Item No. 1 - Adoption of Financial Statements

To receive, consider and adopt the audited Balance sheet as on 31st March 2018, the Statement of Profit and Loss Account for the year ended 31st March 2018 together with the Schedules and Notes attached thereto, along with Auditors Report and Director's report thereon.

Item No. 2 - Appointment of a Director

To Appoint a Director in place of Mrs. Saramma Jerry Varghese (DIN 00012892), who retires by rotation and being eligible, offers herself for reappointment.

Item No. 3 - Appointment of Auditors

To consider and if thought fit to pass with or without modification(s) the following Resolution as an Ordinary Resolution:

"RESOLVED THAT pursuant to the provisions of Section 139, 140, 141, 142 and other applicable provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made there under, , M/s. Mehta Kothari & associates, Chartered Accountants (FRN 106247W)) be appointed as the Auditors of the Company, to hold office from the conclusion of 33rd Annual General Meeting till the conclusion of 36th Annual General Meeting of the Company, subject to ratification of the appointment by the members at every AGM in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 and the rules made thereunder and that the Board of Directors be and is hereby authorized to fix such remuneration as may be recommended by the Audit Committee in consultation with the Auditors and that such remuneration may be paid on a progressive billing basis to be agreed upon between the Board of Directors and the Auditors."

A company may give loan, guarantee, provide security or make investment in shares, debentures etc. exceeding the above limits with the prior approval of shareholders by means of a special resolution.

Accordingly, the Board of Directors of the Company proposes to seek approval of shareholders by way of special resolution to authorize the Board to exercise powers for an amount not exceeding Rs. 1000 crore (Rupees One Thousand Crore Only).

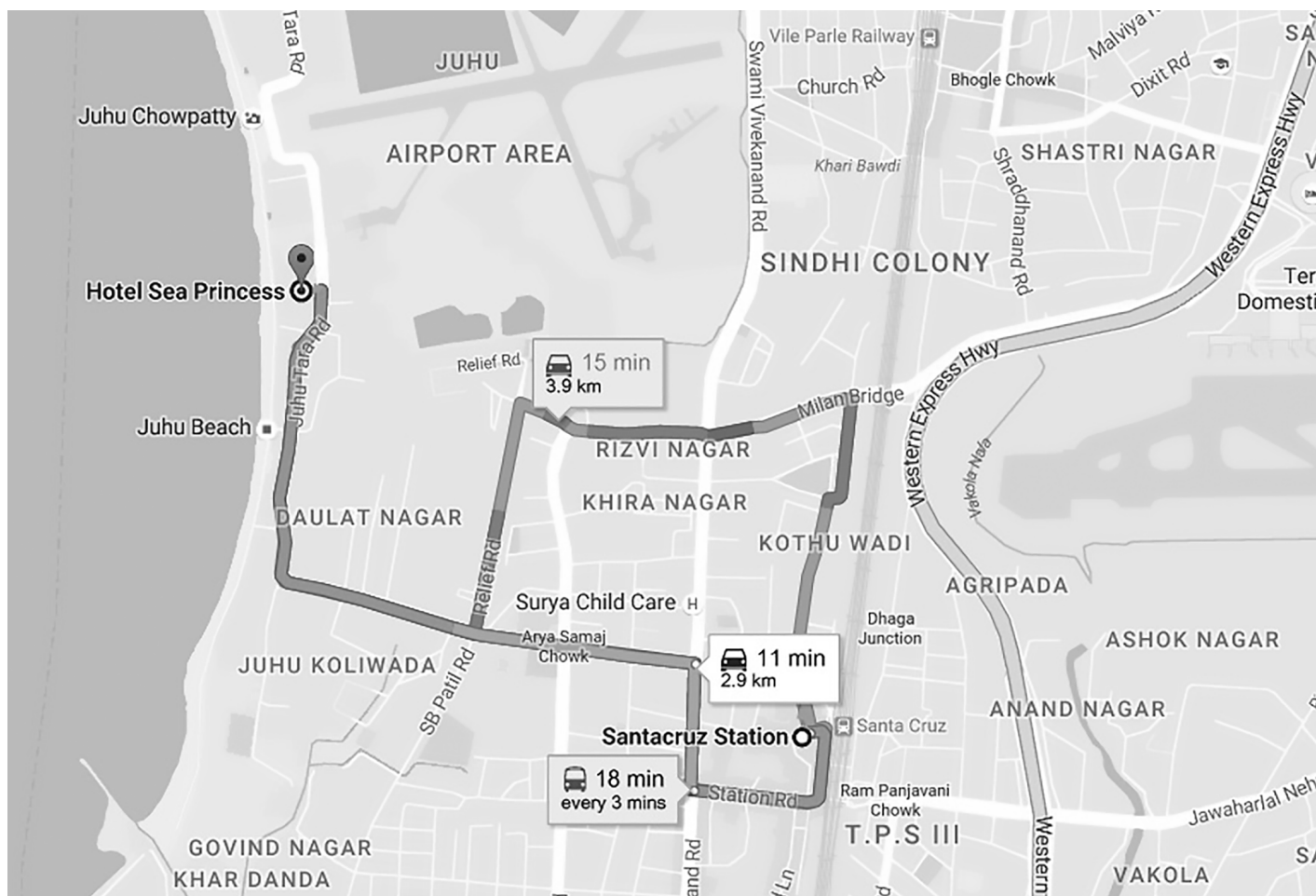

Based on my verification of the Company’s books, papers, minute books, forms and returns filed and other records maintained by the company and also the information provided by the Company, its officers, agents and authorized representatives during the conduct of secretarial audit, I hereby report that in my opinion, the Company has, during the audit period covering the financial year ended on 31st March, 2018 generally complied with the statutory provisions listed hereunder and also that the Company has proper Board-processes and compliance- mechanism in place to the extent, in the manner and subject to the reporting made hereinafter:

Management Discussion and Analysis Report

1. Industry Structure and Development and Outlook

As per report, India is the fastest developing country in the world. GDP growth in the year 2017-18 was at 6.5 %. India will be the third largest economy in the world 2050. In the infrastructure sector also India can be rated as the fastest growing economy in the world. The planning Commission in India has planned extensive expansion in roads, highways, ports, airports, powers etc. In Union budget 2018-19, massive push to infrastructure sector by allocating 5.97 lakhs crores for the sector.

2. Opportunities & Threats

Tarmat has been the pioneers in airport runway works and airside works. We have also been executing highways and roads.

The Govt. of India announced target of 50 Trillion (USD753.00 billion) investments in infrastructure sector period by 2022. The Planning Commission also has announced extensive push in this sector.

Infrastructure development has been one of the focus area of the Narendra Modi led NDA government. The Government of India has put thrust in the following areas:

Aviation infrastructure development, Railway infrastructure, Road infrastructure, Rural and urban development, Telecom, Real estate infrastructure. Defence infrastructure, etc.

Your Company has quite good number of projects in hands to be executed by 2020 valuing about 1000 crores.

However, Indian infra sector suffers from threat perspectives. The reason for which many institutional investors avoid participating in this sector is regulatory uncertainties among others. 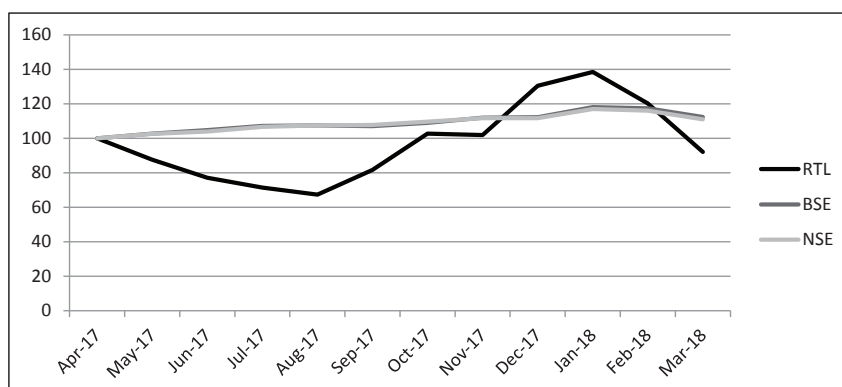

We have audited the accompanying standalone Ind AS financial statements of **TARMAT LIMITED** ("the Company"), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2018, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including others comprehensive income), the Cash Flow Statement and the statement of changes in equity for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Management's Responsibility for the Standalone IND As Financial Statements

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, except for the matters described in the paragraphs "Emphasis of Matter", the aforesaid standalone financial statements give the information required by the Act, in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31st March 2018 and its Profits and its cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to the following matters in the Notes to the financial statements

1. Note No 7 of the Financial Statements in respect of Short Term Borrowings –

- a) In the previous Financial year as on 31st march 2017, the Company was NPA as it had unpaid dues of Rs 74.435 crores (with interest) to Vijaya Bank, Rs 1.92 crores (with interest) to Kotak Mahindra bank and Rs 26.29 Lakhs (with interest) to SREI Finance Ltd. Because of this, the Company had not provided interest which in turn resulted in overstatement of net profit.
 - b) However, the Company paid Rs. 2.49 crores to Vijaya Bank and for the balance amount, the Company has arrived at a settlement with Vijaya Bank at Rs. 62.11 crores as full and final settlement. The settlement terms are as follows:-
 - i. Rs 5 crores within 31.3.2018
 - ii. Rs 10 crores within 04.04.2018
 - iii. Rs 17 crores within 15.04.2018
 - iv. Rs 30.11 crores within 15.05.2018.
 - c) The difference of Rs. 9.835 crores arising out of this settlement has been credited to the Profit Loss Statement resulting into overstatement of net profit. The Company has made payment of Rs. 5 crores on 31.03.2018.
 - d) Further the Company has settled the dues to Kotak Mahindra Bank and SREI Finance Ltd in full.
 - e) In absence of Balance confirmation and payment confirmation from Vijaya Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank and SREI Finance Ltd, the Company has given detailed Letter regarding Balance, Settlement and Payment confirmation covering all Banks and Financial institutions.
- 2) Note No 17 of the Financial Statements in respect of Cash and cash Balance

The Balances of Fixed Deposit with Vijaya Bank amounting to Rs 455.46 Lakhs and ICICI Bank Rs. 17.89 Lakhs and Balance with Bank in Current Accounts grouped under Cash and Cash Balances are not being confirmed by banks. Due to Non Availability of confirmation of aforesaid balances, we are unable to quantify the impact of the adjustments, if any, arising from reconciliation and settlement of account balances in the financial statements.

Our Opinion is not modified in respect of the matters mentioned above.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

1. As required by the Companies (Auditor's Report) Order, 2016 ("the Order") issued by the Central Government of India in terms of sub-section (11) of section 143 of the Act, we give in the "Annexure A" a statement on the matters specified in the paragraph 3 and 4 of the Order, to the extent applicable.
2. As required by Section 143 (3) of the Act, we report that:
 - (a) We have sought and obtained all the information and explanations which to the best of our knowledge and belief were necessary for the purposes of our audit.
 - (b) In our opinion, proper books of account as required by law have been kept by the Company so far as it appears from our examination of those books
 - (c) The Balance Sheet, the Statement of Profit and Loss, and the Cash Flow Statement dealt with by this Report are in agreement with the books of account
 - (d) In our opinion, the aforesaid standalone IND As financial statements comply with the Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act.
 - (e) On the basis of the written representations received from the directors as on 31st March, 2018 taken on record by the Board of Directors, none of the directors is disqualified as on 31st March, 2018 from being appointed as a director in terms of Section 164 (2) of the Act.

1. Corporate Information :

Tarmat Ltd. was established in the year 1986 by Mr. Jerry Varghese. The company is specialized in the construction of Airfield and National/State Highways all over India. The present works include construction of heavy duty parking bays at Bangalore International Airport, construction of airport runway, taxiway, apron, approach road, peripheral road etc at Gulbarga & Shimoga, recarpeting of Main Runway at Gwalior and Awantipur Airports, four laning project of Napgur-Hyderabad National Highway, construction of internal roads for Sai Sansthan Trust, Shirdi etc.

The company had its IPO in 2007 and got listed in BSE and NSE. The present paid up capital of the company is Rs. 109607070, of which 60.328% is held by the promoters.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS -

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (hereinafter referred to as the 'Ind AS') as notified by Ministry of Corporate Affairs pursuant to Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as applicable.

The financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2018 are the first financial statements prepared by the Company under Ind AS. For all periods upto and including the year ended 31st March, 2017, the Company prepared its financial statements in accordance with the accounting standards notified under the section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read together with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (hereinafter referred to as 'Previous GAAP') used for its statutory reporting requirement in India immediately before adopting Ind AS. The financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 and the opening Balance Sheet as at 1st April, 2016 have been restated in accordance with Ind AS for comparative information. Reconciliations and explanations of the effect of the transition from Previous GAAP to Ind AS on the Company's balance sheet, statement of profit and loss and statement of cash flows are provided in note 1.3 d.

The financial statement have been prepared on accrual and going concern basis. The accounting policies are applied consistently to all the periods presented in the financial statements, including the preparation of the opening Ind AS Balance Sheet as at 1st April, 2016 being the date of transition to Ind AS. All asset and liabilities have been classified as current or non current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria as set out in the Division II of Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. The Company considers 12 month as normal operating cycle.

The Company's financial statements are reported in Indian Rupees, which is also the company's functional currency and all values are rounded to the nearest lakh except otherwise indicated.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. System of Accounting

The Company follows mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on an accrual basis except in case of significant uncertainties. These financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise indicated.

b. Key accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements, in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles of Ind AS, requires the management to make estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income, expenses and disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of financial statements and the results of operation during the reported period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates which are recognized in the period in which they are determined.

The Company based its assumptions and estimates on parameters available when the financial statements were prepared. Existing circumstances and assumptions about future developments, however, may change due to market changes or circumstances arising that are beyond the control of the Company. Such changes are reflected in the financial statements in the period in which changes are made and if material, their effects are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

c. Property, Plant and Equipment

(i) Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost of acquisition including attributable interest and

finance cost, if any, till the date of acquisition/installation of the assets less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.

- (ii) Subsequent expenditure relating to property, plant and equipment is capitalized only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance costs are charged to the statement of profit and loss as incurred.
- (iii) The cost and related accumulated depreciation are eliminated from the financial statements, either on disposal or when retired from active use and the resultant gain or loss are recognized in the statement of profit and loss.
- (iv) Capital work-in-progress, representing expenditure incurred in respect of assets under development and not ready for their intended use, are carried at cost. Cost includes related acquisition expenses, construction cost, related borrowing cost and other direct expenditure.
- (v) On transition to Ind AS, the Company has opted to continue with the carrying values measured under the previous GAAP as at 1st April, 2016 of its property, plant and equipment and use that carrying value as the deemed cost of the property, plant and equipment on the date of transition i.e. 1st April, 2016.
- (vi) The Company depreciates property, plant and equipment on written down value method except for building, plant and machinery, laboratory equipment and excavators where depreciation is provided on straight line method over the estimated useful life prescribed in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013 from the date of the assets are ready for intended use after considering the residual value.
- (vii) Intangible assets mainly represent implementation cost for software and other application software acquired/ developed for in-house use. These assets are stated at cost. Cost includes related acquisition expenses, related borrowing costs, if any, and other direct expenditure.
- (viii) Items of stores and spares that meet the definition of property, plant and equipment are capitalized at cost and depreciated over their useful life. Otherwise, such items are classified as inventories.

Use of Estimate -

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affects the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialized.

Revenue Recognition -

- (i) Income from construction contracts is recognized on the basis of work certified in accordance with percentage completion method. All other income and expenditure are recognized and accounted for on an accrual basis. Losses on contracts are fully accounted for as and when incurred.
- (ii) Hire Charges is accounted for as per terms of the lease agreement.
- (iii) Dividend Income is accounted for when the right to receive is established.
- (iv) Interest income on deposits is recognized on accrual basis.

Fixed Assets -

Fixed Assets are stated at cost net of tax/duty credits availed, wherever applicable less accumulated depreciation/ impairment losses, if any. The cost of an asset comprises of purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to its present condition for intended use and incremental amount of revaluation.

Depreciation -

Depreciation is charged as per Straight-line method at the rate and in the manner specified in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation on fixed assets sold or scrapped during the year is provided upto the date on which such fixed asset is sold or scrapped. Depreciation on addition to fixed assets is calculated on pro rata basis from the day of addition.

Inventories -

The stock of stores, spares and embedded goods and fuel is valued at cost (weighted average basis), or net realizable value whichever is lower.

Work in Progress is valued at the contract rates and site mobilization expenditure of incomplete contracts is stated at cost.

Investment -

Investments which are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than one year from the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as Long Term Investments. Current Investments are carried in the financial statements at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long Term Investments are measured at Cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investment. Upon first-time adoption of Ind AS, the Company has elected to measure these investments of the Previous GAAP carrying amount as its deemed cost on the date of transition to Ind AS i.e. 1st April, 2017.

Borrowing Costs -

Borrowing cost which are directly attributable to the acquisition/construction of Qualifying Assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for intended use. All other borrowing cost is charged to revenue.

Current Tax and Deferred Tax -

- i. Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provision of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- ii. Current Tax is calculated in accordance with the tax laws applicable to the current financial year.
- iii. Deferred tax expense of benefit is recognized on timing difference being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.
- iv. Advance tax and provision for current income are presented in the balance sheet after setting off advance tax paid and income tax provision arising in the same tax jurisdiction.

Foreign Exchange Transaction -

- (i) Transaction denominated in foreign currencies is normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing at the time of the transaction.
- (ii) Monetary items denominated in foreign currency as at the balance sheet date are translated at the year-end exchange rate.
- (iii) Premium on forward cover contracts in respect of import of raw material is charged to profit & loss account over the period of contracts except in respect of liability for acquiring fixed assets, in which case the difference are adjusted in carrying cost of the same.

Employee Retirement Benefits -

The company provides for gratuity in accordance with the rules of the company based on an actuarial valuation carried out at the balance sheet date, by an independent actuary. Contribution payable to Employees benefits is charged to Profit & Loss Account as and when incurred. Leave wages is not applicable to this company. The Company has provided for gratuity during the current year as per the actuarial valuation of liability.

Impairment of Assets -

The company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an assets may be impaired.

If any such indication exists, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the assets. If such recoverable amount of the assets or the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belong is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. If at the balance sheet date there is an indication that if a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciated historical cost.

Earning per share -

Basic EPS is computed using the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

Provision, Contingent Liabilities and contingent assets -

Provision involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement is recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

First-time adoption of Ind AS

a. Transition to Ind AS

These are the Company's first financial statements prepared in accordance with Ind AS.

The accounting policies as set out in note no. 1.2 above have been applied in preparing the financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2018, the comparative information presented in these financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 and in the preparation of an opening Ind AS balance sheet as at 1st April, 2016 (the transition date). In preparing its opening Ind AS balance sheet, the Company has adjusted the amounts reported previously in the financial statements prepared in accordance with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (accounting standards) Rules, 2006 and other relevant provisions of the Act. An explanation of how transition from previous GAAP to Ind AS has affected the Company's financial position, financial performance and cash flows is set out in the following tables and notes.

b. Exemption and exceptions availed

Set out below are the applicable Ind AS 101 optional exemptions and mandatory exceptions applied in the transition from previous GAAP to Ind AS, which are considered to be material and significant.

- i] The Company has elected to measure items of property, plant and equipment at its previous GAAP carrying value as on the date of transition to Ind AS.
- ii] Ind AS provides a one time option to a first-time adopter either to measure its investment in subsidiaries, joint- ventures and associate companies as per previous GAAP carrying value or at fair value on the date of transition. The Company has elected to measure its investment in subsidiary as per previous GAAP carrying value as on the date of transition to Ind AS.
- iii] On assessment of the estimate made under the previous GAAP financial statements, the Company has concluded that there is no necessity to revise the estimates under Ind AS, as there is no objective evidence of an error in those statements. However, estimates that were required under Ind AS but not required under previous GAAP are made by the Company for the relevant reporting dates reflecting conditions existing as at that date.
- iv] Under Ind AS, remeasurements of post-employment benefit obligations, i.e. actuarial gains and losses and the return on plan assets, excluding amounts included in the net interest expenses on the net defined benefit liability are recognized in other comprehensive income instead of profit or loss. Under the Previous GAAP, these remeasurements were forming part of the statement of profit and loss for the year. There is no impact on the total equity.
- v] Under Ind AS, all items of income and expenses recognized in a period should be included in the statement of profit and loss for the period, unless a standard requires or permits otherwise. Items of income and expenses that are not recognized in profit or loss but are shown in the statement of profit and loss as 'other comprehensive income' includes remeasurements of defined benefit plans and tax effects thereon. The concept of other comprehensive income did not exist under the Previous GAAP.

Reconciliations between previous GAAP and Ind AS

The following reconciliations provide the explanations and quantification of the differences arising from the transition from previous GAAP to Ind AS in accordance with Ind AS 101:

- i) Reconciliation of equity as reported under previous GAAP to Ind AS;
- ii) Reconciliation of profit or loss and total comprehensive income as reported under previous GAAP to Ind AS; and adjustment to statement of cash flow.

Report on the Consolidated IND AS Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying consolidated IND AS financial statements of TARMAT LIMITED ("the Company") and its joint ventures (the Company and its joint ventures together referred to as the "the Group") which comprise the Consolidated Balance Sheet as at 31st March, 2018, the Consolidated Statement of Profit and Loss and the Consolidated Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of the significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as the "the consolidated financial statements").

Management's Responsibility for the Consolidated Financial Statements

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the matters stated in Section 134(5) of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") with respect to the preparation of these Consolidated IND AS financial statements that give a true and fair view of the consolidated financial position, consolidated financial performance and consolidated cash flows of the Group in accordance with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, including the Indian Accounting Standards specified under Section 133 of the Act, of the Companies (Indian Accounting standards). This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls, that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the financial statements that give a true and fair view and are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error; which have been used for the purpose of preparation of the consolidated IND AS financial statements by the Directors of the company as aforesaid.

Auditor's Responsibility

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these consolidated IND AS financial statements based on our audit. We have taken into account the provisions of the Act, the accounting and auditing standards and matters which are required to be included in the audit report under the provisions of the Act and the Rules made there under. We conducted our audit in accordance with the Standards on Auditing specified under Section 143(10) of the Act. Those Standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and the disclosures in the consolidated IND AS financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgment, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal financial control relevant to the Company's preparation of the consolidated financial statements that give a true and fair view in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on whether the Company has in place an adequate internal financial controls system over financial reporting and the operating effectiveness of such controls. An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of the accounting policies used and the reasonableness of the accounting estimates made by the Company's Directors, as well as evaluating the overall presentation of the consolidated IND AS financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion on the consolidated IND AS financial statements.

Opinion

In our opinion and to the best of our information and according to the explanation given to us, except for the matters described in the paragraphs "Emphasis of Matter", the aforesaid consolidated IND AS financial statements give the information required by the Act, in the manner so required and give a true and fair view in conformity with the accounting principles generally accepted in India, of the consolidated state of affairs of the Group as at 31st March 2018 and its Consolidated loss and its Consolidated cash flows for the year ended on that date.

Emphasis of Matter

We draw attention to the following matters in the Notes to the financial statements

1) Note No 7 of the Financial Statements in respect of Short Term Borrowings –

- a) In the previous Financial year as on 31st march 2017, the Company was NPA as it had unpaid dues of Rs 74.435 crores(with interest) to Vijaya Bank, Rs 1.92 crores(with interest) to Kotak Mahindra bank and Rs 26.29 Lakhs(with interest) to SREI Finance Ltd. Because of this, the Company had not provided interest which in turn resulted in overstatement of net profit.
- b) However, the Company paid Rs. 2.49 crores to Vijaya Bank and for the balance amount, the Company has arrived at a settlement with Vijaya Bank at Rs. 62.11 crores as full and final settlement. The settlement terms are as follows:-
 - i. Rs 5 crores within 31.3.2018
 - ii. Rs 10 crores within 04.04.2018
 - iii. Rs 17 crores within 15.04.2018
 - iv. Rs 30.11 crores within 15.05.2018.
- c) The difference of Rs. 9.835 crores arising out of this settlement has been credited to the Profit Loss Statement resulting into overstatement of net profit. The Company has made payment of Rs. 5 crores on 31.03.2018.
- d) Further the Company has settled the dues to Kotak Mahindra Bank and SREI Finance Ltd in full.
- e) In absence of Balance confirmation and payment confirmation from Vijaya Bank, Kotak Mahindra Bank and SREI Finance Ltd, the Company has given detailed Letter regarding Balance, Settlement and Payment confirmation covering all Banks and Financial institutions.

2) Note No 17 of the Financial Statements in respect of Cash and cash Balance

The Balances of Fixed Deposit with Vijaya Bank amounting to Rs 455.46 Lakhs and ICICI Bank Rs. 17.89 Lakhs and Balance with Bank in Current Accounts grouped under Cash and Cash Balances are not being confirmed by banks. Due to Non Availability of confirmation of aforesaid balances, we are unable to quantify the impact of the adjustments, if any, arising from reconciliation and settlement of account balances in the financial statements.

Our Opinion is not modified in respect of the matters mentioned above.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

As required by Section 143 (3) of the Act, we report to the extent applicable that:

In respect of this JV, the audited accounts are not available with the Company. The financial statements have been incorporated based on Un-audited financial statement/ data received from the company, in the absence of audited accounts of the JV, we are unable to comment on the adjustments that may be required to be made in these financial statement.

1. Corporate Information :

Tarmat Ltd. was established in the year 1986 by Mr. Jerry Varghese. The company is specialized in the construction of Airfield and National/State Highways all over India. The present works include construction of heavy duty parking bays at Bangalore International Airport, construction of airport runway, taxiway, apron, approach road, peripheral road etc at Gulbarga & Shimoga, recarpeting of Main Runway at Gwalior and Awantipur Airports, four laning project of Napgur-Hyderabad National Highway, construction of internal roads for Sai Sansthan Trust, Shirdi etc.

The company had its IPO in 2007 and got listed in BSE and NSE. The present paid up capital of the company is Rs. 109607070, of which 60.328% is held by the promoters.

2. SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

2.1 BASIS OF PREPARATION OF FINANCIAL STATEMENTS -

These financial statements have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (hereinafter referred to as the 'Ind AS') as notified by Ministry of Corporate Affairs pursuant to Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015, as applicable.

The financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2018 are the first financial statements prepared by the Company under Ind AS. For all periods upto and including the year ended 31st March, 2017, the Company prepared its financial statements in accordance with the accounting standards notified under the section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013, read together with Rule 7 of the Companies (Accounts) Rules, 2014 (hereinafter referred to as 'Previous GAAP') used for its statutory reporting requirement in India immediately before adopting Ind AS. The financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 and the opening Balance Sheet as at 1st April, 2016 have been restated in accordance with Ind AS for comparative information. Reconciliations and explanations of the effect of the transition from Previous GAAP to Ind AS on the Company's balance sheet, statement of profit and loss and statement of cash flows are provided in note 1.3 d.

The financial statement have been prepared on accrual and going concern basis. The accounting policies are applied consistently to all the periods presented in the financial statements, including the preparation of the opening Ind AS Balance Sheet as at 1st April, 2016 being the date of transition to Ind AS. All asset and liabilities have been classified as current or non current as per the Company's normal operating cycle and other criteria as set out in the Division II of Schedule III to the Companies Act, 2013. The Company considers 12 month as normal operating cycle.

The Company's financial statements are reported in Indian Rupees, which is also the company's functional currency and all values are rounded to the nearest lakh except otherwise indicated.

SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. System of Accounting

The Company follows mercantile system of accounting and recognizes income and expenditure on an accrual basis except in case of significant uncertainties. These financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention unless otherwise indicated.

b. Key accounting estimates

The preparation of the financial statements, in conformity with the recognition and measurement principles of Ind AS, requires the management to make estimates and assumptions in the application of accounting policies that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income, expenses and disclosure of contingent liabilities as at the date of financial statements and the results of operation during the reported period. Although these estimates are based upon management's best knowledge of current events and actions, actual results could differ from these estimates which are recognized in the period in which they are determined.

The Company based its assumptions and estimates on parameters available when the financial statements were prepared. Existing circumstances and assumptions about future developments, however, may change due to market changes or circumstances arising that are beyond the control of the Company. Such changes are reflected in the financial statements in the period in which changes are made and if material, their effects are disclosed in the notes to the financial statements.

c. Property, Plant and Equipment

1. Property, plant and equipment are stated at historical cost of acquisition including attributable interest and finance cost, if any, till the date of acquisition/installation of the assets less accumulated depreciation and accumulated impairment losses, if any.
2. Subsequent expenditure relating to property, plant and equipment is capitalized only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. All other repairs and maintenance costs are charged to the statement of profit and loss as incurred.
3. The cost and related accumulated depreciation are eliminated from the financial statements, either on disposal or when retired from active use and the resultant gain or loss are recognized in the statement of profit and loss.
4. Capital work-in-progress, representing expenditure incurred in respect of assets under development and not ready for their intended use, are carried at cost. Cost includes related acquisition expenses, construction cost, related borrowing cost and other direct expenditure.
5. On transition to Ind AS, the Company has opted to continue with the carrying values measured under the previous GAAP as at 1st April, 2016 of its property, plant and equipment and use that carrying value as the deemed cost of the property, plant and equipment on the date of transition i.e. 1st April, 2016.
6. The Company depreciates property, plant and equipment on written down value method except for building, plant and machinery, laboratory equipment and excavators where depreciation is provided on straight line method over the estimated useful life prescribed in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013 from the date of the assets are ready for intended use after considering the residual value.
7. Intangible assets mainly represent implementation cost for software and other application software acquired/developed for in-house use. These assets are stated at cost. Cost includes related acquisition expenses, related borrowing costs, if any, and other direct expenditure.
8. Items of stores and spares that meet the definition of property, plant and equipment are capitalized at cost and depreciated over their useful life. Otherwise, such items are classified as inventories.

2.2. Use of Estimate -

The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affects the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/ materialized.

2.3. Revenue Recognition -

1. Income from construction contracts is recognized on the basis of work certified in accordance with percentage completion method. All other income and expenditure are recognized and accounted for on an accrual basis. Losses on contracts are fully accounted for as and when incurred.
2. Hire Charges is accounted for as per terms of the lease agreement.
3. Dividend Income is accounted for when the right to receive is established.
4. Interest income on deposits is recognized on accrual basis.

2.4. Fixed Assets -

Fixed Assets are stated at cost net of tax/duty credits availed, wherever applicable less accumulated depreciation/impairment losses, if any. The cost of an asset comprises of purchase price and any directly attributable cost of bringing the assets to its present condition for intended use and incremental amount of revaluation.

2.5. Depreciation -

Depreciation is charged as per Straight-line method at the rate and in the manner specified in Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013. Depreciation on fixed assets sold or scrapped during the year is provided upto the date on which such fixed asset is sold or scrapped. Depreciation on addition to fixed assets is calculated on pro rata basis from the day of addition.

2.6. Inventories -

The stock of stores, spares and embedded goods and fuel is valued at cost (weighted average basis), or net realizable value whichever is lower.

Work in Progress is valued at the contract rates and site mobilization expenditure of incomplete contracts is stated at cost.

2.7. Investment -

Investments which are readily realizable and intended to be held for not more than one year from the date on which such investments are made, are classified as current investments. All other investments are classified as Long Term Investments. Current Investments are carried in the financial statements at lower of cost and fair value determined on an individual investment basis. Long Term Investments are measured at Cost. However, provision for diminution in value is made to recognize a decline other than temporary in the value of the investment. Upon first-time adoption of Ind AS, the Company has elected to measure these investments of the Previous GAAP carrying amount as its deemed cost on the date of transition to Ind AS i.e. 1st April, 2017.

2.8. Borrowing Costs -

Borrowing cost which are directly attributable to the acquisition/construction of Qualifying Assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes substantial period of time to get ready for intended use. All other borrowing cost is charged to revenue.

2.9. Current Tax and Deferred Tax -

- a) Provision for current tax is made after taking into consideration benefits admissible under the provision of the Income Tax Act, 1961.
- b) Current Tax is calculated in accordance with the tax laws applicable to the current financial year.
- c) Deferred tax expense of benefit is recognized on timing difference being the difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one period and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent periods. Deferred tax assets and liabilities are measured using the tax rates and tax laws that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the balance sheet date.
- d) Advance tax and provision for current income are presented in the balance sheet after setting off advance tax paid and income tax provision arising in the same tax jurisdiction.

2.10. Foreign Exchange Transaction -

1. Transaction denominated in foreign currencies is normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing at the time of the transaction.
2. Monetary items denominated in foreign currency as at the balance sheet date are translated at the year-end exchange rate.
3. Premium on forward cover contracts in respect of import of raw material is charged to profit & loss account over the period of contracts except in respect of liability for acquiring fixed assets, in which case the difference are adjusted in carrying cost of the same.

2.11. Employee Retirement Benefits -

The company provides for gratuity in accordance with the rules of the company based on an actuarial valuation carried out at the balance sheet date, by an independent actuary. Contribution payable to Employees benefits is charged to Profit & Loss Account as and when incurred. Leave wages is not applicable to this company. The Company has provided for gratuity during the current year as per the actuarial valuation of liability.

2.12. Impairment of Assets -

The company assesses at each balance sheet date whether there is any indication that an assets may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the company estimates the recoverable amount of the assets. If such recoverable amount of the assets or the recoverable amount of the cash generating unit to which the asset belong is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. If at the balance sheet date there is an indication that if a previously assessed impairment loss no longer exists, the recoverable amount is reassessed and the asset is reflected at the recoverable amount subject to a maximum of depreciated historical cost.

2.13. Earning per share -

Basic EPS is computed using the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

2.14. Provision, Contingent Liabilities and contingent assets -

Provision involving substantial degree of estimation in measurement is recognized when there is a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that there will be an outflow of resources. Contingent liabilities are not recognized but are disclosed in the notes. Contingent assets are neither recognized nor disclosed in the financial statements.

First-time adoption of Ind AS**a. Transition to Ind AS**

These are the Company's first financial statements prepared in accordance with Ind AS.

The accounting policies as set out in note no. 1.2 above have been applied in preparing the financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2018, the comparative information presented in these financial statements for the year ended 31st March, 2017 and in the preparation of an opening Ind AS balance sheet as at 1st April, 2016 (the transition date). In preparing its opening Ind AS balance sheet, the Company has adjusted the amounts reported previously in the financial statements prepared in accordance with the Accounting Standards notified under the Companies (accounting standards) Rules, 2006 and other relevant provisions of the Act. An explanation of how transition from previous GAAP to Ind AS has affected the Company's financial position, financial performance and cash flows is set out in the following tables and notes.

b. Exemption and exceptions availed

Set out below are the applicable Ind AS 101 optional exemptions and mandatory exceptions applied in the transition from previous GAAP to Ind AS, which are considered to be material and significant.

- i] The Company has elected to measure items of property, plant and equipment at its previous GAAP carrying value as on the date of transition to Ind AS.
- ii] Ind AS provides a one time option to a first-time adopter either to measure its investment in subsidiaries, joint- ventures and associate companies as per previous GAAP carrying value or at fair value on the date of transition. The Company has elected to measure its investment in subsidiary as per previous GAAP carrying value as on the date of transition to Ind AS.
- iii] On assessment of the estimate made under the previous GAAP financial statements, the Company has concluded that there is no necessity to revise the estimates under Ind AS, as there is no objective evidence of an error in those statements. However, estimates that were required under Ind AS but not required under previous GAAP are made by the Company for the relevant reporting dates reflecting conditions existing as at that date.
- iv] Under Ind AS, remeasurements of post-employment benefit obligations, i.e. actuarial gains and losses and the return on plan assets, excluding amounts included in the net interest expenses on the net defined benefit liability are recognized in other comprehensive income instead of profit or loss. Under the Previous GAAP, these remeasurements were forming part of the statement of profit and loss for the year. There is no impact on the total equity.
- v] Under Ind AS, all items of income and expenses recognized in a period should be included in the statement of profit and loss for the period, unless a standard requires or permits otherwise. Items of income and expenses that are not recognized in profit or loss but are shown in the statement of profit and loss as 'other comprehensive income' includes remeasurements of defined benefit plans and tax effects thereon. The concept of other comprehensive income did not exist under the Previous GAAP.
