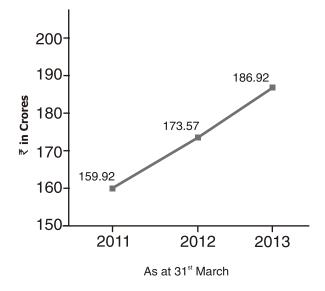

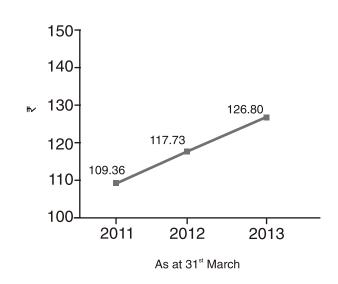

#### Dear Shareholders,

Your Directors are pleased to present the 37<sup>th</sup> Annual Report of the Company together with its Audited Accounts for the year ended 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013.

#### **OPERATIONS**

During the year, the production of Synthetic yarn increased to 301 lac Kgs, up by 8%; however, due to demand recession for worsted fabric, the worsted yarn production reduced by 27% in comparison to the year 2011-12. Production of garments increased by 17% to 25.55 lac pieces. During the year, the Company produced more of value added fabric and technical textiles. The production of fabric increased by 16% to 360 lac meters. The Company has started production of cotton yarn, cotton yarn dyed shirting and piece-dyed suiting fabric also.

During the year, the Company's net income from operations aggregated ₹1096 crores as against ₹924 crore in 2011-12-an increase of 19%. The Company's turnover in value terms has increased by 16% for yarn, by 20% for fabric and by 27% for garments. This confirms the Company's major thrust on value-added fabrics and the readymade garments.

During the year, the textile industry continued to face global recession but your company's profit before interest, depreciation and tax (PBIDT) for 2012-13 improved to ₹155 crore as against ₹136 crore in 2011-12. Similarly, the profit before depreciation and tax (PBDT) was higher at ₹73 crore as against previous year's ₹60 crore, mainly due to increased production and sales. However, inspite of better performance at PBT level, the net profit of Company at ₹12.07 crore during

2012-13 is lower than ₹14.89 crore achieved in the year 2011-12, mainly because of higher provision for tax liability.

The basic and diluted earnings per share works out to ₹8.14 for the year 2012-13 as against previous year's EPS at ₹10.06.

#### **EXPORTS**

During the year, the export turnover was at ₹599 crore was up by about 13% over ₹531 crore during 2011-12. The growth happened in all the 3 segments viz. yarn, fabric and garments.

During the year under report, the Company's marketing as well as design and development team continued to collect the feedback in the international market by participation in the international trade fairs, meetings with the customers, etc. The Company has added some more new customers Worldwide. Its design studio for fabric and garments helped the Company to penetrate in the new areas/customers, both domestically and internationally.

#### DIVIDEND

Your Directors are pleased to recommend dividend of ₹1.50 per equity share i.e. the same as for the previous year. The total dividend payout on Equity and Preference shares for the year will absorb ₹2.26 crore (previous year: ₹2.26 crore) besides ₹0.37 crore by way of tax on dividend. The Company has to make payment of 3% dividend on preference shares.

#### **INCREASE IN AUTHORIZED SHARE CAPITAL**

There has been no increase in equity and preference share capital during the year.

#### EXPANSION, DIVERSIFICATION AND MODERNIZATION

During the year, the Company has invested ₹79.50 crore for acquisition of fixed assets including the capital-work-in progress at ₹7.77 crores and advances aggregating ₹4.32 crore as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013 to the capital goods' suppliers. Capacity expansion has taken place in all the areas of operations. The worsted spinning capacity increased by 8256 spindles besides addition of 19 looms in weaving section, and one line each for trousers and jackets production in garment division. Similarly, in the fabric processing unit also, few more balancing machines viz. one mercerizing, 6 jet and jiggars, one calendar, and one sizing machine have been added.

The total production capacity of the Company as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013 for yarn production is 151672 ring spindles including 21120 spindles for worsted yarn spinning, 592 Air Jet spindles, 359 shuttle less looms, 32 Air Jet jacquard looms, 7 stenters with processing capacity of 5.0 million meters a month and 3.45 lac pieces of garments per month.

The Company has plans to invest about ₹20 crore for expansion and modernization of the plant during the year 2013-14. This would add 21 looms and balancing equipment. Under the plan, the Company has proposed to replace 1 stenter in finishing unit which will increase fabric finishing capacity by 4 lac meters a month.

#### **JOINT VENTURE**

The Company has two Joint Ventures with two French Companies i.e. Carreman and Treves S.A. The Company holds 50% share capital both in Carreman Fabrics India Limited and Treves Banswara Private Limited.

Carreman Fabrics India Limited has a Weaving Unit doing Fabric Production on job work basis for your Company. It has woven 54.76 lac meters during 2012-13 as against 62.77 lac meters during 2011-12. The production is low due to reduction in looms and lower utilization of available looms capacity.

Treves Banswara Private Limited manufactures Laminated, Knitted and Woven Textiles for internal furnishing of Trains, Buses and other Automobiles. 2012-13 was its first year of operation. The Company produced 1.52 lac meters laminated fabric and achieved turnover of ₹633 lac during the year.

#### THERMAL POWER PLANT

The Company's both units of Captive Thermal Power Plant (33 MW) are working satisfactorily. Your Company is consuming imported coal, Lignite, Petcoke and Indian coal. The power plant availability factor during the year 2012-13 was 97.70% as against 95.01% during 2011-12.

#### **FINANCE**

During the year 2012-13, the IDBI Bank Ltd. sanctioned Term Loans aggregating ₹19.20 crore (Disbursed so far-₹14.95 crore) to part finance the Company's expansion-cum-modernization project of ₹24.62 crore. The Export Import Bank of India and Bank of Baroda have also disbursed balance amounts of ₹7.60 crore and ₹7.15 crore out of their Term Loans of ₹29 crore and ₹44 crore respectively. The Company has also applied for another term loan of ₹16 crore from Bank of Baroda to part finance its proposed expansion-cum-modernization project of ₹20 crore.

The Company's bankers have provided the need-based increased working capital limits during the year.

#### **CONTRIBUTION TO EXCHEQUER**

During the year, your Company contributed ₹47.60 crore to the Government Exchequer by way of Excise Duty, Service Tax, Value Added Tax (VAT), Income Tax, Dividend Distribution Tax and other payments.

#### **SUBSIDIARY COMPANY**

The Company did not have any subsidiary as on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013. However, it has 50% stake in equity capital of Carreman Fabrics India Ltd. and Treves Banswara Pvt. Ltd., Joint Venture Companies with Carreman and Treves S.A., both of France.

# CORPORATE GOVERNANCE / MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION & ANALYSIS REPORT

As per Clause 49 of the Listing Agreements with the Stock

Exchanges, the Company has adopted a Code of Conduct which is applicable to the members of the Board and senior management. The Company fully complies with the Corporate Governance practices as enunciated in the Listing Agreements; Corporate Governance Report and Management Discussion & Analysis Report are annexed and marked Annexure-I, which form part of this report.

#### **FIXED DEPOSITS**

The Company has not issued any advertisement inviting fixed deposits from the public. However, it continues to accept deposits from public. As on 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013, the Company had such deposits aggregating ₹1249.60 lacs. Deposits which matured during the year were either renewed or repaid. All the interest and principal dues are being paid regularly. The Company has duly complied with the provisions of the Companies (Acceptance of Deposits) Rules, 1975.

#### **DIRECTORS**

In accordance with the provisions of Articles of Association of the Company, Shri P. Kumar, Shri P.K. Bhandari and Shri D.P. Garg are retiring by rotation and, being eligible, offer themselves for re-appointment.

#### **DIRECTORS' RESPONSIBILITY STATEMENT**

As required under Section 217(2AA) of the Companies Act, 1956, with respect to Directors' Responsibility Statement, it is hereby confirmed that:

- I. In the preparation of the annual accounts for the year ended March 31,2013, the applicable Accounting Standards have been followed and there are no material departures from the same. The Notes to the Accounts are self-explanatory.
- II. The Directors have selected such Accounting Policies and applied them consistently and made judgments and estimates, that are reasonable and prudent so as to give a true and fair view of the state of affairs of the Company as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013 and of the profit of the Company for the year ended on that date.
- III. The Directors have taken proper and sufficient care for the maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 1956, for safeguarding the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities.
- IV. The Directors have prepared the annual accounts of the Company for the year ended March 31, 2013 on a "going concern" basis.

#### **AUDIT COMMITTEE**

In accordance with the requirement of Clause 49 of the Listing Agreements with Stock Exchanges, the Board has constituted the Audit Committee which comprises 3 (three) Independent Directors viz. Shri P. Kumar (Chairman), Shri Kamal Kishore Kacholia and Shri S.B. Agarwal besides Shri Ravindra Kumar Toshniwal Managing Director as members.

The composition, role, functions and powers of the Audit Committee are in accordance with the applicable laws and the Listing Agreements with the Stock Exchanges.

#### **AUDITORS**

#### **Statutory Auditor**

Kalani & Company, Chartered Accountants, Jaipur, hold office as the Auditors of the Company until the conclusion of the ensuing Annual General Meeting and are eligible for reappointment. They have furnished a Certificate to the effect that the re-appointment, if made, would be within the limits prescribed under Section 224(1-B) of the Companies Act, 1956.

#### **Cost Auditor**

The Central Government has approved the appointment of K.G. Goyal & Company, Cost Auditors, for conducting Cost Audit for the financial Year 2012-13.

The Cost Audit Report for the year 2012-13 shall become due for filing on 27<sup>th</sup> September, 2013. The audit work is in progress.

The Company has appointed K.G. Goyal & Company, Cost Accountants, Jaipur, as Cost Auditors of the Company for the financial year 2013-14. They have furnished a Certificate to the effect that their appointment, if made, would be within the limits prescribed under Section 224(1-B) of the Companies Act, 1956.

#### **AUDITORS' REPORT**

As regards the Auditors' observations, the relevant Notes in Significant Accounting Policies, Notes on Accounts and other disclosures are self-explanatory and, therefore, do not call for any further comments, except in the matter of non payment of ₹27.05 lacs towards Service Tax and Cess thereon. The matter pertaining to service tax refunds taken by the Company are under appeal with CESTAT, New Delhi and Commissioner Appeal, Jaipur, Rajasthan.

These liabilities will be met, if necessary, on final decision of the respective Appellate Authorities.

### ANNEXURE-I TO THE DIRECTORS' REPORT

#### CORPORATE GOVERNANCE REPORT

"Corporate Governance" refers to the way a corporation is governed. It is the technique by which companies are directed and managed. The Corporate Governance structure specifies the distribution of the role and responsibilities of different participants in the organization, such as, the Board, managers, shareholders and other stakeholders. It also spells out the rules and procedures for decision making pertaining to corporate affairs. The Company adheres to good Corporate Governance practices and constantly endeavours to improve by adopting emerging best practices.

#### I. COMPANY'S PHILOSOPHY

The corporate governance model adopted by the Company consists of a set of rules and standards with the aim of establishing efficient and transparent operations within the Group, to protect the rights and interests of the Company's shareholders and to enhance shareholder value while complying with the provisions of law in all dealings with Government, customers, suppliers, employees and other stakeholders. It is also intended to ensure attractive returns to all stakeholders of the business based on the strong belief that sound Corporate Governance is the pre-requisite to success, sustainable growth and long-term value creation.

#### II. BOARD OF DIRECTORS

The 13 member Board of Directors of the Company comprises four whole-time directors viz. the Chairman, Managing Director, Vice Chairman and Joint Managing Director, all from the promoter group and nine Non-executive Independent Directors, including a Nominee Director of EXIM Bank. Thus, Independent Directors constitute more than 2/3rd of the Board's strength. The Non-executive Independent Directors are eminent professionals with vast experience in business, industry, finance and public enterprises. The Independent Directors are not related to the promoter-directors and or to each other. The Board provides leadership, strategic guidance, objective analysis and independent views to the Company's management while discharging its fiduciary responsibilities, thereby ensuring that the management adheres to high standards of ethics, transparency and accountability.

The Directors do not have any pecuniary relationship with the Company except to the extent of the following:

- (a) Managing /Whole-time Directors -
- Remuneration as per their terms of appointment and reimbursement of expenses actually incurred for the business of the Company, within the approved terms and conditions.
- (b) Non-Executive Independent Directors
- Reimbursement of expenses and payment of sitting fees for the Board/ Committee meetings attended by them.

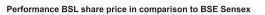

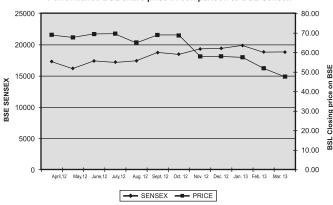

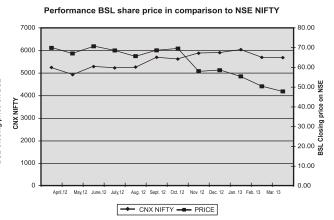

# MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS INTRODUCTION

Management Discussion and Analysis mainly comprises the statements which may, inter alia, involve predictions based on perceptions and may, therefore, be prone to risks and uncertainties. It is the sum total of the Company's expectations, beliefs, estimates and projections which may be forward looking within the meaning of applicable securities, laws and regulations. The actual results could differ materially from those expressed herein specifically or impliedly.

The important factors that could make a difference to the Company's operations include availability and cost of raw material, cyclical demand and pricing in the Company's principal markets, changes in Government regulations, tax regimes, economic developments within India and countries in which the Company conducts business, India's Free Trade Agreements with other countries, prevailing exchange rate of INR against other currencies, availability of skilled and unskilled workforce and other incidental factors. The shareholders are cautioned to keep this in view in conjunction with the Company's financial statements.

#### **CORE BUSINESS AND PRODUCTS**

The core business of the Company is manufacturing and marketing of spun synthetic blended yarn, cotton spun yarn, wool and wool mix yarn, spun synthetic and worsted fabrics, cotton & linen fabrics and readymade garments. The Company also produces shirting and technical fabrics. It has launched a brand "SaintX" for Fabrics, Made to Measure and Ready to Wear Garments about two years back. Besides Carreman, your Company has entered into another Joint Venture agreement with another French Company viz. Treves S.A., for production of automotive fabrics. The Company perceives good scope for increase in demand, production and sale of these products.

#### Industry Structure, its Development and Opportunity

The Indian textiles industry is one of the biggest employment generating industry in the country providing 55 million direct and indirect employment. It is also one of the leading sectors of Indian economy and contributes significantly to the country's industrial output (14%) and export earnings (17%).

During the year under review, the consumer demand has been sluggish across the textile and apparel sector, resulting in pressure on sales and margins. The textile industry is labour intensive; as the Central Government Scheme i.e. National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme, has provided more opportunities for workers, the availability of the requisite labour for running the plant has become very difficult.

Although there is some improvement in middle class population which is a source of great potential in the growth of industry; however, increases in wages, interest cost and power cost impact the revenues considerably.

#### Overview of the Company's performance

The overall performance of the Company has improved during 2012-13, as reflected in increase of the production of all products viz. yarn, fabrics and garments. During the year, yarn production increased by 8%, fabric production by 16% and the

garment production by 17%. The income from operations at ₹1096 crore during 2012-13 went up by 19% as compared to ₹924 crore in 2011-12. The export turnover represented 55% in the total turnover. Further details about the Company's operating performance are mentioned under Financial Review, Operations and Exports in the Directors' Report.

The Company has been undertaking continuous expansion and modernization of its production capacities. A comparative position of the Company's manufacturing capacities in the last 2 financial years is as under:-

During the year under review, the Company has invested ₹79.50 crore (previous year-₹82.64 crore) for acquisition of fixed assets besides the capital-work-in-progress at ₹7.77 crore (previous year ₹25.67 crore) and advances to capital goods' suppliers of ₹4.32 crore (previous year ₹7.76 crore) as at 31<sup>st</sup> March, 2013 for ongoing projects. Capacity expansion has taken place in all the areas of operations.

The Company has plans to invest about ₹20 crore for expansion and modernization of the plant during the year 2013-14. This would add 21 looms and balancing equipment. Under the plan, the Company is also replacing 1 stenter in finishing unit which will increase fabric finishing capacity by 4 lac meters a month.

#### Segment-wise performance

The Company is engaged in production of Textile products having integrated working. It is converting fibre to the ready-to-wear garments. For management purposes, the Company is organized into major operating activity of the textile products; besides this, it has power generation mainly for captive consumption as an auxiliary. The Company has no activity outside India except export of textile products manufactured in India. Thereby, there is no geographical segment and no segment wise information is reported.

#### Internal control system

The Company has adequate internal audit and control system to ensure that all the transactions are duly authorized, properly recorded and correctly reported. Internal control system consists of in-house audit by a team headed by an independent Chartered Accountant to carry out internal audits and create an in-built internal checking mechanism. In addition, the Company has also appointed an independent Chartered Accountant firms to carry out internal audit. The Company has Audit Committee of the Board, the composition and functions of which are furnished in the Corporate Governance Report as part of the Annual Report.

# Discussion on financial performance with respect to operating performance

The operating performance of the Company has been detailed in the first two paragraphs of the Directors' Report under the heads 'Financial Review' and 'Operations.' The profit before tax for the year 2012-13, at ₹21.09 crore, works out to 1.92% of sales as against ₹17.30 crore, i.e. 1.87% of sales in the previous Financial Year-2011-12.

#### Developments in human resources and industrial relations

During the year, the Company set up the Management Council to plan and review its operations on an on going basis. It is aimed at strengthening the company's Performance Management System (PMS) to bring about greater accountability amongst the SBUs and Units through a participatory process of annual planning and quarterly reviews. The business planning for FY 13-14 has been done on this basis.

The PMS system for each management staff is being implemented from FY 13-14. The Company's management is confident that this process will bring about substantial improvement in role clarity, goals and objectives of each manager thereby ensuring commitment to high performance by every managerial staff. This will also lead to improvement in the process of compensation reviews and rewards.

The Board has approved the Retirement policy for management staff which is being implemented. Manpower Plans for FY 13-14 has been finalized and talent and succession planning are being initiated so that right managerial staff are available to drive the Company's business during the year and beyond.

Manpower productivity is being improved by optimum deployment of staff and workmen through internal Manning monitoring. It is also proposed to deploy Industrial Engineering Services during the later part of the year to further rationalize manpower and further improve productivity.

The HR Council of senior management members has been formed and meetings are being held regularly to evolve HR policies, systems and processes and review actions taken on recommendations of the council.

The management is very hopeful that through these mechanism and reviews over the next couple of yearly cycles, HR Policy deployment will be significantly enhanced and contribute towards the Company's long term progress.

# SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES, NOTES ON ACCOUNTS AND OTHER DISCLOSURES NOTE NO. '1' SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

#### A. System of Accounting and Use of Estimates (AS-1)

The Company follows the mercantile system of accounting by following accrual concept in the preparation of accounts. The preparation of financial statements requires estimates and assumptions to be made that affect the reported amount of assets and liabilities on the date of the financial statements and the reported amount of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Difference between the actual results and estimates are recognized in the period in which the results are known/materialized.

#### B. Valuation of Inventories (AS-2)

Inventories are valued at lower cost and net realizable value. Cost is measured on First In First Out basis.

#### C. Depreciation (AS-6)

Depreciation on fixed assets is provided for on straight line method in accordance with the provisions of section 205(2)(b) of the Companies Act, 1956. Depreciation on additions/disposals during the year is provided on pro-rata basis.

Consequent to changes made in schedule XIV, vide Notification No. GSR 756E dated 16.12.93, the company had revised the rate of depreciation. The specified period had been recomputed as suggested by the Circular dated 20.12.93 except in case of petty assets like furniture, fixture and office equipment where it is difficult to effect the changes. While adopting the revised rates, the Spinning Plant has been categorized as "Continuous Process Plant" on the basis of technical opinion obtained by the company.

Value of leasehold land is amortized over the period of its lease.

#### D. Turnover (AS-9)

- i) Turnover is inclusive of excise duty, refund and other related realization but exclusive of value added tax charged.
- ii) Job income included in turnover is accounted for on delivery of finished goods inclusive of excise duty.

#### E. Benefits Receivable against Export and Its Obligation (AS-9)

Unutilized credits, entitlements under Duty Entitlements Pass Book (DEPB) schemes are accounted for in the year of export at market value.

#### F. Fixed Assets (AS-10)

Value of gross block of fixed assets represent cost of acquisition, net of eligible CENVAT Credit but inclusive of non-refundable taxes & duties, expenditure on installations, attributable pre-operative expenses including borrowing cost and other identifiable direct expenses incurred upto the date of commencement of commercial use of the assets.

However value of gross block of fixed assets acquired upto 31.03.1985 has been stated at revalued amount as on 31.03.1986.

#### G. Foreign Currency Transactions (AS-11)

- i) Transactions denominated in foreign currencies are normally recorded at the exchange rate prevailing on the day of the transactions.
- ii) Monitory items denominated in foreign currency at the year end and not covered by forward exchange contracts are translated at year end rates and those covered by forward contracts are translated at the rate ruling at the date of transactions as increased or decreased by the proportionate difference between the forward rate and exchange rate on the date of transactions such difference having been recognized over the life of the contract. Foreign exchange financial instruments in hand at the year end are valued at mark to market, recognized loss, if any, adopting principle of prudence.

Any income or expenses on account of exchange difference either on settlement or on translation is recognized in the statement of profit and loss.

#### H. Investments (AS-13)

Long term Investments are carried at cost. Whereas, current investments are carried at lower of cost and net realizable value. In case of long term investments, other than temporary diminution in the value of investment is provided for.

#### I. Employees' Benefits (AS-15)

- Short-term employee benefits are recognized as an expense at the undiscounted amount in the Statement of profit and loss for the year in which the related service is rendered.
- ii) Retirement and other long term employee benefits are recognized as an expense in the Statement of profit and loss for the year in which the employee has rendered services. The expense is recognized at the present value of the amount payable determined using actuarial valuation techniques. Actuarial gains and losses in respect of retirement and other long term benefits are charged to the Statement of profit and loss.



#### J. Borrowing Costs (AS-16)

Borrowing costs that are attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are capitalized as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that takes necessarily substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use. All other borrowing costs are charged to revenue.

#### K. Taxes on Income (AS-22)

Current tax is determined as the amount of tax payable to the Taxation Authorities in respect of taxable income for the year.

Deferred tax is recognized, subject to consideration of prudence, in respect of deferred tax assets, on timing differences being difference between taxable income and accounting income that originate in one year and are capable of reversal in one or more subsequent years.

In respect of unabsorbed depreciation / carry forward of losses under the tax laws, deferred tax assets are recognized only to the extent that there is virtual certainty that future taxable income will be available against which such deferred tax assets can be realized.

#### L. Provision for Doubtful Debts

15% is being provided each year on amount due over a period of 6 months.

#### A. CONSERVATION OF ENERGY:

## a) Energy Conservation measures taken. Lighting

During the year, additional 2 Nos.-415/380 volt step down transformers are fixed in lighting to increase the life of Fluorescent tubes and by fixing louvers around 1000 nos. to increase light on machines.

#### **Machines**

- Monitoring of compressed air leakages in Unit BSL and Unit BFL was carried out & leakages were attended resulting in saving of around ₹3.00 lacs per month
- 2) Continuous condition monitoring of electric motors of all the departments in Unit BSL & Unit BFL has resulted in 18% reduction of motors burning. The Company has replaced old motors with energy efficient motors, which has reduced break downs, resulting a saving of ₹1.50 lacs per annum.
- 3) Invertors were fixed in winter season on fans and pumps of H&V plants of Unit BSL, Unit BFL, Worsted Spinning and Thermal Power Plants resulting in saving of electrical energy of around ₹20 lacs.

## **Steam Energy Saving Machines**

- 1) A Heat recovery plant is installed in Thermal Power Plant costing ₹20 lacs to recover the heat of blowdown of Boilers of Thermal Plant, resulting saving of around ₹3.00 lacs per month.
- 2) Condensate of Fibre Dye House Machine is collected in an underground tank resulting in saving of around 2.5 lac litre water and raising of 8°c feed water temp. in machine.
- Recycling of water from Mazera machine and Jet Dying machine in Unit BTM resulting in saving of 5 lac litre water/ day.
- b) Additional investment and proposal to be implemented for reduction of consumption of energy.

For saving in steam energy in Unit BTM and Dye House, installations of heat recovery units is proposed to be acquired from M/s Forbes Marshal P. Ltd. Pune, which will result in saving steam of around ₹ 100 lacs/annum; the project cost will be around ₹ 150 lacs.

 Impact of the measures at (a) and (b) above for reduction of energy consumption and consequent impact on the cost of production of goods.

All these measures are money saving devices for the Company, which ultimately, will go to reduce the cost of production of the Company. d) Total energy consumption and energy consumption per unit of production in respect of Industries specified in the schedule thereto.

 Benefits derived as a result of the above efforts, e.g. product improvement, cost reduction, production development, import substitution etc.

The Company was earlier depending on out side Yarn Dyer for texturised filament yarn dyeing. The introduction and increasing the capacity of cotton / texturised filament yarn dyeing facility at Banswara has enabled Company to reduce the lead time. Now, it can deliver its products to the customers in about 15 days. The cost of dyeing is comparatively less as the Dye House at Banswara is consuming bleed steam from the captive Thermal Power Plant. The Company has cut some of the production processes and yet maintained the same quality standard. The Company has also developed special yarns in-house which are used for fabric designing. It is a part of import substitution endeavour.

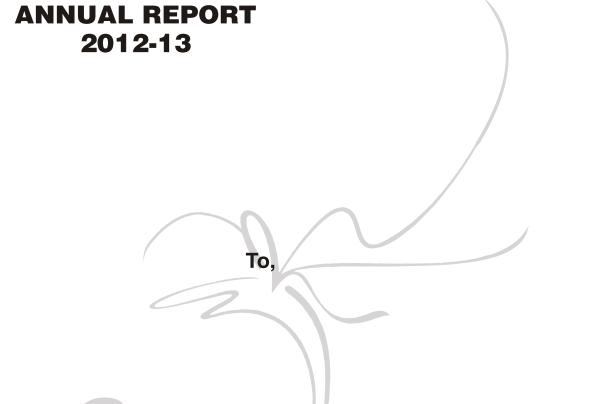
