Standalone performance of Financial Technologies for the quarter ended September 30, 2011:

- Total Income from operations for the quarter ended September 30, 2011 increased by 80% to Rs. 1,231 million as compared to Rs. 686 million for quarter ended June 30, 2011
- EBIDTA for the quarter ended September 30, 2011 increased by 76% to Rs. 856 million as compared to Rs. 486 million for quarter ended June 30, 2011
- Net Profit for the quarter ended September 30, 2011 increased by 77% to Rs. 692 million as compared to Rs. 392 million for quarter ended June 30, 2011
- The board declared second interim dividend of 100% on the face value of Rs 2/- per share

Standalone performance of Financial Technologies for the half year ended September 30, 2011:

- Total Income from operations of Rs. 1,917 million for the half year ended September 30, 2011

Commenting on Financial Technologies' Standalone second quarter and half year FY 2011-12 performance, Dewang Neralla, Whole Time Director, said:

"We are pleased to announce unaudited financial results for quarter and half year ended September 30, 2011. We booked Total income from operations of Rs. 1,231 million and Net Profit of Rs. 692 million for the quarter ended September 30, 2011.

During this quarter FTIL tied up with BSE to enable BSE's members to conduct their equity derivative trades on FTIL's trading software platform ODIN.

We experienced a good growth on our international exchanges. SMX reported highest daily turnover of USD 733 million and introduced world's first iron ore futures contract on a global platform during the quarter ended September 30, 2011. GBOT reported highest daily turnover of USD 65 million during the quarter ended September 30, 2011.

On domestic exchanges front, we continued to maintain our leadership position across the asset classes we are offering. MCX second quarter average daily turnover grew by 91% over FY 11 daily average. IEX, for the first half of the financial year, witnessed a good traction in Renewable Energy Certificates capturing 87% of that market, while in the Day Ahead market average daily volumes for the second quarter grew by 21% over FY 11 daily average. Our Ecosystem ventures have also witnessed a steady operational growth."

Notes

- 1. These unaudited financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors at their meetings held on November 11, 2011 and have been subjected to a limited review by the Statutory Auditors of the Company, except that the figures appearing in the statement made by the Management in Note 3 below are outside the purview of such review.
- 2. The Board of Directors in their meeting held on November 11, 2011 have declared second interim dividend of Rs. 2/- per equity share of face value Rs. 2/- each (i.e. @ 100%) on equity share capital of the Company.
- 3. The average daily turnover for the quarter ended September 30, 2011 in the group company exchanges are as under:
- a) MCX Rs. 61,293 Crore, an increase of 91% over FY 11 daily average. The highest daily turnover recorded was Rs. 111,666 Crore.
- b) IEX (Day Ahead Market) 39,116 MWh, an increase of 21% over FY 11 daily average. The highest daily turnover recorded was 58,324 MWh
- c) DGCX USD 972 million, an increase of 126% over FY 11 daily average. The highest daily turnover recorded was USD 1,913 million.
- d) SMX USD 349 million, an increase of 2,029% over FY 11 (w.e.f. Oct 1, 2010) daily average. The highest daily turnover recorded was USD 733 million.
- e) GBOT USD 36 million, an increase of 79% over FY 11 (w.e.f. Nov 1, 2010) daily average. The highest daily turnover recorded was USD 65 million.
- 4. The Company, as a part of its core business strategy, promotes and invests in new ventures that utilise its technological capabilities and domain expertise towards creating world class enterprises. The investment in each such venture is assessed for its risks and is limited to a pre-determined level and will generate returns after the ventures start ramping-up operations which is normally expected in about 2 to 4 years time frame. The Company, as part of its non-linear business model, will continue to unlock value by broadening the investor base of its ventures.
- 5. The Company's investments aggregating Rs. 107,672.25 lacs and debts and other recoverable aggregating Rs. 7,713.93 lacs, as at September 30, 2011, in certain subsidiaries and a joint venture company, which presently have accumulated losses, but are expected to be recovered, and have their values unlocked in the near future, since these companies are already at various stages of executing their business plans and operations, with expected profitability. Accordingly, a provision for other than temporary diminution of Rs. 8,900.26 lacs (including Rs. 3,210.00 lacs provided during the year ended March 31, 2011) is considered to be adequate.
- 6. During the quarter ended September 30, 2011, the Company has made additional long term investments aggregating Rs. 11,207.83 lacs in subsidiaries

- 9. During the quarter ended June 30, 2011, the Company had raised USD 85 million (equivalent to Rs. 41,586.51 lacs as at September 30, 2011) by way of External Commercial Borrowings. As on September 30, 2011, USD 55.42 million (equivalent to Rs. 27,113.48 lacs) has been kept mainly in fixed deposits with banks pending utilisation.
