Report and Report on Corporate Governance but does not include the standalone and consolidated financial statements and our respective auditor's report thereon. The other information referred to above is expected to be made available to us after the date of this auditor's report.

Our opinion on the standalone financial statements does not cover the other information and we do not express any form of assurance conclusion thereon.

In connection with our audit of the financial statements, our responsibility is to read the other information identified above and, in doing so, consider whether the other information is materially inconsistent with the financial statements or our knowledge obtained in the audit, or otherwise appears to be materially misstated.

When we read the other information, if we conclude that there is a material misstatement therein, we are required to communicate the matter to those charged with governance.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone Financial Statements

impact if any is not currently ascertainable. Receivables and advances include the amount due from customers and parties or assets which are not presently in possession of the company and matter is sub-judice.

- b. We draw attention to Notes 2.12 and 24.9 to the standalone financial statements relating to borrowing costs and claims of financial creditors, including disputed interest and other charges. The accounting treatment thereof has been made by the Company based on its assessment under the applicable Ind AS and the facts and circumstances as at the reporting date. The underlying claims and proceedings are disputed/sub judice. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter. .
- c. Note no. 24.1 & also 24.9, effect of total non-recognition of various financial figures i.e. total contingent liability of the company which has been determined/ unascertainable include any claims by financial / operational creditors / statutory dues / effect of guarantees extended by the company and not acknowledged as debt/liability.
- d. Note no. 24.1 wherein companies some assets, current and fixed are not in possession of company due to reason briefed therein.
- e. Note 2.22 / 24.28 to the standalone financial statements which explain the uncertainties and management's assessment of the financial impact due to legal cases, for which a definitive assessment of the impact is dependent upon future outcome of the same.

We further draw attention to the fact that certain legal cases against and filed by the Company are ongoing before various judicial and quasi-judicial authorities.  - viii. Based on our examination which included test checks, the Company has in place an accounting software for maintaining its books of account which has a feature of recording audit trail (edit log) facility and the same has operated throughout the year for all relevant

transactions recorded in the software. Further, during the course of our audit we did not come across any instance of audit trail feature being tampered with. Additionally, the audit trail is preserved by the Company as per the statutory requirements for record retention.
