- In view of the continuing Covid-19 pandemic, the Ministry of Corporate Affairs ('MCA') vide its circular 14/2020, 17/2020, 20/2020 and 20/2021 dated 8 April 2020, 13 April 2020, 05 May, 2020 and 13 January 2021, December 8, 2021, December 14, 2021 and May 5, 2022 (collectively referred to as 'MCA Circulars') and Securities & Exchange Board of India (SEBI) vide its circular No. SEBI/HO/CFD/CMD1/CIR/P/2020/79 dated May 12, 2020 SEBI/HO/IMD/DF2/CIR/P/2021/10 dated January 15, 2021 and SEBI/HO/DDHS/P/CIR/2022/0063 dated May 13, 2022 permitted the holding of the Annual General Meeting ('AGM') through Video Conferencing/Other Audio Visual Means (VC/OAVM) facility, without the physical presence of the Members at a common venue. In compliance with the provisions of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act'), SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 ('SEBI Listing Regulations') and the relevant MCA & SEBI Circulars, the AGM of the Company this year as well is being conducted through VC/OAVM. The proceedings of the 11th AGM shall be deemed to be conducted at the Registered Office of the Company at 401/A, Pearl Arcade, Opp. P.K. Jewllers, Dawood Baug Lane, Off J. P. Road, Andheri (West), Mumbai- 400 058.
- 2. The AGM is being held pursuant to the MCA Circulars and SEBI Circulars through VC / OAVM, physical attendance of Members has been dispensed with. Accordingly, the facility for appointment of proxies by the Members will not be available for the AGM. Hence, the Proxy Form and Attendance Slip are not annexed to this Notice. However, in pursuance of Section 113 of the Companies Act, 2013 ('the Act'), authorized representative of the Corporate Member(s) may be appointed for the purpose of voting through remote e-Voting, for participation in the 11th AGM through VC / OAVM and e-Voting during the 11th AGM.
- 3. The presence of the Members attending the AGM through VC / OAVM will be counted for the purpose of reckoningthe quorum under Section 103 of the Act.

The Board of Directors, in accordance to the performance evaluation report and on the recommendation of Nomination and Remuneration Committee has re-appointed Mr. Narendra Gupta (DIN: 00418421) as an Independent Director for a second term of 5(five) years commencing from 20<sup>th</sup> August, 2022, subject to the approval of members in the ensuing Annual General Meeting of the Company.

The Board considers that his continued association would be immense beneficial to the Company and it is desirable to continue to avail services of Mr. Gupta as an Independent Director.

As per the provisions of Section 149 of the Companies Act, 2013 and the Rules made thereunder and pursuant to Regulation 25 of the SEBI (Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements) Regulations, 2015 the re-appointment of an Independent Director for the second term of 5 years may be done only by approval of the shareholders by means of special resolution. #### 2. STATE OF COMPANY'S AFFAIRS

The operating environment this year continued to remain volatile and challenging. India witnessed a devastating second wave of COVID-19 during the year with a significant humanitarian and economic impact. With the onset of second wave of COVID-19 towards the middle of March 2021, the business got impacted due to curtailed operating hours and lockdowns impacting other parts of the business. Your Directors regret to report that the company has continued to incurr losses amounting to Rs. 46,29,454/- after tax in the financial year under review as compared to loss after tax amounting to Rs.47,904,951/- during the previous financial year.

Due to ultimate losses in the previous and current years, your directors are striving to recover the losses and have been exploring the other prospective growth avenues so as to restore the Company's financial position.

#### 3. <u>DIVIDEND & RESERVES</u>

Your Directors do not recommend any dividend for the year ended 31st March, 2022 and no amount was transferred to Reserves.

#### 4. SHARE CAPITAL

The paid up Equity Share Capital as on 31st March, 2022 is Rs. 21,68,17,710/- (Rupees Twenty-One Crore Sixty- Eight Lakhs Seventeen Thousand Seven Hundred and Ten Only) divided into 2,16,81,771 (Two Crores Sixteen Lakhs Eighty-one Thousands Seven Hundred and Seventy-One) Equity Shares of the face value of Rs. 10/- each.

During the year under review, the Company has not issued any shares with or without differential voting rights. It has neither issued employee stock options nor Sweat Equity Shares and does not have any scheme to fund its employees to purchase the shares of the Company.

#### 5. <u>DIRECTORS AND KEY MANAGERIAL PERSONNEL (KMP)</u>

#### **Director retires by rotation:**



### ANNEXURE -I MANAGEMENT'S DISCUSSION AND ANALYSIS REPORT

#### > ECONOMIC OVERVIEW:

#### **GLOBAL ECONOMY**

The global economic recovery is continuing, even as the pandemic resurges. The fault lines opened up by COVID-19 are looking more persistent—near-term divergences are expected to leave lasting imprints on medium-term performance. Vaccine access and early policy support are the principal drivers of the gaps.

After rebounding to an estimated 5.5% in 2021, global growth is expected to decelerate markedly in 2022 - to 4.1 %, reflecting continued COVID-19 flare-ups, diminished fiscal support and lingering supply bottlenecks.

#### INDIAN ECONOMY

#### Impact of pandemic on economy:

- Economic impact of "second wave" was much smaller than that during the full lockdown phase in 2020-21, though health impact was more severe.
- Government of India's unique response comprised of safety-nets to cushion the impact on vulnerable sections of society and the business sector, significant increase in capital expenditure to spur growth and supply side reforms for a sustained long-term expansion.
- Government's flexible and multi-layered response is partly based on an "Agile" framework that uses feedback-loops, and the use of eighty High Frequency Indicators (HFIs) in an environment of extreme uncertainty.

The Indian economy has fully recovered to the pre-pandemic real GDP level of 2019-20, according to the provisional estimates of GDP released on May 31, 2022. Real GDP growth in FY 2021-22 stands at 8.7%, which is 1.5% higher than the real GDP in FY 2019-20. These figures are associated with stronger growth momentum, indicating increased economic demand. The investment rate in the fourth quarter increased to its highest level in the previous nine quarters. Moreover, capacity utilisation in the manufacturing sector rose in the fourth quarter, as against the third quarter, implying a build-up in demand, which is consistent with the growth objectives of the Indian economy.

Future capital spending of the government in the Indian economy is expected to be supported by factors such as tax buoyancy, streamlined tax system, thorough assessment and rationalisation of the tariff structure and digitisation of tax filing. In the medium term, an increase in capital spending on infrastructure and asset-building projects is set to increase growth multipliers. Furthermore, revival in monsoon and Kharif sowing helped the agriculture sector gain momentum. As of July 11, 2022, the South-West monsoon has covered the entire country, resulting in 7% higher rainfall than the normal level.

India has emerged as the fastest-growing major economy in the world, and is expected to be one of the top three economic powers globally over the next 10-15 years, backed by its robust democracy and strong partnerships.

#### > OVERVIEW

Agriculture is the primary source of livelihood for about 58% of India's population. Consumer spending in India will return to growth in 2021 post the pandemic-led contraction, expanding by as much as 6.6%. The Indian food industry is poised for huge growth, increasing its contribution to world food trade every year due to its immense potential for value addition, particularly within

the food processing industry. The Indian food processing industry accounts for 32% of the country's total food market, one of the largest industries in India and is ranked fifth in terms of production, consumption, export and expected growth.

We, Mukta Agriculture Limited, is engaged actively in the business of trading in agricultural goods, natural resources and deals in agro & allied products and has successfully completed Ten years in its trading business. Due to financial crisis your company is not in profits but we are in the process of diversifying and expanding its existing business activities into newer areas to attain profits during the years which shall be beneficial for the growth of the Company and its members.

#### > INDUSTRY STRUCTURE AND DEVELOPMENTS

- Agriculture has witnessed strong growth in the last two years, accounting for 18.8% of the country's Gross Value Added (GVA) in 2021-22, with growth of 3.6% in 2020-21 and 3.9% in 2021-22.
- Crop diversity is aided by the Minimum Support Price (MSP) policy.
- In the most recent Situation Assessment Survey (SAS), net earnings from crop output grew by 22.6% as compared to the 2014 SAS Report.
- Agriculture's allied areas, including as animal husbandry, dairying, and fisheries, are rapidly developing as high-growth sectors and important drivers of total growth in the agricultural sector.

Despite the challenges of COVID-19 and the consequent lockdown and restrictions, the agriculture sector continues to meet growing farming needs.

Opportunities would include meeting the high demand in the rural areas, which was highly unaffected by the pandemic. Agri business and farming are perhaps the only areas where lockdown was exempted. The labour, which has moved to the villages from the cities, are also creating additional labour force in the villages, leading to more land area under cultivation. The acceptance of digital methods of information delivery by farmers is creating new opportunities for promoting Aries products with limited visits by sales staff in lockdown conditions. Intensive training and development using virtual means of communication has also been carried out during the lockdown months and this knowledge increase is another emerging opportunity.

The external factors which could serve as possible threat to the business would include erratic spread of the rainfall and water availability in the reservoirs, fluctuations in oil and gas prices, foreign exchange rate fluctuations, shortages of key raw materials, pricing pressure, indirect and direct substitutes, etc.

#### > RISKS & CONCERNS

Risk and uncertainty are inherent to agriculture. These include climate and weather risks, natural catastrophes pest and diseases, which cause highly variable production outcomes. The most common sources of risk are weather, climate, diseases, natural disasters market and environmental shocks. The Company is committed to the identification, measurement and management of business risk by evaluating new Technologies & Controlling Productions.

#### > OUTLOOK

The agri-input sector is on a growth trajectory, owing to normal monsoon for two consecutive years. Despite concerns and challenges birthed by the pandemic (COVID-19), the government's support to farmers through higher procurement at Minimum Support Prices further helped in propelling demand for agri-inputs.

However, Your Company is expanding its business activity and putting continuous efforts to attain further efficiencies. Further, the Company is confident that in spite of the possible recessionary conditions in the industry it will perform better in view of the strong fundamentals of the company and hope to improve its performance as well.

#### > SEGMENT-WISE PERFORMANCE

The Company is operating on only one segment. Hence separate segmental reporting is not applicable. The Company has no activity outside India.

#### Report on the Audit of the Financial Statements

#### **Opinion**

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of M/S. # Note 1: Basis of accounting and preparation of Financial Statements

# a) Company Overview

Mukta Agriculture Limited ("the Company") is engaged primarily in the business of trading in Agriculture products and other related activities. The Company is a public limited Company incorporated and domiciled in India having its registered office at 401/A, Pearl Arcade, Opp. P. K. Jewellers, Dawood Baugh Lane, Off. J. P. Road, Andheri (West), Mumbai - 400 058. The Company is listed on BSE Limited (BSE).

### b) Basis of Accounting

The Financial Statements of the Company have been prepared in accordance with the Indian Accounting Standards (Ind AS) to comply with the Section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013 ("the 2013 Act"), and the relevant provisions, rules and amendments, as applicable. The Financial Statements have been prepared on accrual basis under the historical cost convention except certain assets measured at fair value.

# c) Functional and Presentation Currency

These financial statements are presented in Indian rupees, which is the functional currency of the Company. All financial information presented in Indian rupees has been rounded to the nearest rupees as per the requirement of Schedule III, unless otherwise stated.

## d) Use of Estimates and Judgements

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with Ind AS requires management to make estimates and assumptions considered in the reported amounts of assets and liabilities (including contingent liabilities) and the reported revenue and expenses during the year. The Management believes that the estimates used in preparation of the Financial Statements are prudent and reasonable. Significant estimates used by the management in the preparation of these financial statements include project revenue, project cost, saleable area, economic useful lives of fixed assets, accrual of allowance for bad and doubtful receivables, loans and advances and current and deferred taxes. Differences between the actual results and the estimates are recognised in the periods in which the results are known / materialise.

# e) Property, Plant and Equipment & Depreciation

#### i. Recognition and measurement

Items of property, plant and equipment are measured at cost less accumulated depreciation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of an item of property, plant and equipment comprises:

- its purchase price, including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes, after deducting trade discounts and rebates.
- any costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.

If significant parts of an item of property, plant and equipment have different useful lives, then they are accounted for as separate items (major components) of property, plant and equipment.

Property, plant and equipment are derecognised from financial statement, either on disposal or when no economic benefits are expected from its use or disposal. The gain or loss arising from disposal of property, plant and equipment are determined by comparing the proceeds from disposal with the carrying amount of Property, plant and equipment recognised in the statement of profit and loss account in the year of occurrence.

## ii. Subsequent expenditure

Subsequent costs are included in the asset's carrying amount or recognised as a separate asset, as appropriate, only when it is probable that future economic benefits associated with the item will flow to the Company and the cost of the item can be measured reliably. The carrying amount of any component accounted for as a separate asset is derecognised when replaced. All other repairs and maintenance are charged to profit or loss during the reporting year in which they are incurred.

## iii. Depreciation

Depreciation is being provided on written down value method on the basis of systematic allocation of the depreciable amount of the assets over its useful life as stated in Schedule II of the Companies Act, 2013.

Depreciation on assets sold, discarded or scrapped, is provided up to the date on which the said asset is sold, discarded or scrapped.

In respect of an asset for which impairment loss is recognized, depreciation is provided on the revised carrying amount of the assets.

### f) Intangible Assets - Recognition and measurement

Items of Intangible Assets are measured at cost less accumulated amortisation and impairment losses, if any. The cost of intangible assets comprises:

- its purchase price, including import duties and non-refundable purchase taxes, after deducting trade discounts and rebates; and
- any costs directly attributable to bringing the asset to the location and condition necessary for it to be capable of operating in the manner intended by management.
- Subsequent expenditure
   Subsequent expenditure is capitalised only if it is probable that the future economic benefits associated with the expenditure will flow to the Company.
- ii. Amortisation
   Intangible assets are amortised over their estimated useful life on Straight Line Method.

#### g) Impairment of Assets

Intangible assets that have an indefinite useful life are not subject to amortisation and are tested annually for impairment, or more frequently if events or changes in circumstances indicate that they might be impaired. Other assets are tested for impairment whenever events or changes in circumstances indicate that the carrying amount may not be recoverable. An impairment loss is recognised for the amount by which the asset's carrying amount exceeds its recoverable amount. The recoverable amount is the higher of an asset's fair value less costs of disposal and value in use. For the purposes of assessing impairment, assets are grouped at the lowest levels for which there are separately identifiable cash inflows which are largely independent of the cash inflows from other assets or groups of assets (cash-generating units). Non-financial assets that suffered an impairment are reviewed for possible reversal of the impairment at the end of each reporting period.

#### h) Investments

Long term investments are stated at cost. However, provision for diminution is made to recognise any decline, other than temporary, in the value of long term investments.

Current investments are stated at the fair value.

## i) Measurement at fair values

The Company measures financial instruments at fair value at each balance sheet date. Fair value is the price that would be received to sell an asset or paid to transfer a liability in an orderly transaction between market participants at the measurement date. The fair value measurement is based on the presumption that the transaction to sell the asset or transfer the liability takes place either:

- In the principal market for the asset or liability or

- In the absence of a principal market, in the most advantageous market for the asset or liability A fair value measurement of a non-financial asset takes into account a market participant's ability to generate economic benefits by using the asset in its highest and best use or by selling it to another market participant that would use the asset in its highest and best use.

The Company uses valuation techniques that are appropriate in the circumstances and for which sufficient data are available to measure fair value, maximizing the use of relevant observable inputs and minimizing the use of unobservable inputs.

All assets and liabilities for which fair value is measured or disclosed in the financial statements are categorized within the fair value hierarchy, described as follows, based on the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement as a whole:

Level 1: Quoted (unadjusted) market prices in active markets for identical assets or liabilities

Level 2: Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is directly or indirectly observable

Level 3: Valuation techniques for which the lowest level input that is significant to the fair value measurement is unobservable

For the purpose of fair value disclosures, the Company has determined classes of assets & liabilities on the basis of the nature, characteristics and the risks of the asset or liability and the level of the fair value hierarchy as explained above.

The Company recognises transfers between levels of the fair value hierarchy at the end of the reporting period during which the change has occurred.

## j) Financial Instrument

A financial instrument is any contract that gives rise to a financial asset of one entity and a financial liability or equity instrument of another entity.

Financial assets include Trade receivable, loan to body corporate, loan to employees, security deposits, Investments and other eligible current and non-current assets.

Financial liabilities include Loans, trade payable and eligible current and non-current liabilities.

Offsetting financial instruments - Financial assets and liabilities are offset and the net amount is reported in the balance sheet where there is a legally enforceable right to offset the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously. The legally enforceable right must not be contingent on future events and must be enforceable in the normal course of business and in the event of default, insolvency or bankruptcy of the group or the counterparty.

#### k) Inventories

- i. The cost of inventories comprises all cost of purchase, cost of conversion and other costs incurred in bringing the inventories to their present location and condition. Inventories are valued at cost or net realizable value, whichever is lower on the basis of first in first out method or specific identification, as the case may be.
- ii. Finished stock are valued at lower of cost or net realizable value on the basis of actual identified units.

Net realisable value is the estimated selling price in the ordinary course of business less the estimated costs of completion and the estimated costs necessary to make the sale.

# 1) Revenue Recognition

In respect of Sales

Sales are recognised when goods are supplied and significant risk and reward of the ownership in the goods are transferred to the buyer as per the terms of contract and no significant uncertainty exists regarding the amount of the consideration that will be derived from the sale of the goods. Sales are inclusive of duty and net of returns, trade discounts, rebates and GST.

#### In respect of interest income

Interest income is accounted on an accrual basis at interest rate method. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash receipts through the expected life of the financial asset to the gross carrying amount of a financial asset. When calculating the effective interest rate, the Company estimates the expected cash flows by considering all the contractual terms of the financial instrument (for example, prepayment, extension, call and similar options) but does not consider the expected credit losses.

## In respect of Dividend income

Dividend income including share of profit in LLP is recognized when the right to receive the payment is established, it is probable that the economic benefits associated with the dividend will flow to the Company, and the amount of the dividend can be measured reliably.

#### m) Taxation

The income tax expense or credit for the period is the tax payable on the current period's taxable income based on the applicable income tax rate for each jurisdiction adjusted by changes in deferred tax assets and liabilities attributable to temporary differences and to unused tax losses.

Current and deferred tax is recognised in profit or loss, except to the extent that it relates to items recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity. In this case, the tax is also recognised in other comprehensive income or directly in equity, respectively.

The current income tax charge is calculated on the basis of the tax laws enacted or substantively enacted at the end of the reporting period in the countries where the Company operate and generate taxable income. Management periodically evaluates positions taken in tax returns with respect to situations in which applicable tax regulation is subject to interpretation. It establishes provisions where appropriate on the basis of amounts expected to be paid to the tax authorities.

Deferred income tax is provided in full, using the liability method, on temporary differences arising between the tax bases of assets and liabilities and their carrying amounts in the financial statements. However, deferred tax liabilities are not recognised if they arise from the initial recognition of goodwill. Deferred income tax is also not accounted for if it arises from initial recognition of an asset or liability in a transaction other than a business combination that at the time of the transaction affects neither accounting profit nor taxable profit (tax loss). Deferred income tax is determined using tax rates (and laws) that have been enacted or substantially enacted by the end of the reporting period and are expected to apply when the related deferred income tax asset is realised, or the deferred income tax liability is settled.

Deferred tax assets are recognised for all deductible temporary differences and unused tax losses only if it is probable that future taxable amounts will be available to utilise those temporary differences and losses.

Deferred tax assets and liabilities are offset when there is a legally enforceable right to offset current tax assets and liabilities and when the deferred tax balances relate to the same taxation authority. Current tax assets and tax liabilities are offset where the entity has a legally enforceable right to offset and intends either to settle on a net basis, or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

# n) Employee Benefits

#### i. Short term employee benefits

Liabilities for wages and salaries, including non-monetary benefits that are expected to be settled wholly within 12 months after the end of the period in which the employees render the related service are recognised in respect of employees' services up to the end of the reporting period and are measured at the amounts expected to be paid when the liabilities are settled. The liabilities are presented as current employee benefit obligations in the balance sheet.

#### ii. Post-employment benefits

**Long-term employee benefits** The Company's net obligation in respect of long term employee benefit is the amount of future benefit that employees have earned in return of their service in the current and prior periods. The benefit is discounted to determine its present value. Re- measurement are recognized in Statement of Profit & Loss in the period in which they arise.

#### o) Cash and Cash equivalent

For the purpose of presentation in the statement of cash flows, cash and cash equivalents includes cash on hand, deposits held at call with financial institutions, other short-term, highly liquid investments with original maturities of three months or less that are readily convertible to known amounts of cash and which are subject to an insignificant risk of changes in value.

# p) Earnings per share

Basic earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax by the weighted average number of equity shares outstanding during the year.

Diluted earnings per share is computed by dividing the profit / (loss) after tax as adjusted for dividend, interest and other charges to expense or income (net of any attributable taxes) relating to the dilutive potential equity shares, by the weighted average number of equity shares considered for deriving basic earnings per share and the weighted average number of equity shares which could have been issued on conversion of all dilutive potential equity shares.

# q) Provisions and Contingent liabilities

A provision is recognised when the Company has a present obligation as a result of past events and it is probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation in respect of which a reliable estimate can be made. Provisions (excluding retirement benefits) are discounted to their present value and are determined based on the best estimate required to settle the obligation at the Balance Sheet date. These are reviewed at each Balance Sheet date and adjusted to reflect the current best estimates.

Contingent liabilities are disclosed in the Notes. Contingent liabilities are disclosed for

- i. possible obligations which will be confirmed only by future events not wholly within the control of the Company or
- ii. present obligations arising from past events where it is not probable that an outflow of resources will be required to settle the obligation or a reliable estimate of the amount of the obligation cannot be made.

Contingent assets are not recognised in the Financial Statements.

# r) Segment Reporting

The company is primarily in the business of trading in Agriculture Products and related activities. Further most of the business conducted is within the geographical boundaries of India.

In view of the above, in the opinion of the management and based on the organizational and internal reporting structure, the company's business activities as described above are subject to similar risks and returns. Further, since the business activities undertaken by the company are substantiating within India, in the opinion of the management, the business environment in India is considered to have similar risks and returns. Consequently, the company's business activities primarily represent a single business segment and the company's operations in India represent a single geographical segment.

#### s) Borrowings

Borrowings are initially recognised at fair value, net of transaction costs incurred. Borrowings are subsequently measured at amortised cost. Any difference between the proceeds (net of transaction costs) and the redemption amount is recognised in profit or loss over the period of the borrowings using the effective interest method. Fees paid on the establishment of loan facilities are recognised as transaction costs of the loan to the extent that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down. In this case, the fee is deferred until the draw down occurs. To the extent there is no evidence that it is probable that some or all of the facility will be drawn down, the fee is capitalised as a prepayment for liquidity services and amortised over the period of the facility to which it relates.

Borrowings are removed from the balance sheet when the obligation specified in the contract is discharged, cancelled or expired. The difference between the carrying amount of a financial liability that has been extinguished or transferred to another party and the consideration paid, including any non-cash assets transferred or liabilities assumed, is recognised in profit or loss as other gains/(losses).

Where the terms of a financial liability are renegotiated and the entity issues equity instruments to a creditor to extinguish all or part of the liability (debt for equity swap), a gain or loss is recognised in profit or loss, which is measured as the difference between the carrying amount of the financial liability and the fair value of the equity instruments issued.

Borrowings are classified as current liabilities unless the group has an unconditional right to defer settlement of the liability for at least 12 months after the reporting period. Where there is a breach

of a material provision of a long-term loan arrangement on or before the end of the reporting period with the effect that the liability becomes payable on demand on the reporting date, the entity does not classify the liability as current, if the lender agreed, after the reporting period and before the approval of the financial statements for issue, not to demand payment as a consequence of the breach.

### t) Trade and Other Payables

These amounts represent liabilities for goods and services provided to the Company prior to the end of financial year which are unpaid. The amounts are unsecured and are usually paid within 15 days of recognition. Trade and other payables are presented as current liabilities unless payment is not due within 12 months after the reporting period. They are recognised initially at their fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method.

## u) Trade Receivables

Trade receivables are recognised initially at fair value and subsequently measured at amortised cost using the effective interest method, less provision for impairment / doubtful debts.

#### v) Government Grants

Grants from the government are recognised at their fair value where there is a reasonable assurance that the grant will be received, and the Company will comply with all attached conditions.

Government grants relating to income are deferred and recognised in the profit or loss over the period necessary to match them with the costs that they are intended to compensate and presented within other income.

Government grants relating to the purchase of property, plant and equipment are included in noncurrent liabilities as deferred income and are credited to profit or loss on a straight-line basis over the expected lives of the related assets and presented within other income.

# w) Dividends

Provision is made for the amount of any dividend declared, being appropriately authorised and no longer at the discretion of the entity, on or before the end of the reporting period but not distributed at the end of the reporting period.

#### x) Business Combinations

Business combinations involving entities or businesses under common control shall be accounted for using the pooling of interest's method.

The consideration for the business combination may consist of securities, cash or other assets. Securities shall be recorded at nominal value. In determining the value of the consideration, assets other than cash shall be considered at their fair values.

The balance of the retained earnings appearing in the financial statements of the transferor is aggregated with the corresponding balance appearing in the financial statements of the transferee. Alternatively, it is transferred to General Reserve, if any.

The identity of the reserves shall be preserved and shall appear in the financial statements of the transferee in the same form in which they appeared in the financial statements of the transferor.
