





Well known in the medical fraternity for his passion towards his profession, Dr. Rao started his entrepreneurial journey at "Mahavir Cardio Vascular Centre" in Hyderabad with 50 beds and performed heart surgeries at an unimaginable low cost of just Rs. 45,000 only. Dr. Rao never turned away any patient from the hospital for want of money.


The brand "Krishna Institute of Medical Sciences", under Dr. B. Bhaskar Rao's aegis began its journey in 2004 with a 300 bed hospital on par with the then established hospitals of Hyderabad in professional excellence, the state of art technology and infrastructure facilities.

Today KIMS is spread across Telangana, Andhra Pradesh, Maharashtra, Karnataka (Upcoming) and Kerala.

Dr. Bhaskar Rao was instrumental in formulating Rajiv Gandhi Aarogyasri scheme, first time launched in Andhra Pradesh in 2007 for providing health care to the poorest of the poor.





KIMS Saveera Hospital has successfully saved two patients, suffering from completely blocked coronary arteries due to heavy blood clot, which doesn't respond to traditional angioplasty and stenting. Both the patients arrived at the hospital after suffering with heart attack for more than 24 hours.

Using advanced and innovative technology, cardiologists at KIMS Saveera performed a groundbreaking procedure, marking the first-ever use of Penumbra CAT RX in Rayalaseema region.

Sharing the procedure details with the media here on Wednesday, Dr G Pradeep Krishna, Consultant Interventional Cardiologist at KIMS Saveera Hospital, explained that two male patients, both 45-yearold, from Guntakal and Tadipatri recently arrived at the hospital. One had a history of heavy smoking, while the other had a family history of heart disease. Their angiogram revealed that both patients had arteries due to heavy blood clots making conventional treatments with sub optimal results.

He said that they removed the clots with mechanical thrombectomy Penumbra CAT RX device, which completed cleared the clot in one patient. However, for the other patient, after clot removal, 70% blockage remained, which required stenting. Both patients have fully recovered and were discharged.

Dr G Pradeep Krishna said that this is the first time such a procedure has been used for coronary artery blockages with heavy clot burden in Rayalaseema region. Now, patients of Rayalaseema no longer need to go to other cities for such advanced cardiac care. They can now receive world-class treatment at KIMS Saveera Hospital with the expertise of our specialists, he added.

Docs remove 5 cm brain tumour in rare surgery




