The Ministry of Corporate Affairs (the MCA) has, vide its circular dated 5th May, 2022 read with circulars dated 5th May, 2020, 8th April, 2020 and 13th April . 2020 (collectively referred to as the MCA Circulars), and the Securities and Exchange Board of India (SEBI' vide its circular no. SEBI/ HO/ CFD/ CMD2/ CIR/P/2022/62 dated 13th May, 2022, read with circular no. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD1/CIR/P/ 2020/79 dated 12th May. 2020 in relation to 'Additional relaxation in relation to compliance with certain provisions of SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 -Covid-19 pandemic' (the SEBI Circulars) permitted the holding of the Annual General Meeting (AGM/the Meeting) through VC/OAVM, without the physical presence of the Members at a common

- venue upto 31st December, 2022. In compliance with the said provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 (Act), SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (SEBI Listing Regulations), MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars, the AGM of the Company is being held through VC/OAVM.
- 2. In view of the above mentioned MCA and SEBI Circulars, no proxy shall be appointed by the Members and accordingly the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not annexed to this Notice. However, the Corporate Members (other than Individuals, HUF, NRI etc.) intending to authorize their representatives are requested to send duly certified copy of the Board Resolution alongwith attested specimen signature(s) of the duly authorized signatory (ies) who are authorized to

participate in the AGM through VC and to vote through remote e-voting to the Scrutinizer by e-mail to fcsravisharma@gmail.com with a copy marked to evoting@nsdl.co.in. Members attending the AGM through VC / OAVM shall be counted for the purpose of reckoning the quorum under Section 103 of the Act

- 3. The details under Regulation 36(3) of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 (the Listing Regulations) and Secretarial Standards in respect of the Directors seeking appointment/re-appointment at the Twenty-Fourth Annual General Meeting (the AGM), forms integral part of the Notice. The Directors have furnished the requisite declarations for their re-appointment.
- 4. Since the AGM will be held through VC / OAVM, the Route Map is not annexed to this Notice.

5. Book Closure

The Register of Members and Share Transfer Books of the Company will be closed **Wednesday**, **the 27th July, 2022 to Tuesday, the 2nd August, 2022** (both days inclusive) for the purpose of the Twenty Fourth Annual General Meeting (the AGM) or any adjournment thereof.

- 6. The Register of Directors and Key Managerial Personnel and their shareholding, maintained under Section 170 of the Act and the Register of Contracts or Arrangements in which the directors are interested, maintained under Section 189 of the Act, will be available for inspection in the electronic form (scanned copy) by the Members during the AGM. Members who wish to inspect such documents can send their request to the Company to mills@simplex-group.com
- 7. As per the provisions of Section 72 of the Act, the facility for making nomination is available for the Members in respect of the shares held by them. Members who have not yet registered their nomination are requested to register the same by submitting Form No. SH-13. If a Member desires to opt out or cancel the earlier nomination and record a fresh nomination, he/she may submit the same in Form ISR-3 or Form SH-14 as the case may be.The said form can be downloaded from the Company's website. Members are requested to submit the said details to their DP in case the shares are held by them in electronic form or to Share Transfer Agent (STA) in case the shares are held in physical form.

8. The format of the Register of Members prescribed by the MCA under the Act, requires the Company/STA to record additional details of Members, including their PAN details, email address, bank details for payment of dividend, etc. This request should be submitted in Form ISR-1, which is appended at the end of this Annual Report. Members holding shares in physical form are requested to submit the filled in form to the Company or its Share Transfer Agent. Members holding shares in electronic form are requested to submit the details to their respective Depository Participants.

9. Updation of PAN and other details

The SEBI, vide its circular dated 3rd November, 2021 and 14th December, 2021 has mandated furnishing of PAN, KYC details (i.e., Postal Address with Pin Code, email address, mobile number, bank account details) and nomination details, by the holders of physical securities through Form ISR-1. It may be noted that any service request or complaint can be proceed only after the folio is KYC compliants.

Accordingly, the Company has sent individual letters to all the Members holding shares of the Company in physical form for furnishing their PAN, KYC and Nomination details. Relevant details and forms prescribed by SEBI to give effect to the aforesaid circular are available on the Company's website.

- 10. To support the "Green Initiative", Members who have not registered their email addresses are requested to register the same with the Company's STA / their Depository Participants, in respect of shares held in physical/ electronic mode respectively. An electronic copy of the Annual Report for the year 2021-22 along with the Notice are being sent to all those Members whose e-mail addresses are registered with the Company / Depositary Participant(s). Members may also note that the Notice of the AGM and the Annual Report are available on the Company's website at www.simplex-group.com.
- 11. In accordance with Regulation 40 of the SEBI Listing Regulations, as amended, the Company has stopped accepting any fresh transfer requests for securities held in physical form. Members holding shares of the Company in physical form are requested to kindly get their shares converted into demat / electronic form to get inherent benefits of dematerialisation.



Further, Members may please note that SEBI vide its Circular dated 25th January, 2022 mandated listed companies to issue securities in demat form only while processing any service requests viz. issue of duplicate securities certificate; claim from Unclaimed Suspense Account; renewal/exchange of securities certificate; endorsement; subdivision/splitting of securities certificate; consolidation of securities certificates/folios; transmission and transposition. 12. Voting through Electronic means

I In compliance with provisions of Section 108 of the Act read with Rule 20 of the Companies (Management and Administration) Rules, 2014 and the SEBI Listing Regulations, as amended from time to time the Company is pleased to provide the Members facility of 'remote e-voting' (e-voting from a place other than venue of the AGM) to exercise their right to vote at the AGM. The business may be transacted through e-voting Services provided by National Securities Depository Limited (NSDL).

The facility for voting, through electronic voting system shall also be made available during the AGM. The Members attending the meeting, through VC/OAVM facility and who have not already cast their vote through remote e-voting shall be eligible to vote through e-voting system in the AGM. The Members who have already cast their vote through remote e-voting may attend the meeting but shall not be entitled to cast their vote again at the AGM.

The instructions for Members voting electronically are as under

(i) The voting period begins on Saturday, the 30th July, 2022 from 9.00 A.M. and ends on Monday, the 1st August, 2022 at 5.00 P.M. The remote e-voting module shall be disabled by NSDL for voting thereafter. The Members, whose names appear in the Register of Members / Beneficial Owners as on the record date (cut-off date) i.e. Tuesday, the 26th July, 2022, may cast their vote electronically. (ii) Any person, holding shares in physical form and non-individual shareholders, who acquires shares of the Company and becomes a Member of the Company after sending of the Notice and holding shares as of the cut-off date, may obtain the login ID and password by sending a request at evoting@nsdl.co.in. However, if he/she is already registered with NSDL for remote e-voting then he/she can use his/her existing User ID and password for casting the vote. - e. Upon confirmation, the message "Vote cast successfully" will be displayed.
- f. You can also take the printout of the votes cast by you by clicking on the print option on the confirmation page.
- g. Once you confirm your vote on the resolution, you will not be allowed to modify your vote.

MANAGEMENT DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENTS

Indian Economy

The last two years have been difficult for the Indian as well as world economy on account of the COVID-19 pandemic. With the vaccination programme having covered the bulk of the India's population, economic momentum is building back and the likely long-term benefits of supply-side reforms in the pipeline, the Indian economy is in a good position to witness GDP growth of 8.0-8.5 per cent in 2022-23. The Asian Development Bank (ADB) forecasts India's GDP growth to moderate to 7.5% in 2022-23 from an estimated 8.9% in 2021-22, but will pick up to reach 8% in 2023-2024.

As per Federation of Indian Chambers of Commerce and Industry (FICCI) economic outlook survey India's gross domestic product growth is forecast to expand at 7.4 per cent in the current fiscal year ending in March 2023, with the risk tilted more to the downside from the escalating Russia-Ukraine war.

Indian Textile Industry

The textile and apparel industry is one of the leading segments of the Indian economy and the largest source of foreign exchange earnings for India. The textile industry has been a major part of our economy for decades. It is a sector that accounts for 14% of the total industrial production. The textile industry caters to one of the most basic and regular needs of mankind. It maintains its growth by providing humanity with improved quality of life. This industry is very incomparably self-reliant. Over the years it has proven to be one of the heaviest contributors to a nation's economy. The textile industry has gone through phenomenal growth in recent times. This has earned it quite an amount of attention from foreign countries. It has a direct impact in India's economy improvement which will increase in the future markets. On the other hand, the textile industry also face several challenges due to several factors. A recent study reveals that Indian textile sectors will take economy to new height in the future markets. Moreover, it will shape the economy effectively with high success rates. The textile industries have large diversified segments which enable businesses to choose a wide range of products accordingly. There are several factors which determine the success of garment industries in India. Some of them include cheap labour costs, skilled manpower, availability of raw materials, product development, and diversification. Growing economy is also another factor that contributes more to the growth of garment industries in India. Another advantage is that the potential local and international markets make textile sectors to perform well with high success rates. Apart from that, new innovations and technologies also transformed the garment industries that made them to improve their productivity levels.

OUTLOOK. OPPORTUNITIES AND THREATS

The post-Covid era has provided a big opportunity for the online textile industry. The sales in the online textile industry witnessed a jump in various cities and states of India due to the lockdown that was imposed to curb the spread of corona virus.

It goes without saying that cloth is one of the basic needs and requirements after food. It is nothing less than any essential commodity, and that's why even during lockdown online textile industry witnessed a boom in sales. Lockdown failed to leave any negative impact on the online textile industry because of its operations in the virtual space leaving no room for human or physical contact to further spread Covid-19 pandemic in the country. The online textile industry even registered an increasing trend in sales due to no dependency on the offline industry for example wholesalers, semi-wholesalers, retailers, middle persons, etc.

Moreover, technology can play the role of big brother in reviving, rejuvenating and reinvigorating the Indian textile industry. Undoubtedly, technology support is vital to any sector but when it comes to textile, it becomes even more important due to the integral role of machines right from sourcing raw material to giving final shape to the products that eventually consumers are going to get. Further, the Indian textile industry is expected to witness some new trends in the future - increased demand for natural fibers, shifting focus towards non-woven fabrics to name a few.

The domestic textile industry, which had seen demand slump in fiscal 2021 owing to onset of the Covid-19 pandemic, is firmly on course to recover in fiscal 2022 on the back of reopening of businesses, educational institutions and retail outlets with increase in the vaccinated population. Sanctions on Chinese textiles have boosted Indian textile exports as well.

The textile industry of India also undergoes certain challenges. The frequently changing policies stated by the government at the central and state levels create immense pressure on the textile industry. The GST applied on the products make the garments and clothes even more expensive.

Another challenge that the textile industry faces is the limitation to access the latest and best technology while also failing to meet the global standards in the competitive export market. Apart from this, issues like child labour, competition from neighboring countries regarding low-cost garments, personal safety norms are some of the challenges the Indian textile industry faces.

In order to achieve sustainable growth, modernization, value addition, increase in exports and for overall



development of the textile sector in the country, the Government has been implementing various policy initiatives and schemes such as the Technology Upgradation Fund Scheme (TUFS), Schemes for the development of the Powerloom Sector, Schemes for Technical Textiles, Scheme for Integrated Textile Parks (SITP), Integrated Skill Development Scheme(ISDS), Integrated Processing Development Scheme (IPDS), National Handloom Development Programme (NHDP), Comprehensive Handloom Cluster Development Scheme (CHCDS), Handloom Weavers Comprehensive Welfare Scheme, Yarn Supply Scheme etc. and to provide assistance for modernization of textile industry in the country. Further, the Government has also recently launched special package for employment generation and promotion of exports in Textile and Apparel sector.

The future for the Indian textile industry looks promising, buoyed by both strong domestic consumption as well as export demand. With consumerism and disposable income on the rise, the retail sector has experienced a rapid growth in the past decade with the entry of several international players like Marks & Spencer, Guess and Next into the Indian market.

High economic growth has resulted in higher disposable income. This has led to rise in demand for products creating a huge domestic market.

RISKS AND CONCERNS

In today's challenging and competitive environment, risks are inherent in all businesses. The Company's risk management strategy encompasses the proper and indepth identification, assessment and prioritization of risks, followed by speedy mobilization of resources to minimize, monitor and control the probability of unfortunate events.

The common risks, inter alia, are Regulations, Competitions, Business risks which includes financial risk, Technology Obsolescence, Retention of talent etc.

INTERNAL CONTROL SYSTEM AND ADEQUACY

The Company has proper and adequate system of internal control system to ensure maintenance of proper accounting records, their accuracy and that all the assets are safeguarded from loss or damages.

FINANCIAL AND OPERATING PERFORMANCE

During the year under review, the Company has reported total income of \ref{total} 6,195.45 thousands as compared to \ref{total} 7,212.69 thousands in the previous year. The Company has registered a net profit of \ref{total} 7,004.83 thousands as against a net profit of \ref{total} 1,802.58 thousands in the previous year.



Report on the audit of the Standalone Financial Statements

Opinion

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of **Simplex Mills Company Limited** ('the Company'), which comprise the Balance Sheet as at 31st March 2022, the Statement of Profit and Loss (including Other Comprehensive Income), the Statement of Changes in Equity and the Cash Flow Statement for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information (hereinafter referred to as "the standalone financial statements").

The impact of COVID-19 on the Company's Financial Statements may differ from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial statements.

Our opinion is not modified in respect of the aforesaid matter.

Key Audit Matters

Key audit matters are those matters that, in our professional judgment, were of most significance in our audit of the financial statements of the current period. These matters were addressed in the context of our audit of the financial statements as a whole, and in forming our opinion thereon, and we do not provide a separate opinion on these matters.

We have determined that there are no key audit matters to communicate in our report.

Information Other than the Standalone Financial Statements and Auditor's Report Thereon

The Company's Board of Directors is responsible for the preparation of the other information. The other information comprises the information included in the Management Discussion and Analysis, Board's Report including Annexures to Board's Report, Corporate Governance and Shareholder's Information, but does not include the standalone financial statements and our auditor's report thereon.

CORPORATE INFORMATION

Simplex Mills Company Limited ("the Company") is a public limited company, incorporated and domiciled in India having its registered office at Village Shivni, Taluka and District, Akola-444104, Maharashtra, India. The equity shares of the Company are listed on BSE Limited. The Company is in trading of textile products (i.e. cloths and fabrics).

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

(i) Basis of Preparation:

The financial statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) notified under Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the Act") [Companies (Indian Accounting Standards) Rules, 2015] and other relevant provisions of the Act. The financial statements have been prepared on the historical cost basis except for certain financial assets and liabilities, which are measured at fair value.

(ii) Current and Non-Current Classification:

The operating cycle is the time between the procurement of goods i.e. raw material or traded goods and their realization in cash and cash equivalent. All assets and liabilities have been classified into current and non-current based on a period of twelve months.

(iii) Fair Value Measurement:

The Company's accounting policies and disclosures require the measurement of fair values for financial instruments.

The Company uses valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, maximizing the use of relevant observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs.

All assets and liabilities for which fair value is measured or disclosed in the separate financial statements are categorized within the fair value hierarchy, described as follows, based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole:

- Level 1- Quoted prices (unadjusted) in active market for identical assets or liabilities.
- Level 2- Inputs other than the quoted prices included within Level 1 that are observable for the asset or liability, either directly or indirectly.
- Level 3- Inputs based on unobservable market data.

(iv) Revenue Recognition:

Revenue is measured at the fair value of consideration received or receivable, excluding Goods and Services Tax (GST).

Revenue from sale of goods is recognized when the control over goods is transferred to the buyer and no significant uncertainty exists regarding collectability of the amount of consideration that is derived from the sale of goods. Payment is generally received either in cash or based on credit terms. The normal credit term is 1-60 days which is generally in line with the industry standards.

(v) Property, Plant and Equipment:

Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment, if any. The cost of property, plant and equipment includes purchase price, including freight, duties, taxes and expenses incidental to acquisition and installation. If significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, then they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment. Property, plant and equipment are derecognized from financial statements, either on disposal or when no economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The gain or losses arising from disposal of property, plant and equipment are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss in the year of occurrence.



Subsequent expenditures

Subsequent expenditures related to an item of property, plant and equipment are added to its carrying value only when it is probable that the future economic benefits from the asset will flow to the Company and cost can be reliably measured. All other repair and maintenance costs are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss during the year in which they are incurred.

Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on all property, plant and equipment (excluding furniture and office equipments) on straight-line method and on furniture and office equipment's on the written down value method on pro-rata basis over the useful lives of the assets as prescribed in the Schedule II to the Companies Act, 2013.

(vi) Impairment of Non-Financial Assets:

The Company assesses at each Balance Sheet date whether there is any indication that an asset may be impaired. If any such indication exists, the Company estimates the recoverable amount of the asset. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's or cash generating unit's (CGU) fair value less costs of disposal and its value in use. Value in use is the present value of estimated future cash flows expected to arise from the continuing use of an asset and from its disposal at the end of its useful life. If such recoverable amount of the asset or cash generating unit is less than its carrying amount, the carrying amount is reduced to its recoverable amount. The reduction is treated as an impairment loss and is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss. If at the Balance Sheet date there is any indication that any impairment loss recognized for an asset in prior years may no longer exist or may have decreased, the recoverable amount is reassessed and such reversal of impairment loss is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss, to the extent the amount was previously charged to the Statement of Profit and Loss.

(vii) Financial instruments:

A financial instrument is any contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity instrument of another entity. Financial assets and financial liabilities are recognized when the Company becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instruments.

Financial Assets

Initial recognition and measurement

The Company recognizes financial assets when it becomes a party to the contractual provisions of the instrument. All financial assets are recognized initially at fair value plus transaction costs that are directly attributable to the acquisition of the financial asset.

Subsequent measurement

For the purpose of subsequent measurement, the financial assets are classified as under:

i) Financial assets at fair value through other comprehensive income (FVTOCI)

Financial assets are classified as FVTOCI, if both the following conditions are met:

 These assets are held within a business model whose objective is achieved both by collecting contractual cash flows and selling the financial assets; and

Contractual terms of the asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are solely payments
of principal and interest (SPPI) on the principal amount outstanding

Fair value movements are recognised in the other comprehensive income (OCI), except for the recognition of impairment gains or losses, interest income and foreign exchange gains or losses which are recognised in profit and loss. When the financial asset is derecognised, the cumulative gain or loss previously recognised in OCI is reclassified from equity to other income in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

ii) Financial assets at fair value through profit or loss (FVTPL)

Financial assets that do not meet the criteria for amortized cost or FVTOCI are measured at fair value through profit or loss. Gain/losses are recognized in the Profit and Loss.

Impairment of financial assets

The Company applies 'simplified approach' of measurement and recognition of impairment loss on financial assets that are loans, deposits and trade receivables.

The application of simplified approach does not require the company to track changes in credit risk. Rather, it recognizes impairment loss allowance based on lifetime Expected Credit Loss at each reporting date, right from its initial recognition.

De-recognition

A financial asset is derecognized when:

- the rights to receive cash flows from the assets have expired or
- · the Company has transferred substantially all the risk and rewards of the asset, or
- the Company has neither transferred nor retained substantially all the risk and rewards of the asset, but has transferred control of the asset.

Financial Liabilities

Initial recognition and measurement

All financial liabilities are recognized initially at fair value and, in the case of loans and borrowings and payables, net of directly attributable transaction cost.

Subsequent measurement

Financial liabilities are subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest rate method. For trade and other payables maturing within operating cycle, the carrying amounts approximate the fair value due to short maturity of these instruments.

Loans and borrowings

After initial recognition, interest bearing loans and borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost using Effective Interest Rate (EIR) method. Gain and losses are recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss when the liabilities are derecognized.

Amortised cost is calculated by taking into account any discount or premium on acquisition and transaction costs. The EIR amortization is included as finance costs in the Statement of Profit and Loss.

Derecognition

The Company derecognizes financial liabilities when, and only when, the Company's obligations are discharged, cancelled or have expired. When an existing financial liability is replaced by another from the same lender on substantially different terms, or the terms of an existing liability are modified, such an exchange or modification is treated as the derecognition of the original liability and the recognition of a new liability.



· Offsetting financial instruments

Financial Assets and Liabilities are offset and the net amount is reflected in the balance sheet when there is legally enforceable right to offset the recognized amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis, to realize the assets and settle the liabilities simultaneously.

(viii) Inventories:

Traded goods are valued at cost or market rate, whichever is lower. Finished product is valued at cost or market rate whichever is lower. Stores and spare parts are valued at cost.

(ix) Taxes:

Income tax expense comprises current and deferred tax. It is recognized in the Statement of Profit and Loss except to the extent that it relates to items recognized directly in equity or in OCI.

i. Current Tax

Current tax comprises the expected tax payable or receivable on the taxable income or loss for the year and any adjustment to the tax payable or receivable in respect of previous years. It is measured using tax rates enacted or substantially enacted at the reporting date.

Current tax assets and current tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off the recognized amounts and there is an intention to settle the asset and the liability on a net basis.

ii. Deferred Tax

Deferred tax is recognized on temporary differences between the carrying amounts of assets and liabilities for financial reporting purpose and the amount used for taxation purposes.

Deferred tax assets are recognized for unused tax losses, unused tax credits and deductible differences to the extent that it is probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be used. Deferred tax assets are reviewed at each reporting date and are reduced to the extent that it is no longer probable that sufficient taxable profit will be available to allow all or part of the asset to be recovered.

Unrecognized deferred tax assets are reassessed at each reporting date and recognized to the extent that it has become probable that future taxable profits will be available against which they can be used.

Deferred tax liabilities and assets are measured at the tax rates that are expected to apply in the period in which the liability is settled or the asset realized, based on tax rates that have been enacted or substantively enacted by the end of the reporting period.

Deferred tax assets and deferred tax liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to set off assets against liabilities representing current tax and where the deferred tax assets and the deferred tax liabilities relate to taxes on income levied by the same governing taxation laws.

(x) Borrowing Costs:

Borrowing costs attributable to the acquisition or construction of qualifying assets are considered as part of the cost of such assets. A qualifying asset is one that necessarily takes a substantial period of time to get ready for its intended use.

All other borrowing costs are recognized as expense in the period in which these are incurred.

(xi) Cash and Cash Equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents in the balance sheet comprise cash at banks and on hand, demand deposit and short-term deposits with an original maturity of three months or less, which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

(xii) Provisions and Contingent Liabilities:

The Company recognizes a provision when there is a present obligation (legal or constructive) as a result of

a past event and it is probable that an outflow of resources embodying economic benefits will be required to settle the obligation and a reliable estimate can be made of the amount of the obligation.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed when there is a possible obligation arising from past events the existence of which will be confirmed only by the occurrence or non-occurrence of one or more uncertain future events not wholly within the control of the Company or a present obligation that arises from past events where it is either not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount cannot be made.

(xiii) Earnings Per Share:

Basic earnings per share is calculated by dividing the profit / (loss) attributable to the equity shareholders by weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

For the purpose of calculating diluted earnings per share, the net profit / (loss) for the period attributable to equity shareholders and the weighted average number of shares outstanding during the period are adjusted for the effects of all dilutive potential equity shares.

(xiv) Investments:

Long-term investments are valued at cost less provision for impairment in value of such investments.

1(a) USE OF ESTIMATES AND JUDGEMENTS

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires management to make judgments, estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets, liabilities, income, expenses and disclosures of contingent liabilities at the reporting date. However, uncertainty about these assumptions and estimates could result in outcomes that require a material adjustment to the carrying amount of the asset or liability affected in future periods.

Estimates and underlying assumptions are reviewed at each reporting date. Any revision to accounting estimates and assumptions are recognised prospectively i.e. recognised in the period in which the estimate is revised and future periods affected.

Estimation of uncertainties relating to the global health pandemic from COIVD-19

The Company, as at the date approval of these financial statements has considered internal and external sources of information, in assessing the possible effects that may result from the global health pandemic relating to COVID-19 on the carrying amounts of loans, investments, receivables, inventories and other assets. As on the date of approval of these financial statements, the Company has concluded that the impact of COVID - 19 is not material based on these estimates and expects to recover the carrying amount of these assets. The impact of COVID-19 on the Company's Financial Statements may differ from that estimated as at the date of approval of these financial statements.

ii) Liquidity Risk

Liquidity risk is the risk that the Company will encounter difficulty in meeting the obligations associated with its financial liabilities that are settled by delivering cash or another financial asset. The Company's approach to managing liquidity is to ensure as far as possible that it will have sufficient liquidity to meet its liabilities when they are due, under both normal and stressed condition, without incurring unacceptable losses or risking damage to the Company's reputation.

The Management monitors rolling forecasts of the Company's liquidity position on the basis of expected cash flows. The Company's objective is to maintain a balance between continuity of funding and flexibility through the use of surplus funds and inter-corporate loans.

iii) Market Risk

In case where the letter is undelivered at the old address, RTA shall not insist for any proof of the old address provided the current address proof is in the form of an address proof issued by a Government Authority. The above procedure will be applicable for request for change in address of the holder also
